PREVIEW by Neil Webster (Motor Cycle News)

British hopes for success in this year's 500cc World Moto Cross Championship reach crisis point today at Farleigh Castle.

Britain's Graham Noyce has dropped behind the leading pair of Andre Malherbe and Hakan Carlqvist thanks to cruel luck at the last two rounds. Noyce was caught up in first turn pile-ups in both races in America and was put out of both French legs by punctures and has dropped over 40 points behind the leaders after a sizzling start to the year. If he is to salvage any hope of taking his second world crown he needs a fantastic result today. You can help by giving him all the vocal support you can muster.

Noyce's works Honda team-mate Dave Thorpe also deserves your backing. Thorpe narrowly missed out on overall victory here last year after winning the first leg and is looking forward to scoring his first GP win under Honda colours on his home ground. After starting the year on a low note, scoring only five points in the first two rounds, Thorpe has faced a hard battle to get his confidence back. He now seems to have won and has shown his true form at the last two European rounds, getting his best result of the year with second overall in France two weeks ago.

Now up to fifth in the series, 20 year-old Dave, from Woodley in Berkshire, now has his sights firmly on the fourth place held by Belgian works rider Harry Everts. But both our men face two huge obstacles if they are to win here today — Andre Malherbe and Hakan Carlqvist.

The super consistent Malherbe and hard man Carlqvist are separated by just three points at the top of the table after a nail-biting duel in France. Carlqvist, suffering the after effects of a practice crash which left him with a broken rib only missed out on a second race win by yards as Malherbe held on by his fingertips, and you can expect the struggle to be just as fierce today. Neither man can afford a mistake or a breakdown and the tension will be tremendous.

But away from the top of the table Yamaha's Neil Hudson (Yamaha), Willie Simpson (Husqvarna) and the Kawasaki line-up of Laurence Spence, Kurt Nicoll, Jonathan Wright and Howard Lucas will all be giving 100 per cent effort for vital points. With millions of television viewers joining us to witness the most crucial race of the season let's all get right behind our riders and urge them on to the success they deserve.







Grand Prix 'Qualifying'

Automatic entry is given to the First 10 of the previous years World Championship.

Grand Prix race start line is for 40 drivers and therefore the remaining 30 places are 'qualified' for.

The Organisers have to accept 8 entry applications from drivers on the Graded International (500cc) list of their National Federation. If the entry exceeds 30 after listing the automatic entry drivers, then a ballot is made to divide the remaining entries into two timed training sessions. The fastest 15 of each timed training session will then be entered in the two G.P. races. All this will take place on the Friday.

The timed training session for the 40 G.P. drivers on the Saturday morning will decide the order of going out to the start line for the G.P. races.

FIFTY YEARS ON

It is a happy coincidence that as well as marking the West Wilts Motor Club's 50th Anniversary 1983 sees "live" television coverage for the very first time of a British round of the World 500cc Motocross Championship from Farleigh Castle - a name synonymous with the West Wilts Motor Club and they take pleasure in welcoming everyone here today to help them celebrate their first 50 years.

In 1933 motorcycle clubs from Devizes, Trowbridge and Melksham amalgamated and formed what was to be called the West Wilts Motor Club. But this was not an immediate success and a difficult two years were experienced when until on 25th April 1933 a small group of enthusiasts who were determined that the Club should thrive met at the Elm Tree Hotel in Devizes and it was directly from that meeting that the Club really owes its existence and indeed its long successful history.

The years before the Second World War saw them organising scrambles, trials and grass track meetings in a very capable manner but they were always on the lookout for better things and to improve their standards and it was as a result of a chance meeting that the Club found a possible grass track course at Farleigh Castle, came to an arrangement with the owners and so put in the foundation of an association that is as strong today as it has ever been.

The immediate post-war years saw Farleigh really blossom when after four or five years of very little sport, motor cycle grass track racing was presented to the general public. It was the hey-day of

Farleigh and the West Wilts Motor Club and many are the stories that abound about that period and its characters - none more vividly portrayed than in the late Cyril May's delightful book "The Farleigh Castle Story".

In the early 1950's grass track racing declined in popularity and the Club turned to other types of motor-cycle sport and it was around this time that the famous, or infamous depending on your particular experience and point of view, Tanner Trudge was conceived. Basically it was a bit of fun for the lads after the Christmas festivities to enable them to work off their excesses, a Time and Observation Trial with the entry fee just sixpence (2½ new pence) plus insurance of one shilling (5 new pence) hence its name. This annual ritual is still going strong though of late there has been the problem of finding a course that is available at the appropriate period and it has been necessary to move to a little later in the Winter but in spite of that the event lives on and will without doubt continue to do so.

Of course there are other types of events the Club organises and they range from Open-to-Centre Trials, a Non-expert and Over 40 Trial, a summer series of Closed-to-Club trials, Junior Motocross, driving tests and a good selection of social activities which when spread through the year help to keep the West Wilts Motor Club the successful organisation that it undoubtably is. It goes without saying that the Club now looks forward to its next 50 years and many are the thoughts as to what they will bring to sport in general and motor-cycle sport in particular.

New members are always welcome at the monthly business meetings of the Club which are held on the first Thursday of each month at Melksham House, Melksham.


