

BRITISH 500cc MOTO CROSS GRAND PRIX

NICK HARRIS, Motor Cycle News.

Welcome to the British 500 Moto Cross Grand Prix, without doubt the premier event in the British Moto Cross calendar.

It's hard to believe 12 months have elapsed since American Brad Lackey, riding the works Honda, thrilled over 20,000 sun-scorched fans by winning last year's event.

I bet a silver dollar Lackey would be delighted to repeat that performance to further his chances of becoming America's first

world moto cross champion.

Although these notes have been written before the American and Italian rounds, Lackey is involved in a battle royal with Finnish world champion Heikki Mikkola (Yamaha) at the head of the championship table. With Mikkola in front at the halfway stage, Lackey has been fighting desperately to keep in touch and the pair have set such a searing pace that already the championship appears to be a two horse race.

Mikkola, who completely dominated last year's championship riding Yamaha machinery for the first time after 13 successful years with Husqvarna, is equally determined to add a fourth

world crown to his collection.

Former world champion Roger De Coster (Suzuki) has made a miraculous recovery from a near fatal practice crash in February and proved his worth and fitness by winning the Swedish Grand Prix in May. His Suzuki team-mate, Gerrit Wolsink, has had a wretched time with mechanical problems and on a couple of occasions has looked capable of beating Mikkola before retiring.

Other riders certain to be in contention include German Herbert Schmitz (Maico) who won the first race in Sweden, the KTM trio of Andre Malherbe, who has made a successful switch from the 250 class, French youngster Jean-Jacques Bruno and Jaak Van Velthoven, Hakan Andersson (Husqvarna), Andre Vromans (Suzuki) and former world champion Bengt Aberg riding the three valve,

four stroke Yamaha.

But what are the chances of a British victory? British champion Graham Noyce holds the key to that question. The 21-year blond haired Hampshire bombshell switched to the mighty Japanese Honda team at the beginning of this season amidst a blaze of publicity. A series of mechanical problems has not helped his confidence but Noyce, probably Britain's finest rider since world champion Jeff Smith, is certain to be on his mettle in front of his home supporters and will be anxious to repeat his first race victory at the Grand Prix two years ago at Doddington Park.

He will receive excellent support from fellow Grand Prix campaigners Bob Wright (CCM), who should have recovered from his Swedish Grand Prix crash, veteran John Banks who rides the Merlyn framed four stroke Honda, and Steve How (Hagon/Yamaha) the British Support champion.

Last year Andy Roberton (Montesa) was the highest placed Briton in the results and together with veteran Vic Allan (Bultaco) will be formidable opposition for the world championship stars.

Suzuki mounted Bryan Wade and Steven Beamish, Rob Wilkinson (Maico) and Dave Tomasik (KTM) complete the British line-up.

Whatever the outcome let's hope the sun keeps shining on what promises to be one of the most crucial and exciting moto cross events seen in Britain for a very long time.




