THE 1984 BRITISH MOTO CROSS CHAMPIONSHIPS

FOREWORD

Welcome to Elsworth Moto Parc for what is effectively the third round to be run, due to the postponement of the scheduled third round at Wakes Colne, two weeks ago. Our commiserations to the Halstead Club for the atrocious weather conditions they experienced before and on the day.

The current British Champion, Dave Thorpe, leads this year's series with maximum points (120) fro mtwo rounds in his second year on the factory Honda. Can Dave, who is in sensational form, make it another maximum today? Young Jeremy Whatley, the Heron Suzuki star, will be out to reduce Thorpe's advantage and his present form suggests he means business. Completing the top trio is Ulster's Laurence Spence on the Kawasaki, and only 12 points adrift of Whatley.

Scotsman Willie Simpson, looking confident on his Suzuki, is just four points down on Spence, with popular evergreen Roger Harvey on the Mitsui Yamaha in fifth place with 52 points.

Dave Watson, the young Kawasaki rider, has had the speed but not the best of luck so far, and finds himself in sixth place. Expect surprises from Dave today, and also from former World and British Champion, Graham Noyce. "Rolls Noyce" has not hit his best form this year on the factory KTM, but will be looking to regain the speed and consistency his rivals know he can produce.

Brett Steele is making his presence felt on the Husqvarna, and his gritty riding has taken him to eighth place, only three points adrift of Noyce. Brett is threatened by two East Anglians, both locked in battle for ninth place on 36 points and expect young Kurt Nicoll (KTM), and Geoff Mayes (Kawasaki) to rise to the occasion of this "local championship".


Kevin Froud (Yamaha), leads a bunch of riders including Rob Hooper (Kawasaki) and young Perry Leask (Honda) all pushing for a top ten placing, but look out for Neil Hudson, now on the Honda and recently back from injury, to produce some surprises.

Add to the above such talented performers as Steve Russell, Cajiva teenagers Paul Hunt and Howard Lucas, Kawasaki's rising young star Andy Nicolls, plus Greg Hanson, Mark Fulton, Dave Tomasik, Rob Andrews, Pete Mathia, Carl Pope, Richard Dye, Mike Pearce and Time Stowe, and the scene is set.

THE PIRELLI QUALIFYING CHAMPIONSHIP

The Pirelli Support series has already been set alight with exciting performances from championship leader KTM's Mervyn Anstie. Honda stars take the next two places, 16-year-old Mark Banks followed closely by Paul Luscombe. Dark horse of the championship so far has been Jared Smith who has just been taken on by Kawasaki. Jared is currently in fourth spot in the championship. Starting today's meeting in fifth place is Keith Turner, following up just behind is Aussie Brian Bader (Yamaha), Heron Suzuki Alan Morrison, Chris Maindonald stands in ninth place, Chris on a KTM. The next position is a joint one, both riders on 18 points, the northerner Steve Bircher (Maico) and Pete Freeman (Yamaha).


Black Flag with number displayed ... Driver riding machine bearing that number to stop.
