elcome to the fourth round of the Maxxis ACU **British Motocross** Championship here at Canada Heights. With two rounds of the championship already in the bag, the action on the track couldn't be any closer.

Following the unfortunate cancellation of the Foxhill round, the championship returns to action here at Canada Heights. The Kent venue is sure to produce some exciting bar to bar action as the battle to claim the upper hand in the championship continues.

In the MX2 class, Latvian Matiss Karro has been a dominant force on the Wilvo Forkrent KTM taking four out of the six race wins so far this season, unfortunately two crash filled races have stopped Karro from claiming the Red

Plate. That honour goes to Mel Pocock on the Hitachi Construction Machinery UK KTM machine who has taken the overall victories at the opening two rounds and leads the series by a small margin of just 2 points.

While Karro and Pocock will be battling for championship points, other MX2 front runners include Bryan MacKenzie and Adam Sterry who have already taken race wins this year, while Neville Bradshaw and Steven Lenoir have already stepped onto the podium this year.

In the MX1 class the battle at the top of the championship sees Shaun Simpson on the Hitachi Construction Machinery UK KTM machine lead Jake Nicholls on the Wilvo Forkrent KTM by just 5 points. So far this season the racing has been extremely close with the pair taking 5 of




the 6 race wins, with Dantac Husqvarna's Nathan Watson claiming the other race win.

CANADA HEIGHTS

he Sidcup Club have been using Canada Heights since before the war, but it was in the early eighties they were given a chance to buy the land. The project was financed with monies from the Sports Council and an ingenious scheme called the 100 Club where supporters pledged £100 interest free and the Club promised to draw 5 names out of the hat each year and repay their loan. Times moved on and we were able to make improvements as we now owned the land so making it secure was the first priority with gates and fencing.

As events grew in popularity Canada Heights could not accommodate all of the spectators a meeting of today's statue attracts so we had to hire some of the local fields for extra car parking. In 2007 we were offered another 17.5 acres of grassland in which you have parked your car in today. That size of field, in this particular neck of the woods, does not come cheap and after a lot of soul searching we bought it. We have found we can not only use it to park cars but

the enduro boys enjoy a blast when they come out of the woody area in our Hare and Hounds events, and we have added a couple of sections for the trials lads.

50 odd acres of land needs guite a lot of looking after and over the years after each successful Maxxis Meeting we have been able to buy equipment and plant to make our lives easier. Our neighbouring farmer had been hireing us a barn to keep everything in but when the farm changed hands we were given notice to guit. We took another big step by deciding to go for planning permission to build a barn to house everything. Money was a problem as we had used all our spare cash up in buying the field but the ACU came to our rescue. We secured a very cheap loan from the ACU in Rugby and topped it up with further funds from the local ACU - the South Eastern Centre.

Canada Heights is not just the track we have to manage the whole site as well which is done by the members of the Sidcup Club who are all volunteers see our website or follow us on facebook to see what we get up to..





Since his arrival on the British Championship scene Mel Pocock has always been a front runner in the MX2 class and was involved in one of the most dramatic title battles of recent years during the 2012

2012 also saw Pocock capture the European 250 title in dominant fashion, taking a number of race wins during the season, while battling for British honours in the Maxxis. The battle between Pocock and Elliott Banks Browne went down to the very last lap of the last race, with Pocock narrowly missing out.

After missing the British Championship during 2013 to concentrate on the GP's, Pocock has returned to the championship for this season with highly successful Hitachi Construction Machinery UK KTM squad.

With two rounds of the championship already completed Pocock currently leads the points and is focused on claiming that

18 year old Chris started racing at the age 7 alongside his brother and fellow MX2 rider. Matt Bayliss. Unfortunately Chris's youth career didn't come without its fair share of injuries including a broken femur, ankle. fibula, and a separation of his ankle from his tibia and fibula.

The last two seasons have seen Chris produce a number of strong results in the MXY2 class, including a second overall podium at Lyng in 2012, while on route to finishing 7th in the Championship.


During the 2013 season Chris once again produced a number of strong results and claimed 8th in the championship. While


