
SPECIAL CLUB AWARD

Today's Racing

August Monday has become firmly established as the day when the British Motor Cycle Racing Club organises its Metropolitan Meeting at Crystal Palace for the London County Council. As one would expect, the fact that the A.C.U.'s International Meeting is also being held to-day has not prevented the country's premier motor-cycle racing club from arranging a full and interesting afternoon's sport.

On Easter Mondays at the "Palace", the 350 c.c. and 500 c.c. solo events are always organised in heats, with the highest placed drivers qualifying for the final. But, on August Mondays, "Bemsee" prefer to have separate graded races, in order that some of the lesser-known riders have a chance of winning some "gold" as a reward for their efforts. It's encouraging to note that a number of the competitors in the "fast" races of to-day's Junior and Senior events have graduated in a very short time from the "slower" categories: they include, for instance, Peter Preston, Ian Goddard, Dave Strickland, K. F. H. Inwood and Griffith Jenkins.

In fact, Jenkins won the Easter Monday 500 c.c. event here after a memorable chase by Joe Dunphy who got off to a bad start but steadily made up ground until. a couple of laps from the end, he seemed to have every chance of victory. But Griffith held on with great determination and crossed the line first—by a fifth of a second. Even though this meant that Joe had just failed to win every race for which he had entered, he had the satisfaction of breaking John Surtees's six-year old circuit lap record. Let's hope these two can put on a repeat performance today—if they do, there must be a good chance of one of them being the first man on two wheels to go round the 1.39 mile circuit at more than 80 m.p.h. In concentrating on these two, however, it would be most unwise to overlook last year's runner-up, Chris Williams (Norton), or the 3rd, 4th and 5th placemen on Easter Monday—Alan Hunter (Matchless), J. C. Simmonds (Matchless) and Geoff Young (Norton).

Every one of the first eight from Easter's 350 c.c. final are racing again today—Dunphy (Norton), Jenkins (A.J.S.), Hunter (A.J.S.), Walker (Norton), Longland (A.J.S.), Simmonds (A.J.S.), Goddard (A.J.S.), Chandler (A.J.S.)—and among others to note in the Senior and Junior events are Peter Preston (on Nortons) and Bob Macgregor, on Geoff Monty and Dudley Ward's Nortons.

In the 250 c.c. class, much depends on whether Terry Grotefeld and his Aermacchi can reproduce the form that recently gave them first place in the Isle of Man Southern "100". If they do, they should give Joe Dunphy, riding the Greeves that had its first victory here at Easter, and Griffith Jenkins—similarly mounted—a run for their prize money. With Alan Pavey's familiar N.S.U., Ken Watson's Aermacchi and Mike Cook's ex-factory Benelli also in the field, it should be quite a battle.

Everyone was delighted when, at the last meeting, G. C. A. Murphy, one of the "Palace's" most consistent supporters, put in an astonishing lap that raised the 125 c.c. circuit record by over 2 m.p.h. He rides the same Bultaco today and must have a good chance, as C. L. Jones's Tohatsu is unlikely to be as fast as Dave Simmonds's works machine that was first past the flag at Easter. Preston's recently acquired but already successful Honda, Minster's Bultaco and Hammond's ex-Hailwood Paton should also be well up with the leaders.

The 50 c.c. solo event is, perhaps, the most open of all the afternoon's thirteen races, but if one has to make a guess as to the winner, the best bet is probably the Honda twin-cam 4-stroke to be ridden by R. B. Minto.

Another feature of August Monday meetings is the race for Vintage solos and once again we can expect one of the oldest machines—Chris Williams's 625 c.c. Scott of 1926—to be first or thereabouts, with F. R. Cramp's 348 c.c. Velocette of 1929 not far away. Vintage enthusiasts will not need to look for the Scott's number—they can just listen for the characteristic sound that has been likened to someone ripping calico.

Last—but by no means the least interesting on a circuit like the "Palace"—the three-wheelers. This event will be run off in two heats and a final, and the winner should be Alan Thurgood (on Don Overall's Matchless), whose change from solos to sidecars met with quick success. But with the entry list including also such names as Mick Rowell (Norton), Pat Millard (Norton-Canterbury) and E. A. G. Vincent (Norton-Watsonian), spectators at Ramp Bend, South Tower Corner and North Tower Crescent should have plenty to thrill them.



PALACE PORTRAITS

3—Harold Daniell

Winner's smile-1949 Senior T.T.


Surely no one has had a longer or more varied connection with motor sport at the Crystal Palace than Harold Daniell. It began, in the late 1920s, before the road circuit was built. In those days, racing took place on some of the broad paths that ran through the grounds, and Harold also competed on the speedway track, the site of which is now occupied by the Stadium of the nearly completed National Recreation Centre. When the road circuit came into use, he took first place in the 1937 500 c.c. Coronation Trophy Race in front of such famous riders of the day as Stanley Woods and Jock West. Later, he was able to give much valuable advice before the first post-war motor-cycle meeting in 1953, and was one of the riders who carried out tests on the reformed circuit that is in use to-day. The same year, he was driving an Emeryson Formula III racing car, in which he won Le Petit Prix at the July meeting. For a number of seasons now, he has regularly been one of the senior officials at B.M.C.R.C. meetings here and to-day—as on each August Monday of recent years—he is one of the Stewards of the Meeting.

But, distinguished as Harold Daniell's record has been at Crystal Palace, it is his achievements in the Isle of Man that have earned him his honoured place in motor cycling history. Like many other successful T.T. riders, he began his "Island" career by competing in the Manx Grand Prix, winning the Senior class in 1933. His first appearance in the T.T. came the following June, when he took ninth place in the Senior. For the next few years, he had varying success on A.J.S. works machines and, later, on his privately entered Nortons. In 1938, he joined the Norton works team, and a record last lap of 91 m.p.h. (the first of under 25 minutes ever to be recorded) gave him a dramatic 15 second victory in the Senior over Stanley Woods and his Velocette.

When the first post-war T.T. was held in 1947, Harold had reached the age of 37, but his powers were far from fading and he gave Nortons the first of eight successive Senior victories. Another Senior "first" followed two years later and in his last year of racing—1950—he took third place in the Junior, at an average speed faster than anyone had won the race in previous years.

The close of Harold's racing career by no means brought with it the end of his connection with the sport. Now a motor-cycle dealer in Forest Hill, he still manages to devote a great deal of time to "Bemsee", not only at Crystal Palace, but at their events and activities up and down the country. Most appropriately, too, he is President (and a founder member) of the T.T. Riders' Association.

It was characteristic of Harold that he should have helped to found the Crystal Palace centre of the R.A.C.—A.C.U.'s scheme for training learner motor-cyclists, which is now the largest of its kind in the country.


