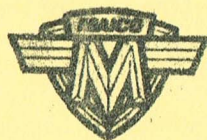

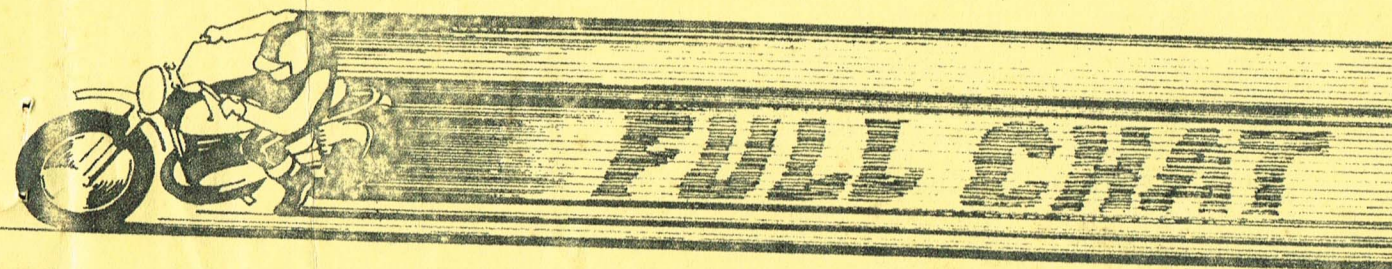

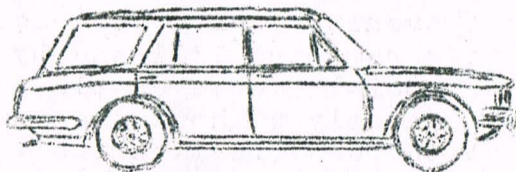

We thank you all and look forward to our next Social event.

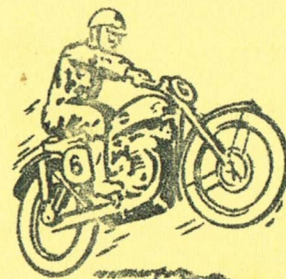
