DONINGTON DIVERSIONS . . . by Val Ward

Welcome to the second big BP-sponsored Donington vintage day. See if you can spot pre-war Donington ace "Ginger" Wood, today's chief guest, among the crowds in the paddock. He won undying fame for his fearless handling of the very first racing Vincent Thousand here forty years ago.

"Ginger", who has written the programme Introduction, also features on the cover. He held the unlimited class record for Donington on the big Vincent twin, the 250 cc class record and won the Donington 100-mile Grand Prix.

Also here today is another flat-out expert of the old school – Jimmy Simpson, first rider to lap the TT Mountain course at $60,\,70$ and 80 mph.

Ten-times TT winner Stanley Woods, still deceptively quick, has come from Ireland to ride a unique 500 works Velocette in the Celebrities Parade. Look out also for aces of another era – John Cooper, Ron Langston, Bill Lomas and sidecar stylist Peter "Pip" Harris.

At the start of the proceedings, there will be a cavalcade (which Ivan Rhodes has organised) of timeless racing motor cycles, among them Nortons, Velocettes, AJSs, Broughs and Scotts. All fought for supremacy at Donington between 1931 and 1939.

Who says vintage racing is for men only? Among competitors today we hope to see Mrs. Celia Walton, Mrs. Rosemary Wilkinson, Mrs. Christine Gagg, and Mrs. Barbara Coombes in the threewheeler races.



GINGER WOOD writes . . .

(Younger readers may like to know that the pre-war Donington circuit was the scene of some of Ginger Wood's more daring exploits. These included his heroic fight to tame the fast but unwieldy 500cc New Imperial V-twin of the early 'thirties.)

Following my first visit to the new Donington Following my hist visit to the new Donnigton last year, I conclude the place is the same but the setting has changed which was to be expected after long years of closure. The great effort to build something new from the old has undoubtedly given enthusiasts a new track, but obviously it has its differences compared with when I feet have it. when I first knew it.

In the thirties, Mr. Gillies Shields and the bustling Fred Craner produced a circuit with a pleasant parkland cosiness complete with gates, dips and a curving road, plus a leap into space for the faster cars and motorbikes. We had to contend with hairpins, medium-fast bends with changing cambers – in fact, every type of hazard in just over three miles to the lap. About a mile of this was an undulating straight which gave a bumpy approach to a take-off point just before Melbourne turn. Before the Melbourne extension was included, Starkey Straight ended in a hairpin so that the track doubled back past the grandstand.
With his 499cc works Rudge, Norman Croft

was a star performer and I had many scraps with

him and two other good Donington riders, Squib Burton and R. L. (Les) Graham. At that time, I rode 500cc and 250cc New Imperials, Excelsiors, Velocettes and on one memorable occasion, a 98cc Vincent HRD.

In 1934-35 Matt Wright, New Imperial's development engineer and I were trying to 8ort out a few problems on the 500cc New Imperial V-twin, including snags with the lubrication, gearing, light alloys and reliability. We dropped a clanger in the Isle of Man later when some new magnesium brake shoes collapsed. . but that is magnesium brake shoes collapsed . . . but that is

The V-twin had some good fortune in 1936, winning the 100-mile Donington Senior Grand Prix after running out of petrol two laps before the finish. Luckily, I was able to push the 300 yards to the pits, but not before Harold "Dandy" Daniell (he was a snappy dresser then) had passed while I took on more fuel. I had to pull out all the stops to catch Harold, but eventually I got by him at Starkey's to be nicely set up for the sprint to the finishing line.

In 1938, Phil Vincent entered the 998cc


Vincent at Donington for me to ride in the unlimited capacity class, but I soon found that the wheelbase, which was about sixty inches, was too long and made cornering an effort so that at Holly Wood and Redgate I had to lay the 'bike over much too much. But the torque was quite something and what I lost on the bends I was able to regain on the straight, which the Vincent devoured in impressive fashion. I remember it pulled a top gear of slightly less than 3:1 and the bottom gear was 5½:1. But it was a devil to start, the clutch dragged and the engine spat back. A wag in the crowd shouted "Push it back towards Melbourne" so I did and blow the disqualification logey. By then, of course, the other riders were bogey. By then, of course, the other riders were


roaring down the opposite straight. However, on the fifth lap my Vincent had caught everyone except Ken Bills (Norton). Then the Vincent clutch failed. . .


The pre-war Donington had an appeal all its own but while the woods were very attractive especially for spectators, the racing curves through them demanded maximum concentration from riders. They could be unforgiving to "cowboy" riding tactics and several times imposed the supreme penalty. But I am glad I was able to enjoy the atmosphere and share many adventures here from 1931 to 1939.


