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
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
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

BRITISH 250 cc MOTO CROSS GRAND PRIX Foreword by Jack Burnicle

Today sees the return to Britain's most rugged circuit, of the World's finest 250 cc motocross riders. And leader of the pack is once again the majestic Suzuki-mounted Belgian Georges Jobé.

After becoming the youngest-ever World Champion in 1980, at the age of nineteen, Jobé has struck trouble for the past two years. He says 1983 will be different, and arrives at Hawkstone Park having dominated the opening three rounds of the series.

Jobé's compatriots Johan Martens and Jean-Claude Laquaye have also hit good early-season form. Moustachioed twenty-two year-old Martens, newly signed by Yamaha for 1983, has been the only man so far to present Jobé with any real opposition. And don't be deceived by that 'Luxembourg' tag! Johan is a spectacular **Belgian**, noted for his performance in sand, so watch for him on his first visit to Hawkstone today.

Veteran Laquaye is mounted on a 1982 factory Honda which he rides with ferocious determination. During the first three rounds, he was the only man to beat Jobé when he took a second moto victory in Spain.

By contrast, the man who beat Jobé to the title last year, Yamaha's explosive Californian Danny LaPorte, has suffered early season problems and not yet matched the Belgian's searing pace. Twenty-six year-old 'Danny the Door' lay a disappointing — and disappointed — fourth after three GPs, but expect fireworks on one of his favourite European tracks. Remember he won here on his first visit last year after an epic tussle with Dutch Champion Kees van der Ven (KTM). Also a victim of early season misfortune, the modest Dutchman will be looking to repeat his victory here in 1981!

The West German Honda duo of Arno Drechsel and Rolf Dieffenbach, riding 1982 American works bikes, should also feature strongly. Arno, actually an Italian studying in Stuttgart, has begun to settle down into an accomplished rider after two wild seasons. He is probably even taller than the massive thrity-one year-old Rolf who, when he is good, is very, very good, but when he is bad he is awful!

Taller than both, the gigantic Austrian Heinz Kinigadner (KTM) has been hindered by a right arm broken earlier this season. Heinz crashed out of each race on the first lap here last year. He'll probably do a lot better today.

Other stern foreign opposition should include sand-loving Dutchmen Henk van Mierlo, Bennie Wilken and Gert van Doorn, Finns Matti Tarkkonen and Erkki Sundstrom, Dane Soren Mortensen, Swedes Magnus Nyberg and Magnus Johansson and Belgium's tiny triple 125 cc World Champion Gaston Rahier, who won the only 125 grand prix ever held at Hawkstone back in 1976.

The home contingent is led by a pair of talented youngsters, twenty-two year-old Dave Watson (Yamaha) and twenty year-old Jem Whatley (Suzuki) Last year Watson finished a dogged third here while Whatley headed the first race for a lap. Jem has an identical works bike to Jobé and is already occasionally close to equalling the maestro's speed. Both he and Dave will be right in there.

The third Briton regularly contesting the world series is Ulsterman Stephen Russell (Suzuki), a close boyhood friend and present housemate of Watson's. Other stimulating British interest comes in the form of veteran local Staffordshire heroes Roger Harvey (Yamaha) and Rob Hooper (Armstrong) and Honda UK hotshots Paul Hunt and Perry Leask.

Give them all the encouragement you can muster — the more noise the better. Let's match the Continental fans for a change!

Good luck to them all and have a cracking day!

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
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

Spot the deliberate mistake! Kees van der Ven is amused by the 1982 British (2)50 cc G.P. Trophy


