PREVIEW

A very warm welcome to you all to Farleigh Castle today, where the West Wilts Motor Club go into their 51st year with the Third Round of the 1984 British Sidecar-Cross Championship.

It is just 21 years ago that Farleigh saw sidecar-cross last, three races being included in the Maybug Trophy meeting on 12th May 1963, which gave Mike Guildford on a 650 GWS from Tidworth a clean sweep of three firsts. Jim Sheehan on a 650 Chimera from Bracknell and Bill Turner on a 650 Triumph had to be content with sharing second and third placings, so it is with nostalgia that many will be looking back today on those great names of the past in another era of sidecar racing.

Farleigh Castle has been known over those years as a circuit for solo machines and when the opportunity arose to stage Sidecar-Cross, the Club sought the assistance, guidance and advice from the very popular local sidecar team of Paul and Mark Millard in laying out a different circuit that took advantage of the natural features of the land, kept clear of much of the Grand Prix course, but, hopefully, still retained the spectacle and magic of Farleigh Castle.

Although the title of today's meeting is the Third Round, it is in fact only the second to be run. Our good friends and neighbours, the Frome Club, staged the First Round on 3rd June, which was to have been followed by the Oxford Ixion Club on 17th June, but, unfortunately, they were unable to stage the event and so Farleigh becomes the second in the 1984 series.

As you will see from the programme, there is a splendid entry of over 75 sidecars, and in the Championship races we shall be looking to see if British Champion, Terry Good and his new passenger, Andreas Husser, can repeat their form from Frome, and also whether Paul and Mark Millard can really shine on this new course after their disappointment the same day. The Qualifying Championship is certain to be every bit as hotly contested, with the large entry dictating that heats are required to see who goes forward into the two Qualifying Races.

The Two-Leg Moto-Cross for Solos has attracted a fine entry, with Steve Beamish, Paul Hunt, Perry Leask, Andy Nicholls, Dave Tomasik and Rob Hooper, amongst the riders who always produce fine, close and hectic racing, whilst there are over 20 ATT entries for their three races, and it is worth remembering that at Frome everyone was impressed at their lap times and speeds comparing very favourably with the best of the sidecar crews.

So all the ingredients are here for a memorable and varied day's sport, featuring all the best in moto-cross, be it on two or three wheels, and the West Wilts Club wish everyone, competitors and spectators alike, an enjoyable day out.

Finally, we look forward to seeing you all again at the next meeting at Farleigh Castle, which is the Sixth Round of the 1984 British Moto-Cross Championships, sponsored by Southern Formes and Cutters Ltd., on Sunday 12th August.






