At the corresponding meeting a year ago, Paul Smart incredibly set up no less than six new lap and race records and judging from the recent form of some of today's competitors Paul's records could take a similar hammering today. The all important factor is of course the weather which has not always smiled on 'London's own' in the past.

Traditionally held on the Bank Holiday Monday this meeting has had to be put back a week because of a clash with an international athletics match at the National Sports Centre but it should revert to its usual niche in the calendar next year. Organised for the GLC by the British Motor Cycle Racing Club-who also organise the 'Hutchinson 100' meeting at Brands Hatch-it promises a feast of exciting and competitive racing. The inclusion of events graded senior and junior not only ensure thrilling battles among the established stars in the senior events but give the up and coming 'juniors' a chance to show their paces in the lower graded events. The fourteen race programme includes two production solo events and three sidecar events with the passengers displaying their usual death defying acrobatics. It all adds up though to great excitement for the spectators.

The team challenge race, first introduced last year, looks pretty well sewn up for first place at least. This is the final round of a three round series organised by the BMCRC for the Sponsors' Association and backed financially by Shell-Mex BP. Eight two-man teams face the starter's flag with team managers nominating one of their riders to start in the front rank.

Starters P. F. Corbett and M. Lane The race will be started with engines running instead of the usual push start.

The Triumph-BSA team with six points have a virtually unassailable lead after the first two rounds although it is possible for the second placed team Broadburns (22 points) to overhaul them if for some reason neither of the Triumphs finish. With Triumph fielding Paul Smart and Ray Pickrell the chances of that happening look slim. Broad-Burns riders, Barry Ditchburn (724 Weslake Triumph) and John Taylor (750 Norton), apart from keeping up the pressure on Smart and Pickrell will need to keep a wary eye on the lower-placed teams who have a chance of catching them. Kirby-Camp Racing (28 points) with Jim Harvey (496 Kirby Metisse) and Alan Dunscombe on one of the new 750 Vee-twin Ducatis are certainly within striking distance, as are the Boyer Racing Team (34 points) with Dave Nixon and Peter Butler-both local boys and regulars at the Palace—on board the Boyer Triumphs. The Monty-Thomas Racing Team (34 points) of Martyn Ashwood (740 Weslake Metisse) and Martin Carney (498 Kawasaki) are also in the hunt for the minor placings and Eddie Crooks Racing, Dresda Autos and Kuhn Shell make up the remainder of the teams competing. Dave Potter (750 Kuhn Norton) riding for the Kuhn Shell team looks a star of the future and should be worth watching. Dave recently crowned 'Lord of Lydden', is only 21 and managed to take his own machine into third place in the production race at the 'Hutch'. which was incidentally his first international race. What a start for this promising youngster now only in his second season.

usual clash of Triumphs and Nortons with Stanley Woods' and Dave Cox's 500 and 352 Suzukis providing the Japanese challenge. Paul Smart on the 750 Triumph and Peter Williams on the 750 Norton appear the main protagonists. Paul, a tough little ex-boat builder from Maidstone, who appears to hold most of the aces and most of the records for good measure, has been riding superbly recently. In the States at Daytona he showed the Americans that he was no slouch and at Brands at the 'Hutch' meeting took both legs of the senior championship race and the lap record into the bargain. He followed this up with the outright lap record at the 'international' at Silverstone on 22 August and is surely the one they all have to beat. Peter Williams (our portrait subject) looks his most dangerous rival. Peter has also struck form recently by taking the coverted Mellano Trophy as well as both legs of the production race at the 'Hutch' and notching his first Grand Prix win in the 'Ulster'. Martyn Ashwood (650 Triumph) and young Dave Potter on the 750 Norton Commando who likes the tight circuits could be the men to trouble the big two and local boys Peter Butler and Dave Nixon will not be far off.

In the 250 cc race the Japanese challenge is formidable. The Yamahas of Paul Smart, Rex Butcher and Clive Offer look to have it between them. Rex, a great Palace favourite who has been racing this circuit for longer than he can remember, would undoubtedly be a popular victor if he could snatch his first victory on 'London's Own' this afternoon.

The massive Japanese threat is continued in the 350 cc race when the 250 cc aces will be joined by Martin Carney on the Yamsel,

John Ringwood on the Yamaha and Barry Ditchburn on the Broad Yamaha. It will be interesting to see if the Yamsel—that superb combination of Yamaha engine power and Colin Seeley frame—can outpace the conventional Yamahas.

The 500 cc race sees Barry Ditchburn in action again on the Ted Broad prepared Yamaha. Barry who broke Paul Smart's 350 cc race record here on Easter Monday should be the front runner but could be hard pressed by Martyn Ashwood (500 Weslake), Alan Dunscombe (450 Ducati) and Martin Carney on the three cylinder 500 Kawasaki.

The 1000 cc race should however be the highlight of the afternoon and features a host of stars including Paul Smart, Ray Pickrell, Peter Williams, Alan Dunscombe, Barry Ditchburn and Martyn Ashwood. The man to watch here will be an in form Ray Pickrell having his second race of the afternoon.

The sidecar events provide the usual thrills and excitement with almost perfect co-ordination of machine, passenger and rider. Gerry Boret (1000 RGM), Eric Vant (750 Weslake Triumph), Mick Jones (750 Norton) and Mick Potter (750 BSA) look the pick of the entries and I will be surprised if the winner does not come from among them.

Once again BMCRC have delivered the 'goods' and have managed to get a first class line-up for this meeting which should make for an afternoon of close spectacular racing.



Palace Portrait

Peter Williams

Peter Williams is hoping to notch his first win at the Palace this afternoon-well earned compensation for a piece of bad luck in 1965 when a chequered flag error robbed him of his first win here. Now in his eighth season Peter has really come good in the last month. First his Mellano Trophy win in the 'Hutch' at Brands Hatch and then his first Grand Prix win at Dundrod. Satisfying though these two notable firsts were he still considers his second to Mike Hailwood in the 1967 Isle of Man TT the highlight of his career. Born you might say with racing in his blood—his father Jack was racing manager of AJS and competitions chief of AMC in the late '50s and early '60she wasn't exactly encouraged to take up the sport. Jack kept him out of the racing saddle until he was 24. Five years followed riding Tom Arter entered machines and after his TT second in '67 he had offers from most of the leading foreign manufacturers. A hoped for offer from Honda though never arrived and two years ago he joined Norton Villiers as development engineer. The formula 750 Norton which he rides today is very much his own creation 'a test-bed bike' which he says is now becoming very competitive. It could in fact help him improve on those two seconds to Charlie Sanby here last Easter Monday. His job keeps him from racing more often than he likes though he hopes to remedy this next year. A trip to the States for three or four races next year and a crack at a works 750 cc World Championship if the FIM should introduce it are his aims for the future. Married with two children he believes that success depends on a good racing set-up and speaking to him last week I'd willingly bet a last sparking plug that this flying development engineer will not be found wanting in this respect today.






Crystal Palace

At most race meetings Pass out tickets can be obtained at the Ramp Bend or Penge entrances for those wishing to take advantage of the following facilities in Crystal Palace Park.

Children's Zoo. There are many interesting birds and animals on display, some of which can be safely handled by children of all ages. The Zoo is open daily until the end of September, as follows: Monday to Friday (School term time) 1.30 pm—5.30 pm. School holidays, weekends and Bank Holidays 11 am to 6 pm. Pony and Trap and pony rides for children are available in a nearby enclosure.

A generous size Sand Pit for children to play in is also sited near to the Zoo and pony ride enclosure, with adjacent children's toilets.





The Play Park intended for children from 5 years up to school leaving age, is situated in the corner of the cricket field. Here children can freely take part in a variety of activities including climbing, playing on rope railways and balancing apparatus. A hut, especially useful in wet weather, provides facilities for painting, modelling, handicrafts and table tennis. Trained playleaders are in charge. The play park is open until the beginning of September.

The One O'clock club provides special facilities for the under fives. Mothers are quite free to play with their children or to rest but must remain in the area of the club while their children are there. Admission is free and any child under five may join in water and sand play, modelling, painting and drawing. A hut is available. The club is staffed by trained women play leaders and is open from 1 pm until 4.30 pm each weekday throughout the year.

Boating Rowing boats are available for hire at a charge of 25p per hour.

Fishing Pike, perch, roach and bream as well as some other coarse fish can be caught in the boating lake. Daily tickets cost 9p (5p for children under 16).

Catering A restaurant, situated between the lake and the Penge entrance, offers tea, coffee, minerals, light snacks and ice cream at reasonable prices.

And finally the Crystal Palace Monsters. These life-size models of prehistoric animals are sited on the island in the boating and fishing lake. They are well worth a visit before you leave.

The park is, of course, open every day for your enjoyment.






