PREVIOUS "BATTLES OF NEWBURY"

Whilst marching upon London in 1645, King Charles I was chased from the West Country and engaged in battle on the outskirts of our town by the Earl of Essex, leading the Parliamentarian army. Although inconclusive, a very bloody battle ensued on September 20th, as a result of which the King withdrew his forces to Oxford. The Falkland memorial is the most obvious reminder of this encounter. However Wash Common, where the battle took place, possibly gained its name from the fact that the ground there was that day awash with blood.

On October 27th of the next year the King and his army were returning from Cornwall, to be engaged in the second Battle of Newbury. Much to the chagrin of Oliver Cromwell, he was again allowed to escape, although soundly defeated by the Earl of Manchester. The nearby Donnington Castle makes a fine memorial to this battle. Only the gatehouse is still standing and even this required extensive restoration recently, thanks to the attentions of vandals. It is today a protected ancient monument, under the care of the Ministry of Public Buildings and Works and well worth a visit some time. Not a great deal is now known about the plan of campaign, but it needs little imagination to see our scrambles circuit as a base camp for one of the opposing armies, even if it was not actually fought over. So it makes a very suitable location for the current series of "Battles."

Over three hundred years were to pass before our local "Mr. Motocross," alias enthusiastic club secretary Dave Joyce, decided it was time to stage yet another "Battle of Newbury." We all hoped it might prove as colourful and long-remembered as its illustrious forerunners, but of course far less bloody! The first scramble to bear this new title took place on Mr. Marshall's farm at Winterbourne, approximately two miles North-west of where you are now standing. On March 11th, AD 1962 the victor was no Earl, but a Prince amongst riders, our old friend Ken Heanes from nearby Fleet, mounted as usual on his trusty Triumph charger. I would classify him as a Royalist!

The next year and March 10th, saw the battleground shift about four miles Eastwards to Cold Ash. Ron Amey's Hartshill Copse to be precise. Vic Eastwood won on a fiery steed from Plumstead. Most definitely a Parliamentarian!

In 1964 we stayed at Cold Ash and after some very rugged skirmishing amongst the scrubland, Roger Snoad came out on top. This time a lightweight mount trained by one Bert Greeves proved the best. Another Roundhead?

The next year Squire Fairhurst, now club president, gave us our best break yet, when he granted permission for us to stage the contest over the "Fox and Hounds" course. This proved to be a very popular move amongst both the combatants and the spectating members of the public. Now the latter could observe the fighting more closely and there was pienty of room for their own steeds to 'graze' whilst it was in progress. Oxfordian Joe Johnson was top dog, using a very British mount with the French name of "Metisse." So a foreign mercenary comes to the fore at last!

In 1966, a two-leg 500 c.c. Moto-cross determined the winner as that dour Yorkshire fighter Arthur Lampkin (B.S.A. Victor). A "Laughing Cavalier"?

In 1967 a larger sack of gold than ever before for such a contest in this country came the way of the worthy winner. Past winners Eastwood and Snoad did battle with many strong contenders, but even they had to concede victory to the redoubtable Alan Clough and his Swedish Husqvarna. A Norseman wins the Battle of Newbury!

PREVIOUS "BATTLES OF NEWBURY" — Continued.

Last year three past victors came to the line, but this time Clough and Snoad could not match the speed of Eastwood and John Banks on their Birmingham bred mounts. In fact Victor was the victor on his (B.S.A.) Victor!

So we come to March 9th, 1969, when an entirely new sporting course will be employed for the first time. The monetary inducements are the same as last time, despite the outlay of further pieces of eight to transport to these shores not only the champion of Belgium, but also a highly rated man from Sweden. Unfortunately dual winner Eastwood, having transferred allegiance to a Scandinavian firm, is still hors de combat and a simultaneous contest in Leicester has deprived us of the best lightweight steeds. However, many potential winners have been gathered together for your entertainment. So take up your chosen positions—battle is about to be joined. Could this be the year for a foreign victory? I imagine those contenders emerging from a certain Birmingham 'Smithy' will have different ideas!

"Where," you may well ask, "are the Falkland Memorials and Donnington Castles of today's battles?" I commend to you the many homes for the young run by the 'Church of England Children's Society.' especially the one near to our old course at Cold Ash. Also the swimming pool at the 'Mary Hare Grammar School for the Deaf' just across the A34 from our present circuit. What better memorials could we leave to posterity? If you support us in this and other meetings you are helping make life easier for some less fortunate members of the younger generation.

Thank you. Enjoy an excellent day's racing and may you have a safe journey home afterwards. Looking forward to seeing you next time.
