Phil Read waits for the off in the Formula One TT

Isle of Man T.T.

Of the spectators at today's Donington Park meeting, it's a fair bet that a considerable number were

attracted to the Isle of Man TT races this year... and came back more than satisfied.

The 1977 TT will long stay in the memory. Racing was first class, records toppled throughout the week and, despite the course's reputation of being so dangerous, there were very few injuries.

Each of the eight races provided all kinds of interest. Even the new Formula One event, with a world championship prize at stake, was a success although torrential rain sent race-fans scurrying for shelter and so missing the opportunity of seeing a certain gentleman add one more honour to an already impressive list of achievements.

Phil Read

Phil Read, seven times a world champion up to the TT, was the man in question. After a tirade ofnationally-voiced comments about the Island which did the race so much harm at the time and was back — and how!

Read, now 39 and a company director, came

out of brief retirement to show that he could still master the 37%-mile Mountain Course,

especially as it was safer than when he last rode

The vast sums of money being offered as bait by the Auto-Cycle Union to lure back the star riders obviously had some bearing on Read's return. Certainly his decision to race there stirred the public's imagination more than anything else and visitors to the Island this time came in their thousands. Isle of Man traffic jams were even

more frequent this year!

Whatever his motives, Read proved what he is

— a superb, talented rider with enough experience and determination to still win races.

It was unfortunate that he was not in a position to try for a hat-trick of wins following the Formula One and Senior (301 to 500 cc) races. A run-out on his 749 cc Yamaha on the public roads the evening before the big-money Classic event resulted in a tumble at Brandish. Instead of lining up with the rest of the hopefuls on the Glencrutchery Road, he was lying in a Noble's hospital bed, Douglas, with a fractured collar bone.

That was a disappointment for the eager

thousands on the Island. They wanted to see if Read could do it again.

The first opportunity of seeing the great man

back in action came on the opening day's racing. With its world title looking so tempting, Honda made a concerted effort to win the Formula One race. When Honda are chasing anything, they don't do things by halves!

on to tinigs by halves!

They had secured the services of Read, had a special 820 cc Honda quickly prepared in Japan and had done hours of pre-race planning to ensure they won the race. Honda had been without a world crown since 1967 when Mike Hailwood won the 250 and 350 titles.

He topped the practice charts and soon as the race began it was pretty obvious Read and his Honda were going to take a lot of beating. But it came as no surprise when controversy entered the race after it had been cut by a lap due to the

appalling weather.

Welshman Roger Nicholls on the 860 cc Sports
Motorcycles Ducati was in with a shout but had to come in for refuelling at the end of the third lap. Read needed to call in the pits for more fuel too but, with the announcement of the race being shortened to four laps just minutes old, his pit crew waved him through. Said Honda Britain race boss Gerald Davison afterwards: "We took a gamble. We acted on information received from a fairly believable source."

With the time saved by not stopping, Read—who had had one lengthy 52 seconds fuel stop when he also had to sort out visor problems—won from Nicholls by 38.4 seconds at an average speed of 97.02 mph, a good pace in the w

nditions.

The Ducati camp were slightly dismayed at events especially as their machine could have gone the full four laps without a refuelling stop. But Read had won the race for 350 — 500 cc two strokes and 600—1,000 cc four strokes and

worst I had ever experienced. Over the mountain, there were streams across the road".

There was no holding the man from then on. He was the talk of the town and when he added the Senior TT to his tally as well, race enthusiasts would almost have given him the freedom of the Island. His Suzuki 500-4 motor was one from the factory, used by Pat Hennen when he won the Marlboro series in New Zealand last winter. But overheating during practice had made Read less than confident of even completing a lan But. There was no holding the man from then on But overfreating during practice had made Read less than confident of even completing a lap. But win he did — by the margin of 18 seconds from Tom Herron riding a 350 cc Yamaha. His race speed for the five laps — again shortened by a lap due to the weather but this time without controversy — was 106.97 mph and his 110.01 mph fastest lap was easily a personal best.

So that was Read's complack TT — two rides.

So that was Read's comeback TT - two rides, two wins. Naturally the question one asks now is:

'Could Read still ride as competitively elsewhere?'

The answer must be yes, provided he was

aboard reasonable machinery. Read has demonstrated over the years that he can be successful where-ever he rides and even though

his rivals may have youth on their side, Read on decent equipment would continue to be a threat But what of the other riders who made the '77 TT such a hit and who could be gracing Donington Park in the not-too-distant future?

Classic Grant

Mick Grant, that popular Team Kawasaki works rider, definitely had the most rewarding TT. He pocketed a cool £6,000 for winning the Classic in real style, smashing the lap record and race record in the process.

Grant, who raised John Williams 112.27 mph record lap set last year to 112.77 mph, was due for the win. His season on the big Kawsaki triple has been far from good and this was the event he needed to prevent his confidence flagging.

Record Sidecars

The sidecar boys were making history too. George O'Dell, strongly fancied to bring a world championship back to Britain this season, set a championship back to Britain this season, set a new sidecar lap record of 102.80 mph with Kenny Arthur in their Eric May 750 cc Yamaha—4. Reigning British champion Dick Greasley, with passenger Mick Skeels, became the first crew to break the magical 100 mph barrier in a race while Mac Hobson and Stuart Collins topped the ton twice in winning the second race.

There were other heroes too in the Isle of Man this year. Charlie Williams, who raced at Donington's 're-opening' National meeting in the Spring, notched his sixth TT victory in the Junior class and followed it up with a second in the Classic. Tom Herron had a second and a third while Eddie Roberts had a brace of third

places.

The list could go on and on. For sure every rider who took part in this year's TT helped to make it so memorable.

So where does the TT go from here?

One thing is certain. Even without full world championship grand prix status, the event is still

possibly the most significant race meeting on the British calendar. Its popularity has never been greater.

Read's return this year could work wonders for the TT. His decision to go back after all that was said could encourage the other big names of the international motorcycling world to consider making the trip in future years. Giacomo Agostini? Steve Baker? Kenny Roberts? With the galaxy of stars over there this time, these other two-wheeled superstars cannot now discount the Isle of Man...especially with the vast amounts of prize money — and start money — being handed out.

out.

This year cash awards amounted to over £33,000. That's a lot of money in anyone's language and, if sponsorship on the lines of Schweppes involvement this time is increased, there is no telling how great a prize the TT can offer.

But money aside, the TT still ranks as the world's finest two-wheeled carnival. This year's TT was no exception to that belief.






