Also if the red flag is put out you must stop, immediately, and by the time you read this the club will have a black flag. If you see this and your number is on the board you must stop. These flags are for your safety, so please take note of them as anyone breaking the rules will be disqualified and there will be no second chance.

Now I come to practice, this is being treated as a race. Practice is what it's name implies and is arranged again for your safety for you to find out about the conditions, the humps, bumps, hills etc. and to find out which you think is the best line to take, so please treat practice as a practice.

At the end of each meeting, we have to get litter fighters out. (The Wombles haven't reached Corsham yet). We should not have to do this, please take your litter home.

Other Schoolboy Scramble Clubs have a display team, and as we are one of the oldest clubs in the county, how about Corsham Display Team. If you are interested or have any ideas please let me know and we will get together and discuss it.
