

### The 2012 Gates of Brockenhurst GURSTON DOWN Hillclimb Championship



The Gurston Down Hillclimb Championship comprises four rounds at this famous Wiltshire Hill, at events held on April 22nd, June 24th, July 21st/22nd and September 9th. Points are awarded to registered contenders on the basis of how fast they go, relative to their class 'bogey times'. The bogey times are calculated by adding eight seconds to each class record (as they stand at the begining of the season), and the amount by which each competitor beats the bogey time determines the number of points he or she scores. Example: Class bogey time is 42.45 secs. A competitor sets a time of 34.78 secs. To work out the points. 42.45 minus 34.78 = 7.67 points. As you can see, as times are measured to the nearest one hundredth of a second, points are allocated in the same tiny increments.

Each competitor counts their best three out of four scores, so that if an event is missed, or a driver suffers a mechanical problem, it is still possible to remain competitive in the championship as long as three good scores are recorded. The key to being successful is being competitive in your class, and being able to get close to, or even beat your class record. Indeed, to win the championship almost requires that a driver HAS to beat the class record, as set the previous season, at each meeting in order to put up a high score. There is an award for the overall winner of the Championship of course, but awards also go to the winners of each class in the championship too, so there is plenty of competitive action throughout the whole field as drivers vie for position. As a form guide, the top three positions in last year's Championship are listed below, as well as the winning drivers in each championship class. With some drivers changing class or uprating their existing cars, together with new (and returning) drivers taking part this year, the Championship looks highly unpredictable again!

# The 2012 BARC (SW) GURSTON DOWN Top Ten Challenge Supported by Gates of Brockenhurst

Running in parallel with the Championship, and at the same meetings, The Top Ten Challenge sees points being awarded to the ten outright fastest registered competitors at each qualifying meeting, irrespective of which class they run in. 10 points go to the overall fastest contender, down to 1 point for the 10th fastest. So, as you might expect, the Challenge tends to be dominated by the larger capacity single seater racing cars running at the end of the entry, though the smaller capacity racing cars and Sports Libre cars frequently get among the points too. And should Mother Nature decide to interfere by raining part way through the meeting, then the points scoring can be thrown wide open.

Once more, a driver's best three scores count towards overall position in the Challenge, and with a number of potentially rapid car/driver combinations appearing in various classes again this season we're not about to try and predict a Challenge winner! The tussle for supremacy in the Challenge is just as ferocious as in the Championship. The remarkably rapid smaller single seaters, with their amazingly low weight and, hence, high power to weight ratios, could again spring surprises, especially if conditions are less than perfect, when their nimble handling can overcome the power deficit to the bigger engined cars.

It's going to be another fascinating battle, and last year's top positions (below) give a few clues as to who to watch. Andrew Forsyth secured his second successive Top Ten Challenge last year, but starts the 2012 season in his father John's latest acquisition, a historic 500cc Alfa Dana and therefore seems unlikely to be in the hunt for Best Time of the Day this season! Tony Wiltshire actually set the fastest time in the 'big racing car class' in Challenge events last year in his then newly acquired ex-Marsh 2.5 Gould GR55, and on paper looks like a short odds favourite for the title this season. Rodney Thorne was thwarted by a frustrating sensor gremlin in two rounds last season on his ex-Roy Lane 3.5 Pilbeam MP58's V8 Judd engine, but with that sorted is sure to be in the mix. The fast 2 litre racing cars and sports racing cars can score well, as can their 1600cc counterparts. And as the table below shows, even the modified specialist production cars can finish in the Top Ten Challenge. It's going to be fast and furious again!

# New to hillclimb meetings? Here's our handy guide to help you enjoy the action

This may be your first visit to a hillclimb meeting. If it is, welcome to Gurston Down, and we hope you enjoy the close-quarters, high speed action against the clock that the British Automobile Racing Club (South Western Centre) stages at the eight meetings per year held at Gurston Down. Like all sports, speed hillclimbing has its own peculiar vocabulary of terms and sayings that you'll hear being bandied about. Here's a short guide to some of the words and phrases in use.

### Clerk of the Course

The person in charge of the safe running of the event and ensuring that rules and regulations are adhered to.

### Green light

A driver on the start line is shown a green light to indicate he or she may start their run. The timing apparatus only begins to tick when the car leaves the start line and cuts the timing beam.

### Marshals

Orange-clad volunteers without whom no meeting could happen, and who deal with all on-track incidents.

#### Paddock

Area, open to the public, where competitors store and prepare their cars during an event

#### Practice

Unofficial timed runs that competitors are required to take to qualify for the official timed runs.

### Red flag

The only warning flag used in hillclimbing. When a competitor is red flagged by the marshals, he or she is required to come to a stop immediately. Generally it means there has been some sort of incident on the track ahead. The driver shown the red flag usually gets a re-run.

### Scrutineering

Cars are checked over by scrutineers prior to the meeting's commencement to ensure compliance with safety and eligibility rules.

#### Slicks

Treadless racing tyres which, in hillclimbing, are made with very soft compound rubber for high grip levels.

#### Timed runs

The official runs that count for positions in the competition.

#### Timing strut

Black, vertical blade mounted on the front of every car to cut the timing beam. This triggers the timing gear at the start and the finish so that the cars' runs are all timed to one-hundredth of a second.

### Tyre-warming

Drivers may spin their tyres prior to the start to warm them up and so increase grip.

#### Wets

Racing tyres equipped with tread to displace standing water, used when the track is wet.



# Gurston Down Speed Hillclimb



The British Automobile Racing Club (South Western Centre) warmly welcomes you to Gurston Down. This is the 46th year in which the Club has been staging speed hill climbs at Gurston, now regarded as one of the best venues in the country, and our ability to maintain this continuity down the years is due to the wholehearted support and cooperation of Gurston Farm's owners, the J. Hitchings Partnership, to whom we are deeply indebted.

The challenge of Speed Hill Climbing is, simply, about driving the course in the shortest possible time from a standing start to a flying finish. Timing is done to the nearest one hundredth of a second. The ultimate achievement at each event is setting "Best Time of the Day" (BTD), usually accomplished by one of the high powered single seater racing cars.

### The Course

The start is crucial to a good time, drivers striving to get just the right amount of wheelspin to get a good "launch", and then they take the downhill plunge, accelerating up through the gears. They pass through the first "speed trap" at the bottom of the hill, where the fastest cars reach over 130 mph in around 5 seconds, and then the deceptively difficult Hollow Bend looms rapidly. Next comes the critical approach to the Karousel, which requires late braking on the ideal line to be well placed for the second part of Gurston's slowest section, a very steep, sharp right hander taken at perhaps 25mph. This leads immediately to Deer's Leap, where the most powerful cars can get airborne! This is followed by Ashes Bend, a crucial left



hander that is a prime viewing point. You can see the drivers trying to prevent their cars running wide on the corner exit whilst attempting to get a good slingshot for the long drag up over Burke's Rise to the Finish. This is the sting in Gurston's tail, with a fast kink over the last few flat-out yards to keep the drivers alert until the end! Cars have been recorded crossing the Finish line at over 150mph...

### The Events

The MSA British Hillclimb Championship, the sport's top competition, visits Gurston in May & August. July's event is a round of the prestigious Midland Hillclimb Championship. The events in April, June, July & Sep-

tember feature rounds of our own Gurston Down Hillclimb Championship and the Top Ten Challenge. The SBD Speed Championships visit in April, the HSA Speed Championship in April and August, the Association of South Western Motor Clubs (ASWMC) holds a round of its Hillclimb Championship in June, and the Association of Central Southern Motor Clubs (ACSMC) Hillclimb Championship visits in April and June.

### The Machinery

Hillclimb cars come in three categories split into smaller groups according to the rules of the championship at a particular meeting, and then into classes according to engine capacity. The

main categories are for production cars, sports racing cars and single seat racing cars. The programme usually opens with production cars, divided into road going or modified categories, and split again into 'series' (high production volume) and 'specialist' (low production volume) classes sub-divided by engine capacity.


The sports racing category encompasses the Hillclimb Supersports class and the Sports Libre classes. These sports racing machines are purpose built racing cars with enveloping bodywork, or at least enclosed wheels. and highly modified engines, aerodynamic wings and so forth, and they can and do challenge for BTD.



The open-wheeled single seater racing cars comes in all shapes and sizes, starting with the historic 500cc cars run to the 500 Owners Association Rules. The modern equivalents, the 600cc racing cars, are powered by two- or four-stroke motorcycle engines and use a high power to weight ratio to produce remarkable performance. The 1100cc and 1600cc classes are also dominated by bike-engined cars, and there are some highly sophisticated machines competing nowadays. The up to 2000cc racing car class, until recently still the domain of the automotive-based engine, is increasingly being 'invaded' by supercharged and turbocharged bike-engined cars of 1300-



1400cc capacity, there being an 'equivalency factor' of 1.4 applied to pressure charged engines.



The pinnacle of four-wheeled hillclimb machinery is the unlimited capacity single seater class. Many of these cars are propelled by ex-Formula 1 and Indycar V8 engines, some enlarged in capacity to generate more power and torque. Huge, soft "slick" tyres develop tremendous grip, and large wings and cleverly shaped bodywork generate aerodynamic downforce to help create even more grip. Every bit helps when you've possibly got over 650 horsepower, you're doing maybe 140mph and the road is only 12 feet wide...!

And in April and June there are also the motorcycles from the National Hillclimb Association. Classes are again split by capacity, and as well as the two-wheel machines there are the three-wheel trikes and sidecar outfits.

Whatever type of machinery interests you, we hope you enjoy this meeting at Gurston Down!


