

Who will win to-day?

This Sunday the famous Dodington Park circuit, which has seen so many epic battles in Moto Cross in the past, will witness one of the greatest yet between the two supermen of the 500 cc class—Heikki Mikkola (Husqvarna) and Roger de Coster (Suzuki)—the two names who have monopolised the series so far.

Flying Finn Mikkola currently has an almost unassailable lead at the head of this year's World Championship points table. He celebrated his 29th birthday in England yesterday, and could receive the best present of his life here today with a win which would put him well on the way to his

first World title.

Married, with a five-year-old daughter, he lives in Belgium, the home of his nearest rival, and reigning 500 cc champion, de Coster. The Suzuki ace just retained his title last year in a very close run-off with German Willi Bauer (Maico). But having lost early points in the early 1974 Grand Prix through machine troubles, de Coster will have to pull everything out to put pressure on Mikkola.

And this could be the decider. Mikkola has often looked confident when out in front, but has come unstuck when under real pressure. And today, at the halfway stage in the series, de Coster will be trying everything

he knows to unsettle his rival.

Can anyone else get in between these two? On current form it seems unlikely. The Maico team of Germans Adolf Weil and Willi Bauer have been dogged with suspension troubles, and have not yet appeared as the threat that might have been predicted at the start of the season. But they are still within striking distance of the leaders, and will be fighting hard for a change in their fortunes.

Similarly, the Yamaha duo of Belgian Jaak van Velthoven and Swede Ake Jonsson have still to find the really top form they displayed last year. And if they are to take their chance for the big points, now is the moment to do it. Second Suzuki rider, Dutch dentist Gerrit Wolsink has taken time settling onto the Japanese machine after his switch from Maico at the beginning of the year, but once he's settled down, will be extremely quick

as today could show.

Swede Arne Kring is one of the real triers in the game, but his riding has often been too erratic to keep him in the results. He'll do well, but it looks likely that Husqvarna team-mate Brad Lackey could do even better. The American champion has been living in Belgium for the last year, and trying to acclimatise himself to the pace of European racing. Just lately he seems to have achieved that with considerable success, and I predict a great ride for the ever-cheerful 22-year-old.

Another young rider mixing with the older and more experienced European hands is 21-year-old Russian Victor Popenko, on the factory CZ with its pneumatic rear-suspension. The tight-lipped Soviet team has fielded its youngest-ever line-up in the 500 cc class this year, with the intention of training them in the toughest Moto Cross school there is—the Grand Prix. And Popenko, with an almost suicidal riding style, is a name we'll all hear

a lot more of in the future.

A big disappointment to British fans will be that Former World Champion Bengt Aberg is no longer on the Cheney BSA. But, on the factory 360 cc Bultaco, the 28-year-old Swede will be a serious threat today.

So the main interest for home enthusiasts will be how our own riders will match against the Continentals. After a sensational turn-out at the recent 250 cc Grand Prix at Portsmouth, everyone must be rooting for a line-up which features the toughest and most experienced Moto Cross men we have. And today we'll have a chance of seeing British machinery up there with the leaders too.

After dividing his loyalties early in the season on Ossa, John Banks has finally got to grips with the CCM in the five-hundred class. Twice runner-up in the World Championships on BSA, the "Baron" of Bury St. Edmunds has to be our big hope today. And teammate Norman Barrow will not disgrace himself either. The big man from Cumberland is one of the toughest and most determined riders we have.

Then there is the ever-popular Vic Eastwood (Maico). After gaining his first points in the series recently, the 33-year-old Trottiscliffe, Kent, veteran—and, incidently, the last Briton to win a British Grand Prix—could be spurred on to the results he so richly deserves.

Also carrying the Union Jack, 28-year-old Scot Vic Allan (Bultaco) will be out to revenge his disappointment at the 250 cc British Grand Prix, when a puncture slowed him as he was disputing the lead. On present form, the fastest man in Britain. Vic cannot gain points in the 500 cc class, as he is a 250 cc graded rider. But that won't prevent him having a go at the leaders.

Vic has said that if a Briton is going to win, he will do it at his own Grand Prix. And that's so true, because all our riders here today share a secret weapon that none of the Continentals have—that's us, the fans. We can lift them up, and push them out there in front if we make enough noise.

So hang on to this programme, use it to full effect, and we'll show them that British Moto Cross can take on the world!
