It cannot be stressed too strongly that liability for a substantial claim could rest with the owners of the vehicle and the driver. (Or the parent in the case of a minor.)

The Union's insurers will quite legitimately repudiate any claim on them for damages arising out of the accident caused by an unauthorised driver.

THE HONDA BRITISH MOTO CROSS CHAMPIONSHIP 1999

Welcome to CANADA HEIGHTS for the first round of the 1999 Honda British Moto Cross Championship on behalf of the SIDCUP & D.M.C.C.

I am sure we are in for a really good day's racing.

As many of you know, the Sidcup Club did not promote a round of this Championship last year; instead we ran a very successful early season International. We hope to combine this International flavour with the British Championship this year by having some wild card entries from the Continent.

Those who follow the sport will know that we tried to have a head to head with World Champion Joel Smets and Runner Up Stefan Everts on the menu but this was not to be.

Unfortunately whilst Joel is here in person today to sign autographs, the arm he broke late last year has still not healed sufficiently to allow him to race.

Additionally we could not ultimately agree terms with the Everts Team and as I write this I have learned that he has serious knee problems following a bad accident at Beucaire.

However I am sure that Danny Thybers, Avo Leok, Gert-Jan Doorn, Joakim Eliasson in the Open Class and Antti Pyrhonen in the 125cc Class will give the home runners some serious competition and that's the name of the game. So, let's all wish both Joel and Stefan a speedy recovery.

Those of you who regularly visit this venue will notice that the track has been laid out in line with Grand Prix standards. This is because we are being assessed with a view to the homologation of the circuit for a higher level of competition - namely the WORLD SIDECAR CROSS GRAND PRIX on SEPTEMBER 4/5th of this year. Let's hope that all goes well.

The format of the meeting will be slightly different today with qualification to the main Championship Races being decided during timed training. Each bike will be fitted with an electronic timing device called a transponder, this sends a signal to a computer that records all lap times during the timed training sessions. The fastest 40 times posted in each class will make it through to the British Championships with the remaining 20 that do not make the cut combining to make the Non Qualifiers races.

May I close by thanking our sponsors. To put on an event such as this, stretches the resources to the limit and the Club would like to thank Honda UK, Wiseco Pistons, Dirt Bike Rider, Weaver Bros, Catering, Bristol Street Bromley, San Siro and The Image Corporation. Each who have all helped immensely, they deserve your full support.





For both 125 and open class championship races the first rider to pass our sign board will receive £25 (we thought it would be unfair in the mixed race).


Look out for our holeshot board and make your own decision.

Hallo Race fans,

You won't believe how disappointed I am not to be riding at Canada Heights. In fact I haven't even been riding my bike at all since new year!

What first looked as an injury that was going to heal in 2 months (for sure after the doctor had put a plate on the broken bone), is still giving me a hard time after more than 5 months. Indeed, I broke my arm on the 20th of September '98 and had a cast for seven weeks.

After that X rays were taken and everything looked very normal. That is why I rode the I.S.D.E. in Australia and even won the 400 cc four stroke class!! But I was never without pain and at the end of the year I had to undergo another medical examination with X rays and scans. My body had made a lot of calcium around the fracture and the plate but not on the fracture line itself. So in order to let it heal properly and to save my chances to compete in the first GP, the doctor immediately put me on non active for at least 10 weeks (until half of March).

Though I can't ride but nevertheless I'm here just to meet all you race fans and to enjoy the races, at least it's less frustrating than being home and running up the Walls!! Have a nice time at Canada Heights.





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


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
