

NOYCE TO FACE THE RED ARMY.

By NICK HARRIS (Motor Cycle News).

Welcome to Hawkstone Park for the Girling Grand Prix, the British round of the World 250 c.c. Moto-Cross Championship. What an exciting prospect the afternoon promises with riders from all over the globe battling over Britain's most famous and tortuous Moto-Cross circuit.

The two riders British fans cannot wait to see in action are the formidable red army duo of Gennady Moisseev and Vladimir Kavinov.

The pair who both ride Austrian K.T.M. machinery are dominating this year's 250 c.c. World Championship, with only three rounds remaining Moisseev has scored an incredible 163 points and leads his team-mate Kavinov by 20 points.

Moisseev won the title in 1974 and the 28 year old is determined to win back his crown that he lost to Harry Everts in 1975 and Heikki Mikkola a year later.

However as any fan will tell you nothing is certain in the tough demanding world of moto-cross and there are a number of riders who will provide stiff opposition to the championship leaders.

British Champion Graham Noyce who was fourth in last year's 500 c.c. title switches to the 250 c.c. class to meet the Russian challenge head on, the blonde 20 year old flyer from Eastleigh has missed four 500 c.c. Grand Prix's with knee trouble but is now fully fit and raring to keep the Union Jack flying on his homeground.

Further hopes of success rest on the shoulders of three regular grand prix competitors. Nineteen year old Neil Hudson from Bristol has been achieving some consistant results riding his Maico in his first season of grand prix racing. Rob Hooper (Husqvarna) and Geoff Mayes (Kawasaki) have not found the going quite so easy. However the situation of riding in Britain in front of the home crowd must be just the tonic to start them on the road to success.

They will be backed by Welshman Andy Roberton who is in tremendous form on his Spanish Montesa machine, former British Champion Bryan Wade and young Steven Beamish on their Suzuki's and Cheshire star Pete Mathia and Maico mounted Vaughan Semmens.

Former champion Harry Everts switched from Puch to Spanish Bultaco machinery at the beginning of the season and has already adapted well to his new mount and currently holds third place in the table.

Born in 1952 the Belgian star started riding when he was 16 and he is receiving full support from the Bultaco factory including the services of ace moto-cross mechanic "Rubio" Flores.

Montesa mounted Raymond Boven from Belgium won the opening grand prix in Spain but has since faded slightly from the scene although he can never be discounted.

Swedish star Torleif Hansen missed the opening championship round but has since been a regular points scorer on his Kawasaki—watch this man for he is often called the "Cassius Clay" of moto-cross because of his great optimism and flamboyant riding style.

The Czechoslovakian pair of Jaroslav Falta and Antonin Barborovsky are always in the action and Falta who missed most of the 1975 season when he was tipped as a future world champion currently holds sixth place in the table.

Whatever the outcome the action is sure to be fast and furious so take up your vantage points, wave your Union Jack's and enjoy the spectacle of the World's top Moto-Cross riders in action.
