Hello Folks,

Anyway my thanks to the Horsham lads and especially to Tony Bernard for making an unthankful job a little easier for me.

A word or two about forthcoming events. On Sat. 20th Oct. at Marshfield Church Hall, we will be having a film show. If any of you have any slides of our scrambles or films, please contact me and we will arrange a rota system if need be so that if there are several of you who have slides, all of you will get your chance. Any of you who have film or slides of the old Bantam days, could, I am sure, bring back memories to some of

us old hands as well as making interesting showing to some of our newer members. Also there is a whisper that we may get a black and white version of the T.V. film.

On the 28th Sept. we are running a sponsered scramble, I will try to explain what we want you to do. It will be run as an ordinary Championship meeting with the 'A' and 'B' Groups doing a maximum of 40 laps and the 'C' Group doing a maximum of 25 laps, this includes heats and finals for the 'A' Group. Now, all you lads, get as many people to sponsor you for perhaps ½p or lp per lap and then at the end of the scramble we will give you a card to tell you how many laps you have done. You can then show your sponsor and hope that they will pay up. We hope this will be a success and the money we raise from this will be given to the handicapped children, the children that would love to be able to do what you are doing, but are unable to do so. We are also hoping that the sponsors, if they wish, will be able to come along and watch you ride. More details of this later.

How relaxing to get back to our own Club meetings. Burton, one of my favourite courses, turned out to be as good a meeting as we have had all season. No squabbles, no disqualifications and a dry day, with just that nip in the air to let us know summer is over. A warning to all riders, the corner posts in future will not be so easy to knock out. I think I'm right in saying that the 'A' Group are the

biggest culprits in knocking these posts out, although I have seen 'B' Group as well trying to make the course shorter. But what I am trying to say is that when some of these older lads finish Schoolboy Scrambling and go into senior scrambling it won't be a 2" post driven in about 6", it will be a 6" post driven in about 2' with rope, not tape attached to them. Now you will have to avoid these or it will be fatal for you, so why not avoid 'em now, and get a bit of practice for the future.

The season is gradually closing with about 4 more championship races to go. In the 'A' Group anything could happen with 3 or 4 lads in the running. The 'B' Group, well Gary seems to have it sewn up, but anything could happen and there are always the runner-up spot and 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th places to be ridden for, and again in the 'C' Group, Robby seems to be well ahead, but remember anything can happen in these last races, and it's not the total points that count, but the best places minus 3 over the season that will count.

Well that's it folks, although I have been incompacitated (No, not what you think Fred) this last week, it's still been a rush to get this to press on time, and I would like to finish by saying it's nice to see the Parkers at our meetings even though our Jim cannot participate. I understand everything is going on well and I hope to see Jim back in the saddle in not too far a future.

One other thing, the venue is booked for the Xmas Party and presentation on Jan. 5th 1974. This will be the Community Centre at Warmley, Nr. Bristol. Route and details later.

Another little thing for you to chew over amongst yourselves. Who is the longest riding member in the Club? And who is the second longest riding member, not the oldest member but the member who has been riding the longest in Corsham Club? If you think you know, let me know and I will publish it in next month's mag. And don't give the game away, Number? and Number? One thing to bear in mind is, that the C.S.S.C. was started in the summer of 1965, so this may be a clue (or is it?) and another thing is Corsham will be celebrating 9 years of Schoolboy Scrambling next year. I would think this calls for some celebration. (Anything for a get together, I hope I shill be invited) and all our other retiring members. I'll keep the Barn ready.
