These Championships were instituted in 1951 for the up to 500 c.c. class and 1950 for the 295 c.c. class, Many famous names in the world of scrambling have featured in the awards list, most notable being Jeff Sifflith who has won the 500 c.c. class on no fewer than nine occasions. Of these six were in the consocutive wars 1950–65.

In previous years the Championships have gone under the title of the "A.C.U. Scrambles Drivers Stars" and more recently "British Scramble Drivers Championships". In 1966 the title was up dated to include the internationally accepted description of the Sport Motocross.

1969 is the second year that the Championships have been sponsored by Player's No.6.

The tremendous challenge offered

by the Motocross Championships is also of great importance to manufacturers so that they can discover first hand how machines stand up to the battering they receive. Practical research of this kind enables them to improve production models and leads to higher standards of performance. safety and road worthiness.

A word of caution. I would ask those spectators attending this event to remember that public road conditions are rather different from course conditions and to drive with care and consideration for others when returning home - and indeed, at all times.

If you wish to demonstrate your skill - the answer is to join a club affiliated to the A.C.U. and compete in events such as you are seeing today.

MOTOGROSS

The "Players No. 6" British Motocross Championships comprise two classes - up to 250 c.c. and up to 500 c.c. Riders scoring points in each of the classes at five different events throughout the season. The champion in each class will be awarded not only prize money but a superb "Players No. 6" Trophy which he will win outright. This series of ten events, taking place on some of the touchest and most demanding courses in the country, will attract the cream of British Motocross competitors.

These Championships have been held for many years under different titles; a background synopsis of the history of the Championships along with a list of previous winners appears on the Inside Back Cover of this programme.

Classes: The "Players No. 6" British Motocross Championships will be contested by riders in two classes:

> Class 1. Solo machines up to 250 c.c. Class 2. Solo machines from 320 c.c. to 500 c.c.

Every rider in the Qualifying Rounds will score points as follows:

1st 8 2nd 6 5th 2

3rd 4 6th 1

Duration of races

A signal will be exhibited when the race leader crosses the finishing line having completed thirty minutes, he and other riders are then given the 'plus two laps' signal board.
