THE CIRCUIT

The rolling hills of the English Midlands and the town of Castle Donington play host to the Cinzano British Grand Prix at Donington Park. Built in 1931 to stage motorcycle events, but closed down during the Second World War, the derelict Donington circuit was bought in 1971 by local businessman and motor sport enthusiast Tom Wheatcroft. It was re-opened in 1977 after huge investment and is regarded as one of the best circuits in Britain. The undulating track is a real technical battle for riders, and it is set in a natural amphitheatre to allow excellent spectating. Its flowing layout is broken up by a slow section of tight corners meaning a combination of smooth racing and good corner speed must be combined with last-gasp braking and hard acceleration.











The 2003 MotoGP World Championships....Season so far

The 2003 MotoGP series has so far been a mixture of sound, surprises, sadness and exhilaration.

The all-four-stroke Championship (excluding the prief tenure of the Proton three cylinders) had cranked up the decibel limit of the world's premier motorcycle racing extravaganza so that the noise levels now match the high standard of action on the track.

Valentino Rossi has been proving his World Champion status with arguably the best machinery package in the factory Honda by recording three victories to-date. The taken may have accumulated 13 consecutive podiums, explaining his impressive lead in the standings, but he taken the revelation of the Championship, scoring two podiums and one win in their debut campaign in the hands of Loris Capirossi and Troy Bayliss. Rossi's sworn deadly max Blaggi has also been a model of consistency with five top three results, but Sete Gibernau, also on a Honda, has provided Rossi with most competition taking

three winners trophies, in South Africa, Assen, and Le Mans (after a fruly thrilling last lap duel with the reigning number one). The Spaniard's most successful ever career spell was born from tragedy after his Japanese team mate Dailiro Kato lost his life due to a horrific accident at Suzuka for the season opener. The loss of Kato knocked the sport for a six but the antics of Rossi, Gibernau and Capirossi, with his fearsomely fast blood-red Ducati, have set the Championship back on course.


Casting an eye over the field Rossi holds the upper-hand with the Honda and his phenomenal natural ability but at least this time he is capable of being beaten and that can only mean good news for facing fans.

The 250cc class has seen Manuel Poggiali notch three wins but also various other riders come of age on the quarter-litre machines. Toni Elias' success at his home GP of Jerez was nothing short of spellbinding while Randy de Puniet and Anthony West have also achieved first career victories. Some of the more experienced hands

have been frustrated by the new wave of speed in the 250s but riders like Fonsi Nieto, Roberto Rolfo and Sebastien Porto are still capable of Championship glory in a category where the points table only has 23 points separating the top seven participants.


The 125cc title chase is also tight. Lucio Cecchinello has stood on the top step several times, likewise general tavourite Dani Pedrosa, who currently leads the points table but it is the solid performances of Steve Jenkier - finally earning his first ever GP win at Assen two weeks ago — that makes him the Championship dark horse.

Watch for the new KTMs in action on Sunday as well as a host of new GP talent including Andrea Dovizioso, Casey Stoner, Thomas Luthi and Jorge Lorenzo who have all either appeared on the podium, grabbed pole position or surprised the establishment to announce their arrival.





Creation of the British Sp



The most successful 500cc British rider on home soil was Mike Hailwood who ruled the mountain course five times from 1963 to 1967. John Surtees is a close second with four wins in 1956, and 1958 to 1960.

The British Grand Prix was born from a meeting in London by the FICM (Federation Internationale des Clubs Motocycliste), the fore-runner to the current FIM organisation, in 1948. Prior to the suggested plan of a six-race annual series called a World Championship, large meetings and race events had been entitled 'Grand Prix'. The term would now be used to constitute a round of the new Championship.

The six GPs of the first organised World series took place in Britain, Switzerland, Holland (in Assen), Belgium, Northern Ireland and Italy. Most of the regular competitors were either British or Italian riding machinery from Norton, Gilera, AJS, and Moto Guzzi, so it is not surprising to see two GPs located in Great Britain and the curtain closer to the season taking place at the historic and legendary circuit of Monza in Italy.

The 1949 British GP was naturally held at one of the most prestigious venues of that time, the Isle of Man. From 59 starters, 35 riders finished the race contested over 7 laps of the Island with its then 37.7 mile 'track'. The first ever winner of the 500cc British GP (and the first ever World Championship round) was Harold Daniell who guided his Norton to victory by a minute and a half over another Brit, Johnny Lockett, also riding a Norton Les Graham, steering an AJS, was the first 500cc World Champion after taking two victories and a second place (as well as three fastest laps which earned him an extra Championship point each). At the TT Graham was leading on the last lap until a mechanical failure left him having to push his heavy machine over the finish line to claim tenth. Graham's success was the only title for AJS in the World Championship and the British GP on the Island would be a event that he would never conquer, taking a 2nd (1952) and a 4m (1950) before he lost his life on the same roads in 1953 Following the establishment of the series and of course the British P giving even further status to the TT week) motorcycle GP racing began to boom. The Championship was expanded to eight races only two years later and ten rounds in 1961. The increasing marest also gave status to new motorcycle superstars such as Seoff Duke, John Surtees and Mike Hailwood.


The Grand Prix series exploded into life throughout the following decades in terms of the vast technical developments (and remains so even to this day with perhaps just the high level of two stroke

technology slowing the rate of progress in the 1990s). Tyres, suspension, engine, aerodynamics, the whole motorcycle package has been revolutionised in the GP arena. Comparison of photographs from the 60s and 70s to present day can reveal the vast leap in technological skill and artistry that now goes into the machines that line up once a year for the biggest annual event in the British motorcycle racing calendar.

As the look and the substance of the British GP continues to move and shape-shift there is one area that remains painfully untouched. To find the last British rider to have won their home GP in the 500cc class one has to look back to 1975 when Mick Grant claimed the TT on his Kawasaki. Nobody has achieved the feat since the race moved to the mainland (a missed career accolade that the late Barry Sheene lamented even if he did get the closest by the length of a wheel in 1979) and Silverstone in 1977 before transferring to its current location Donington Park in 1987. The most successful 500cc British rider on home soil was Mike Hallwood who ruled the mountain course five times from 1963 to 1967. John Surtees is a close second with four wins in 1956, and 1958 to 1960.

Of all the riders who have won the race since the move to Silverstone and then Donington, Americans have claimed 13 victories, thanks to Pat Hennen (1977), Kenny Roberts (1978, 79 and 1983), Randy Mamola (1980, 1984), Freddie Spencer (1985), Eddie Lawson (1987), Wayne Rainey (1988) and Kevin Schwantz (1989, 90, 91 and 1994). Australia have five: Wayne Gardner (1986, 1992) and Mick Doohan (1995, 96, 97). Italy also: Franco Uncini (1982), Luca Cadalora (1993) and Valentino Rossi (2000, 01, 02). Holland (Jack Middelburg 1981), Spain (Alex Criville 1999) and New Zealand (Simon Crafar 1998) have all stood on top of the British podium just once.

From this list there are several interesting accomplishments. Wayne Rainey's one and only win on these shores in 1988 was his first ever 500cc victory and led onto three World titles. The same distinction stands for Valentino Rossi in terms of his first 500cc winners' trophy in 2000. Simon Crafar scored his only career GP win at Donington Park in 1998. Freddie Spencer won in 1985 and also secured the 250cc World Championship on the same day with a fourth position.




BRINGS THE BEST OUT OF YOUR BIKE

"Who to follow this weekend...??"





Jeremy McWilliams gave everybody good reason to cheer when he battled all the way with Valentino Rossi and in the 2000 500cc British GP and eventually finished third less than a second behind the charismatic Italian. Aside from this and one brief moment when Carl Fogarty led the world in 1993 the home fans have had little to shout about on the GP scene for many years now.

The young talent of this country are slowly coming through the ranks and while Jeremy heads into the twillight of his career we can quietly look to the progress of riders like Chaz Davies and Leon Camier. This Sunday the likelihood of a British win is as per usual pretty slim — thanks to McWilliam's new challenge with the shiny new Proton V5 — and with Davies having to contend with the swarms of factory bikes.

As the teenagers continue their development in the GP scene Davies offered a few words on his current plight. Honorary' Brit and factory 125cc Aprilia rider Casey Stoner is a good friend of Davies and is another starlet that could well be worthy of vocal encouragement, particularly since the young Aussie plied his trade in the National Champs here and is very soon intending to move off the continent and back to blighty.

Chaz Davies became the youngest rider ever to score points in the 250cc class with his 15th place at South Africa several months ago at the ripe age of 16 years and 76 days. He jumped up from a difficult (and politically

nightmare ish) 125cc debut campaign in 2002 and now forms part of the Aprilia Germany set-up.

0: One year on Chaz and you are in the 250s, has this rookie year been harder than your debut GP season in the 125s?

CD: Well, it's been easier to be honest with you, mainly because the bike is much more competitive than my old 125. The team are more co-operative, ambitious and have more experience. They really support my racing. I started off well and then struggled with the engine for the first part of the season but in the last few races it has really come good. The Aprilia is a hard bike to get right and my biggest problem has been the superposion; we've been chasing the right setting everywhere, and have yet to really find something that works. Ant West has been having the same trouble but he managed to sort it out in Suzuka and Catalunya. I definitely prefer riding the 250, there is obviously less comer speed than the 125 but my style is better suited to the bigger bike.

Q: What do you think about the Donington circuit?

CD: I really like it a lot and have only crashed there once! With the right bike I would easily be in the top ten and higher. Last year was very disappointing for me because the engine was dead slow on the 125 and it was a bad

weekend due to team politics and other riders getting better equipment than me. The harsh thing is that I was riding really well and should have been further up

than 16th.
This year will be a bit harder on the 250 because I am used to heading down Craner with the 125 fully pinned. I love the track from Redgate to Coppice. It's fast and really flows and is a great section to make up time. I am especially strong in McLeans because there are a lot of bumps there and I feel confident hitting it fast. Last year I had the 125 set up well, so I just flew through the corner. I would say to anybody who wants to watch me look out at Craner because I really am going for it in that spot.


Q: What realistic expectation can the fans have for you this weekend?

CD: I will be going for the top ten. Hopefully I will make i and that is my goal for the race.

CD: It is a bit early at this stage and I have no offers on the table yet but I would really like to stay in the 250 class and hopefully with the same team that I have now.

Everything is getting a lot easier race by race on tracks that I don't really know that well, imagine the speed I can make at Donington!

Casey Stoner started turning heads with some impressive speed in his debut season last year in the 250cc class, taking a best result of 5th in Brno. The 17 year old from Kurri-Kurri then stayed with Lucio Cecchinello's team for 2003 but moved to the 125cc Championship. He showed his potential from the 'off' by setting fastest times during the pre-season IRTA tests and led several GPs in the first half of the season, taking pole position at Mugello for the GP of Italy.

Q: It turns out that you've swapped classes with your mate Chaz Davies, what are your impressions so far of the 125s?

CS: Pretty good. I did not see it as a move down but rather sideways. I wanted to stay in the 250 class but the right bike wasn't available and Lucio (Cecchinello, boss and team-mate) gave me what I thought was a good opportunity. The 125s is a lot faster than what I remembered. The corner speeds we carry are quite scary and we are something like 70ks faster than the bigger bikes. For a while, and occasionally now and again, I ride the 125 like a 250 and it takes some getting used to in order to change styles. The 125s is definitely tougher in terms of competition. In the 250 class there is only 5 or 6 guys every week setting the pace while in the 125s there is somebody new at every

GP. It is very hard working out where the threat is coming from sometimes.

Q: What do you think about the Donington circuit?

CS. It is the track that I know best of all the GP circuits. This knowledge helps a lot and I'm pretty sure that I will be fast at from the first minute. I had a bit of a bad weekend with the 250 last year and took 10th overall when I was noping for much better. In my first GP, the 125cc race in 2001, I was second fastest in the wet and 8th quickest in practice, again the race was a bit of a disappointment because I had problems with the front end chattering and could only take 17th.

The track itself is fun to ride. A couple of the corners need re-surfacing. The best part is the chicane and the back end of the circuit. The first part is just flat-out on the 125 and is probably more of a rush on the bigger bike. I enjoy the stretch from McLeans to Coppice, and Fogartys Esses is a great place to watch some overtaking action.


Q: What realistic expectation can the fans have for you this weekend?


CS: It depends really. At Catalunya I was on for the podium until Dovizioso missed a gear and forced me to crash. Everything is getting a lot easier race by race on tracks that I don't really know that well, imagine the speed I can make at Donington! I am communicating a lot better with my suspension guy now and I am only going to get quicker

Q: The silly season more or less starts at this time of year, what do you think 2004 hold in store?

CS: I want to race a 250cc factory bike. Last year I had a lot of learning to do and had some communication problems with the team in terms of how I wanted the bike. Now I think my progression is on a sharp upward curve and I am getting better all the time.

In 2001 Valentino Rossi, conqueror of the 125, 250 and 500 World Championships in his second season in each class, became only the second rider in the history of motorcycling to lift all three titles. Son of Graziano, celebrated rider of the seventies, the charismatic Italian entered Grand Prix with Aprilia in 1996 and is now the darling of the Repsol Honda team with which Mick Doohan enjoyed such outstanding success. Rossi's natural skill and flair has already made him a huge fans' favourite and at just 23 years of age, he is set to become one of the sports true legends. Last year he dominated the first ever MotoGP four-stroke series aboard the RC211V, and will be hoping for a repeat performance against stiffer competition in 2003.








As a youngster, Max Biaggi always dreamed of playing football for AS Roma. However, in 1988 he fell in love with motorcycles when a friend invited him to ride at the local Vallelunga circuit and his natural talent blossomed as he graduated swiftly through the Italian Sport Production Series, the 125 Italian Championship and the European 250 Championship, which he won in 1991. A year later he marked his arrival in 250 Grand Prix with victory in South Africa and 5th place overall. Over the next six seasons Biaggi recorded 33 pole positions, 29 wins and was crowned World Champion 4 times. In 1998 he moved onto a 500 and finished 2nd behind Mick Doohan in his rookie year, a result he has yet to better in the top class. After four seasons with Yamaha, Biaggi returns to Honda for 2003 to challenge Valentino Rossi on the RC211V.











After 12 years in the top class of motorcycle racing, Alex Barros is easily the most experienced rider in MotoGP. Troy Bayliss continues his backpack around the arenas of the motorcycle racing world and at the age of 34 he has finally arrived at the very highest level as part of the new Ducati team. Rarely has a more successful apprenticeship been served before earning a chance at GP glory. Bayliss has raced and won in his native Australia (several top three finishes in the Superbike Championship), Britain (Superbike Champion in 1999), America (setting two pole positions in the AMA contest) and the World Superbike series (Champion in 2001 and runner-up in 2002). A Ducati stalwart since 1998 the friendly and unassuming Aussie makes his MotoGP debut in 2003 as team-mate to Loris Capirossi.

Grandson of the founding father of the Bultaco factory, Don 'Paco' Bulto, Sete Gibernau was born into motorcycles. After starting off in trial and motocross, the budding star was spotted by Wayne Rainey in the Ducados Open in 1996 and was drafted into the former World Champion's 250 Yamaha squad before moving into 500 the following year. In 1998 the Spaniard piloted a Honda NSR500 V2 before taking over the V4 vacated by Mick Doohan after three rounds of the 1999 season. Sete recorded 4 podiums that year but failed to live up to expectations in 2000 and was signed by Suzuki at the end of the season. Gibernau picked up his first ever victory on the RGV500 at Valencia that year but endured a frustrating year of development with the four-stroke GSV-R in 2002 and returned to Honda to partner Daijiro Kato for 2003.

25 3 ('98 - 250 '91, '90 - 125) Loris Capirossi was 125cc World Champion by the age of 17 and went on to win the title twice more before moving into 250 in '92. The Italian picked up 16 podiums, including 7 wins, and moved up to 500 with Honda in '95, when he was named Rookie Of The Year. Capirossi took his first 500 win on a Yamaha at Eastern Creek in '96 but dropped back to 250 with Aprilia the following year. He was crowned 250cc World Champion in '98 but failed to retain his title in '99 and was signed by Sito Pons to ride a Honda NSR500. Capirossi picked up 15 podiums and 1 race win in three seasons on the two-stroke, before switching to Ducati for 2003 to ride the promising four-stroke Desmosedici.






Jeremy McWilliams came into competitive riding at a relatively late age, beginning racing at 24 and making his Grand Prix debut at 29. After four tough years on a V4 Yamaha, McWilliams decided to try his luck on a Honda RS in 250, where his aggressive style enabled him to compete with the factory riders. In '99 he moved to Aprilia and a year later the Italian factory put him on the 500 V-twin, which he rode to pedium finishes in Italy and Great Britain. He returned to the 250 class the following season, when he became the first British rider to win a GP in two decades at the Dutch TT. McWilliams again fought against adversity with the lightweight Proton KR3 in 2002, the highlight being a sensational pole at Phillip Island, and he stays with Kenny Roberts' team in 2003 to ride their new V5 four-stroke.











Carl Fogarty's forays into GP racing?

A crash at McLeans while riding Pier Francesco Chili's garish multi coloured NSR in 1990 ended the hopes of a local win. The then 25 year old was filling in on a temporary basis for the injured Italian and scored an impressive 6th position the GP after in Sweden.

The rider from Blackburn was back again in 1992 and was running as high as 5th steering a privateer Yamaha until falling at Redgate corner on lap midway through the race. He slipped off on the same oil (dropped by John Kocinski) that claimed Kevin Schwantz and famously led to the latter grabbling the oil-flag and indulging in some

to the latter grabbing the oil-flag and indulging in some part-time marshalling.

Foggy fared much better in 1993 when riding the factory Cagiva in another wild-card appearance. This time he actually led the GP at a time when his popularity was creeping into over-drive thanks to World Superbike and his efforts on the factory Ducati. Finally he was deprived of a headline grabbing third position at Goddards on the last lap by Niall Mackenzie because the blood-red machine had run out of fuel out of fuel.

Mackenzie's charge through the field?
In 1989 Niall Mackenzie brought a packed Donington Park, sweating under a hot August sun, to their feet as he passed Eddie Lawson, Wayne Rainey and then KevinSchwantz at Redgate corner (all within three circulations) to lead the 500cc Grand Prix for a lap and a half. Riding the factory Mariboro Yamaha Mackenzie could then not sustain the pace thanks to knackered tyres and dropped back to fourth. For a brief spell the Scotsman gave the British fans one of the most inspired moments in British GP history.

Haslam's plucky fight back?

Haslam's plucky fight back?
In 1988 Ron Haslam enjoyed Honda backing with the futuristic Elf NSR project. The bike may have been a prototype but the engine was the real deal. The local man had already scored six top ten positions that season and finished the 1987 World Championship in fourth place, Going into the GP expectations were high for a decent result on home turf. Coming into the Esses on the first lap Haslam was punted into the gravel by a flying Kevin Schwantz. The marshals pushed the Brit back into action but he was dead last by some distance. Cue a massive cheer that accompanied the black-leathered rider around the track with every circulation as he spent the race working his way up to 14th. It wasn't the desired result but the performance and determination more than made up for it.

Waldmann's thrilling last lap
Tricky conditions with heavy rain prior to the 2000 250cc
GP meant that riders were scratching their chins trying to
work out whether full wet tyres would last the distance if
the downpour stopped or cut slicks would be worth the
gamble. The majority went for 'wets' including British riders
Jamie Robinson (who would set the fastest lap of the race)
and Jay Vincent. Both were running in the top five on
privateer machinery as the rain continued to fall in the
early stages. Disaster struck for the Brits as the skies
lightened and a dry line began to appear (Robinson
crashed and Vincent lost a podium result to take fifth).
Wonderful news for Raif Waldmann, who had defied the
wishes of his team and elected for a cut slick. The German
was teetering around the circuit in 21st position but could

then start to make ground with little time left in the race. The circuit rapidly dried and riding his Aprilla, Waldmann was gaining some 10-15 seconds a lap on leader Olivier Jacque and managed to make up 15 positions in only

Jacque and managed to make up 13 posteriors in 10 laps.
The finale couldn't have been more dramatic with Waldmann belting past Jacque exiting Goddards with barely 100 metres left to win the race.

Crashes:
Kevin Schwantz on two occasions (who only ever won or crashed at this circuit, recording victories in: 1989, 1990, 1991 and 1994 as well as DNFs in 1988, 1992 and 1993).
Firstly being taken out (again at the Esses) by Mick Doohan in 1993, who managed to lock-up his Honda and flip into Alex Barros who then tipped into the Suzuki at the end of the straight. Then secondly, experiencing a momentous off coming out of the Old Hairpin during practice in 1994 but ignoring the pain and winning the race the next day. Valentino Rossi, the huge flip that wrecked the NSR Honda at Craner in 2001, and Tohru Ukawa, who repeated the feat for Honda last year.

Jean Philippe Ruggia scrapping his elbows on the ground down Craner curves as he went on to win the 1993

Rossi's first ever 500cc win back in 2000 and Wayne Gardner's last ever 500cc victory and an emotional press conference announcing his retirement in 1992.





This weekend will see the 27th British Grand Prix and the 17th event to be held at Donington Park since the World Championships shifted from Silverstone after the 1986 race. Up until 1977 the British GP was held on the Isle of Man but as the series modernised and the speeds on the bikes became higher more and more riders were reluctant to traverse the tricky mountain course and the venue was changed. Donington has not been a lucky place for home talent and strangely the last win by a British rider on home turf was by lan McConnachie (80cc) at the final race hosted by Silverstone in 1986. Since then people such as Carl Fogarty, Niall MacKenzie and Jeremy McWilliams have led a GP race at the East Midlands circuit but nobody has actually won. The only Brit to have achieved a decent measure of success was multi sidecar World Champion Steve Webster, who triumphed in 1987, '88, '89 and 1992.

Since the Grand Prix moved to Donington only 2 British nders have stood on the podium in all classes.
The record reads:

Niall MacKenzie 1993 (500cc) Jeremy McWilliams 2000 (500cc)

The most successful British GP for home riders was in 1993. There was five Brits in the top 14 including Niall Mackenzie (3rd) Carl Fogarty (4th), John Reynolds (9th), James Haydon (11th) and Ron Haslam (14th).


Neil Hodgson is hopefully on his way to the World Superbike title (he will be only the second Briton to take the crown) and is arguably Britain's top motorcycle racer at this moment in time. Seeing the 29 year old in MotoGP next year is not beyond the realms of possibility especially with the Ducati team wanting to widen their line-up in the premier class. If Hodgson does return then it will be 8 years since he last competed in MotoGP. His first race of note was back in 1993 when he took tenth place in the 125cc GP. His highest ever finish was at Donington in 1995 with seventh position his final 500cc race was the same year at the Circuit de Catalunya when he scored a

9th position on a privateer Roc Yamaha.

Carlos Checa's crash while leading last year continues a bleak trend for Yamaha. The firm have not won at the circuit since Simon Crafar comprehensively beat Mick Doohan in 1998.

Valentino Rossi is the only rider to have done the "quartet" at Donington. He won the 125cc GP in 1997, the 250cc race in 1999, the 500cc event in 2000 and a MotoGP trophy in 2001 and 2002. If he is victorious again this weekend then he will have taken four GPs in a row.





completed his 100th GP and with his seventh success of that season racked-up his 46th career victory marking a phenomenal ratio of results (including 20 wins from 40 premier class appearances).

Of course the dapper and friendly Italian, who fittingly stuck a '%' sign next to his customary no.46 on the victory lap, went on to add another four winners' trophies to his collection that year as well as another world title; becoming the first ever MotoGP World Champion. Donington was an important race for the factory Honda man, considering his inheritance of London town as his home city, because it also stretched his advantage in the Championship standings to 87 points over team-mate Tohru Ukawa.

The race was a tight affair until leader Carlos Checa slid out of the proceedings at Goddards on lap 17 leaving the 23 year old an empty track and a fairly simple third British GP win in a row.

Rossi's rival Max Biaggi had a lonely time unable to chase

GP win in a row. Rossi's rival Max Biaggi had a lonely time unable to chase down the Honda but keeping a reasonably comfortable distance over Alex Barros. The top three did not change position once during the 30 laps but it was more about a race of concentration because one slip could have altered proceedings dramatically.

Some 17 seconds behind the Brazilian (then riding the


World Champion to-be Marco Melandri had just a little bit more pace with his Aprilia than Fonsi Nieto and passed the chequered flag first by a little less than a second. Nieto's team-mate Toni Elias and Italian rider Franco Battaini completed the Aprilia top four with Roberto Rolfo the first Honda rider home in fifth. The top five were covered by less than 4.5 seconds with Jay Vincent scoring the best British result in all classes on the day with 16th position. As for Melandri, who entered the Bristish GP leading the 250cc Championship for the first time in his career, he scored his fourth race win in a row and would later go on to become one of the youngest riders to lift the 250cc crown.

In a day for future World Champions showing their mettle on the Donington curves, Arnaud Vincent won a typically tight 125cc GP from Dani Pedrosa and Manuel Poggiali. The Frenchman went onto claim the title last year and will do very well to repeat his British success this season riding the Tenchman new KTM. Chaz Davies, who has now departed for the 250cc category (likewise Poggiali), matched Jay Vincent's efforts by recording a 16th

Technically speaking Donington was a circuit born with a reputation for being challenging on both rider and machine, a reputation that only gained further strength with the 1987 extension - carried out to allow Donington to form part of the GP calendar. It's this 'modern' extension that has added to the complexity of the circuit layout, which can be separated into two contrasting components. The first, from the start finish line to the right-hander called Coppice Corner, is a flowing sequence of medium to high-speed corners that drop down Craner Curves into the Old Hairpin before climbing back out on the approach to Coppice. In an extreme contrast the circuit is completed with a sequence of stop-and-go switchbacks and hairpins between Fogarty Esses and Goddard Corner.

This one feature alone makes dialing in a motorcycle chassis difficult, as a fast lap will come down to a compromise in all-round set-up. Add to that the lack of grip, which some say is due to the jet fuel residue left by the nearby East Midlands airport, and the best result will be achieved by the rider who can ride around any chassis compromises.

The main aim is to find a chassis that offers a good pitching balance during braking and acceleration. Too much and you lose stability under brakes in the second half of the lap; not enough and the bike will be difficult to turn brough the faster sweeping opening sequence of turns. The catch is that the first half of the circuit lends itself to a fast laptime, while a good setup for the second half - the stop-and-go addition - is where many riders with the right set-up can make an easy pass.

What also needs to be taken into consideration is that the undulating layout of the first part of the circuit pushes the front of the bike a great deal, while the second half is pretty much 'highside' territory. For this reason softer spring rates front and rear will be chosen to balance the bike's geometry, with the fine-tuning left to the spring preload. It will improve drive and front-end feedback, although it will come at the expense of a little braking stability in the hairpins.

As for the YZR-M1's in-line four-cylinder engine, it will be tuned to offer a strong midrange and a progressive and credictable delivery. Top speeds are not a crucial factor to a fast time at this circuit. Instead, the confidence to use that power on a slippery surface infested with changing cambers is the key.
