One little point I would like to make, whilst on the subject of steep hills, and that is, that most of the trouble is caused by not changing down quick enough, some of you wait until you nearly stall your engine before you change gear, and then by the time you have changed gear your bike is at a standstill, what happens, phut! phut! and the engine conks.

Now if you would only change gear a little scener when you still have plenty of revs on you stand more chance of pulling away better, and keeping your front wheel on the ground. If you are not good at changing gear in a hill, knock her into bottom gear at the bottom of the hill and then you should have no trouble at all (No you lads, I did not say knock your Mum on the bottom, I said knock your bike into bottom 1st gear).

Anyway, I'm not criticizing I'm only giving advice for what it's worth, and if you are lucky enough to have anywhere to practice, not just ride round and round, but if there is a hill, practice on this up and down, changing gear, or anything you are not too good at. There goes that name again. One other point is and this includes 'A' and 'B' Groups. You should not ride your bike as fast as it will go, you should ride only as fast as you can handle it. As I have said 'A' Group should be O.K. on anything, but my congratulations to the 'B' Group and a special cheer for the 'C' Group for riding so well at Doncombe.

Colin who is 16, is in his last year of the C.S.S.C., which he joined in January, 1968, but his motor cycle career started long before that, on his first birthday in fact, when he rode on the tank of Dad's Goldie in the pits at Littleport, Cambs. All went well till Mum removed him, he then sat on the floor and screamed until he was red in the face. At five he acquired a Go-Cart and with this he was quite happy until his 9th birthday when a 25/- Moped appeared, Colin was away on 2 wheels. In January, 1968, mounted on a 125 cc Villiers costing 14/7d (10/- for bike plus 20 Embassy for the chap the found it) he joined the C.S.S.C. and after a further 2/6d for a S/H Knobbly the racing began.

Various bikes followed, another unit in the Villiers, then a Bantam was developed and this he rode until August 1971, but this time Dad didn't get away with shillings, it was a new 100 cc Rickman, which later, when club rules were altered, had a 125 cc motor fitted.

This season, Colin appeared with a new 125 cc CZ, and Dad's comments, "the most satisfactory machine so far." 15 seems that he will probably be CZ mounted when be joins the seniors in 1974.

Colin, who is a pupil at Chippenham school, doesn't only think of scrambling, last year he took O Levels in Maths and Geography and this year I hear he has had satisfactory results in a further eight subjects and now hopes to go on to take A Levels in Science and Maths and eventually a Science Degree. 
