












#### CATERING FACILITIES

Coppice Cafeteria, is situated within the museum complex adjacent to the main entrance car park, offers

full catering facilities (including restaurant) from 10 am.

Donington's own public house, the Redgate Lodge, is situated on the outside of Redgate Corner and access is by means of a paddock transfer. Buffer meals are available here.

Another bar facility is situated at Starkey's Bridge, adjacent to the popular 'Old Hairpin' spectator area.

This also offers snack food. The tobacconist klosks situated in the paddock, The Old Hairpin and at Coppice Corner sell programmes, newspapers and magazines, in addition to confectionery.

### PADDOCK TRANSFER

Spectators wishing to take a close view of the competitors in today's meeting can do so by purchasing a paddock transfer ticket, price £1.00, from the two entrances to the paddock area: Next to Redgate Lodge or the main competitors vehicle entrance to the paddock.

Speciators purchasing a paddock transfer also gain access to the inside speciator enclosure at Park hicane, and to the infield area opposite the start line.

Holders of paddock transfers also gain access to the Redgate Lodge public house. Other catering

facilities and shops, selling a variety of items, are also situated in the paddock area.

### **GRANDSTAND TRANSFER**

Open Grandstand seating is available at Redgate, McLeans and Coppice Corners; charge is £1.00.

### DONINGTON CHAMPIONSHIP

Organised by The Pathfinders & Derby Motor Club Ltd, there is a season long series covering all promoted motor cycle meetings at Donington in 1979. The championship is decided in all the final results of every race (not heats or legs of a race) for solo and sidecar machines at national and international meetings held in 1979 at Donington.

The points are awarded on a 16-11-7-4-2-1 basis to the first six finishers. Ties will be decided by (a) the greatest number of first, second, etc. places; (b) the greatest number of points won at any one

The Champion will receive after the final meeting, £500. The runner-up wins £300 and the third place driver £200. The highest placed sidecar driver will receive an additional award of £250. In 1978 the championship was won by Kork Ballington with 64 points. Barry Sheene and Dave Potter tied on 59 points, but Sheene was awarded the second place with three wins to Potter's two. The best sidecar placing went to Mick Boddice with 40 points.

## Time for a change by Chris Carter, Motor Cycle Weekly

People have been knocking the British Championships for a long time now, and it is true that compared with some countries like Holland and Italy for example the British series is

not everything it might be. Whichever man clinches this season's exciting tussle, can he honestly call himself the best rider in the country when the championship lacks names like Barry Sheene, Dave Potter and Mick Grant?

It's debatable! But with an overcrowded calendar, and the lack of commercial sponsorship it is difficult to see a way in which the best solo riders can be brought together over the season to find "the true champ.

In Holland and Italy the countries' federations have taken a tough line with their home riders. When there is a championship round staged then competitors have a simple choice. They can ride in the event, or take a holiday. They are not allowed to ride anywhere else.

In Britain the ACU do not operate that scheme, because it would be difficult, if not impossible, to enforce. The British moto cross championship, which of course has a twelve month season to go out, as opposed to the eight month road racing calendar on the other hand does use a similar scheme.

Apart from the right to use the number one plate at British meetings the British solo title does very little else to boost the career of the winner

In the past few seasons men like Roger Marshall and Steve Manship have each won the title, but discovered to their dismay that the crown does not open the door to a queue of commercial sponsors, generous start money offers, or even easier starts in Grands Prix and international events.

So why have Bob Smith, Keith Heuwen, Graham Wood and Ron Haslam elected to

charge about Britain in pursuit of the title? Well because they like racing, for one thing. Run a meeting every day of the week, and riders like those above, and hundreds more who make up the backbone of a sport, would be in action.

But also because a title, any title, is a target to aim for. It's a yardstick to judge ability and progress, and it's another step up the ladder to stardom.

Would the racing be any better if Sheene and Co did take part? Of course it would, some might say. But there are others, and I would find it difficult to argue with them, that it is the fact the factory runners are missing that is the boost the championship contenders need to make them go that little bit better.

There are probably ten riders at every round of this year's championship who feel that they have the ability and machinery to win, and to be brutally frank there have been a number of alleged international meetings this season in Britain where the result has been much more of a foregone conclusion.

The British championship as we know, is undoubtedly a good competition. Perhaps the answer is to call it something else?

Certainly the ACU have not been afraid to experiment and change in a bid to find the right system.

In the sixties the ACU Star for the 125, 250, 350 and 500 cc solo classes, plus a three wheeler race had the best in Britain taking part. In 1961, for example Mike Hailwood won the 500 cc class on his Norton from Derek Minter and Phil Read, while Speedy Ready grabbed revenge by winning the 350 cc series from Mike the Bike.

But there was also a single British Championship meeting at Oulton Park on August Bank Holiday Monday! In effect we had two champions for each class.

In 1979 we have the British Solo Cham-

pionship, and the MCN Duckhams Superbike Championship! That is progress, of a kind. At least we only have one class to be confused about.

Now the sidecars have the job sorted out, and I have no hesitation in congratulating

the newspaper who employs me, Motor Cycle Weekly for that.

Soon after I joined the paper the oppor-tunity came up for both the 750 cc solo class, and the Sidecar class championships to run with the MCN Superbike series, and the MCW Sidecar championship respec-

It is a pity that the solo class, for reasons I could never satisfactorily understand, did not merge with the Superbike competition. With the right sort of backing in terms of

dates and finance the British cham-pionships, for both solo and sidecar classes could be beneficial to many sides of the

With attractive rewards, and a sensible scoring system at international events the best riders would take part. And once everyone was involved the final championship table could be used as a basis for start money payments in the following season for example.

The British champion could be

guaranteed a minimum of say £1,000, runner up £800 and so on. Riders would know that if they could produce the goods in the championship rounds then their value would be established.

The championship table could be used to establish the ACU's grading list for GPs and international events, and taking that a stage further I would like to see only the top twenty, or so, in the championship granted international licences for the following

The old stagers who might struggle to qualify this way, might scream a little, but on a six round championship, with the best five scores to count, any rider worthy of a licence to let him represent Britain abroad would qualify.

Young British riders find it tough at present to break into the European scene. If they finished high enough up the British championship then foreign organisers could see for themselves just how good they were.

### The British Championships

Traditionally, the British Road Race Championship throws up a winner who is both consistent and very talented and this year looks like being no exception.


Here at Donington Park today we are two thirds of the way through the current campaign and with any one of the top four men all in with a chance of winning the championship the racing should be fast and furious — as it has been all through this championship season.

The man in front is St. Helen's star Bob

championship season.

The man in front is St. Helen's star Bob Smith on the Marmac sponsored 750 cc Yamaha. He has a 17 point advantage as riders line up for the grid today, and has been the most consistent of points scorers in

Consistency seems to be the key to winning the championship, as riders in the past have found. There have been several who thought that to contest selected rounds and hope for good scores would pay off ... but they have always fallen foul of mechanical problems or other troubles.

Winner last year was Leicester rider Steve Manship, whose consistency at all the rounds paid dividends, and before that the victor for the previous two years had been Yorkshire star Roger Marshall, now one of the country's top international stars and a man who is feared in any company.

So Smith has some distinguished names to follow and certainly at the British Grand Prix at Silverstone a few weeks ago he was in a determined mood when it came to discussing his British title aspirations.

cussing his British title aspirations.
"I am very glad that I have got a seventeen point buffer between myself and the rest of the field, but I know perfectly well that it is not enough. There are some very good riders behind me and I know that I have got to really go out there at Donington and turn in a good result. "If I don't then I know that I have only myself to blome."

Bob began in the year riding his own machines, before Marmac stepped in to help. They have helped to ease money problems and leave him more time to concentrate on the riding, to such good effect that a couple of months ago he was asked to

ride one of the Paul Dunstall prepared Suzuki Formula One Machines in the prestigious Forward Trust/Motor Cycle Weekly Championship.

Chasing Bob hard and obviously hoping for a win today is Keith Huewen — the man who had such a brilliant season on the club and national scene last year that he won the much coveted Grovewood Award.

Towards the end of last season Keith, who had previously been providing and tuning all his own machinery teamed up with Len Manchester Motorcycles and their very enthusiastic boss, Arnie Fletcher.

Given the chance of riding Arnie's very fast 750 cc Yamaha, Keith may provide a shock or two for the established aces, and he has been repeating the treatment all this year. A measure of how good he is can be gained from the fact that he rode for the British team in this year's Anglo-American Match Race Series, when he was far from disgraced, and he also did well in the 500 cc British GP at Silverstone, on a special 500 Yamaha which he said was not performing properly.

Keith has yet to score a win in a British Championship round, but in his 50 points tally he has recorded two second places at Thruxton and Cadwell Park and rates the British title as his main priority this season.

"That is the one we have set out to win

"That is the one we have set out to win and I feel that we have a very good chance of pulling it off. I feel that I have not been riding so well in the middle of the season as I was at the start, but at Donington I will really be looking for my opening win and I hope it will be victories from then on."

Keith has failed to score in only one round, and that was at Croft in May. He was well placed in the race, just behind the leaders, when he banged his knee against the barriers at the tricky chicane. In agony he had to retire, and the injury has taken a long while from which to recover. Only now is he approaching his best.

A man who has made the most of Keith's bad luck at that Croft meeting was Scunthorpe's Graham Wood, who went on to win the race and also start a run of good performances that have taken him to within two points of Keith's tally.

Graham is sponsored by Fowler's of Bristol who also sponsor sidecar team Jock Taylor and Bengt Goran Johansson. Fowler's race manager Dennis Trollope reckons he has the best sidecar team and also the best line up, and with Graham recording wins in two of the last three rounds, there would be few to argue with him.

Certainly 'Woody' is one of the quietest and most determined men in the paddock, and one of the hardest riders on the track. He is also a good performer here at Donington Park — do you remember his memorable race last year when, riding the Sparton machine, he was only just pipped on the run to the chequered flag by Langley Will rider Poor Hestem?

Mill rider Ron Haslam?

Haslam is the man all the top three have to fear. At the moment he has 42 points and was the early championship leader when he bagged two wins in the opening rounds at Mallory Park and Cadwell.

He has missed two rounds, at Scarborough and the second round at Cadwell, and finished third at Croft when he had to

give up chasing Graham Wood when his Mal Carter sponsored Yamaha developed oil seal bothers.

He has been in brilliant form all year of course, and if he is on good form at Donington today following his crash at Silverstone on the 250 cc Cotton then there will he little to stop him.

Behind Ron comes Leeds rider Steve Ward, 350 cc Junior Manx Grand Prix winner last year. Steve has been campaigning a 500 cc RG Suzuki this year in the championship rounds and obviously with a 250 cc disadvantage over most of the other machines taking part he has had to rely on his considerable riding talents and reliability.

He has had both, scoring in four of the rounds, and must not be discounted from a good position here at Donington.

As well as the British Championship

As well as the British Championship Race, there will be rounds of the ACU 250 cc and 125 cc Star Championship held today. In their own way they have provided just as close racing as the British Championship.

Man in form in the 250 cc class is Huddersfield's Phil Mellor. Like Ward, Phil is a Manx Grand Prix winner from last year when he ran away with the 250 cc class in the newcomer's event. Phil rides for Bill Rae motorcycles, and though he is without a win so far he has scored in all but one of the rounds.

He has not confined his good performances to the ACU Star Rounds either. In the prestigious international events at the start of the season he was one of the most consistent and well placed riders in often star-studded fields and is keyed up for today. "I just want a win," he said recently. "Then the pressure will be off me a little."

Phil has 46 points so far, a 16 point lead over second placed man John Webb. John is another rider without a win, but as has showed several times this year it is not for want of trying. He scored a second place at the second round at Cadwell Park, being pipped over the line by Chris Guy, who along with Ron Haslam is the other man in the Mal Carter Pharaoh Yamaha line up.

'His other best place has come with third position in the fifth round at Scarborough, and if he is to continue his challenge he will need a good place today.

John has a solitary point lead over third placed man, and reigning 250 cc star champion Derek Hukley. Derek opened his bid to retain the title with a superb win at Mallory Park, but since then things have turned a little sour for the Bill Smith sponsored runner.

He has been trying desperately to solve handling problems with his Yamaha machinery for most of the season but has still managed to turn in some good results, particularly in the North West 200. Derek is unhappy about his performances so far this year and will be wanting to win today to keep his hopes alive. On his day he is certainly more than a match for the rest of the field.

Following him comes Don McLeod, the Yorkshire rider who is often under-rated. But Don has shown his form this year with several good places, particularly in the North and must be worth watching today.

In the 125 cc ACU star championship the leader has much less an advantage — with

Morbidelli mounted Tony Smith having an eleven point lead over Jack Machin.

The year has been up and down for Tony. He started off in superb form at Mallory Park with an easy win, then had a retirement at Cadwell Park. That was followed by another win in the last round at Cadwell Park.

So today he will be looking to add a little more consistency to his performances, and hopefully record another win.

hopefully record another win.

With Smith's retirement problems the field seemed open for Machin. But he too has had his bothers with his only win being in the second round at Cadwell Park in March. Close behind Jack comes John Kernan, on another Morbidelli. He has 30 points and his performances have tailed off after two second places in the opening rounds.

Then comes Phil Mellor, first of the Honda mounted men with 30 points closely pursued by Yorkshire rider Bill Clark, another Honda rider, on 25.
