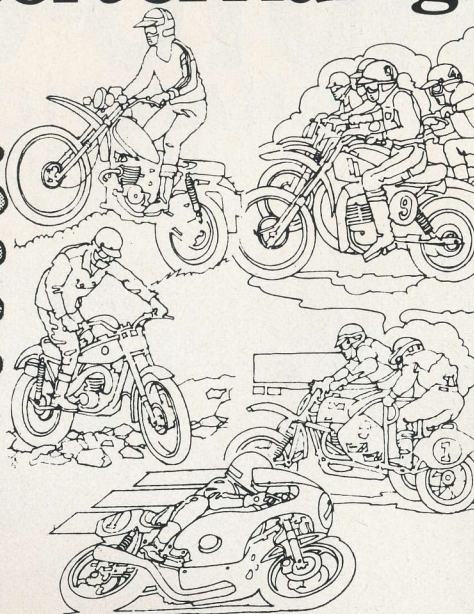
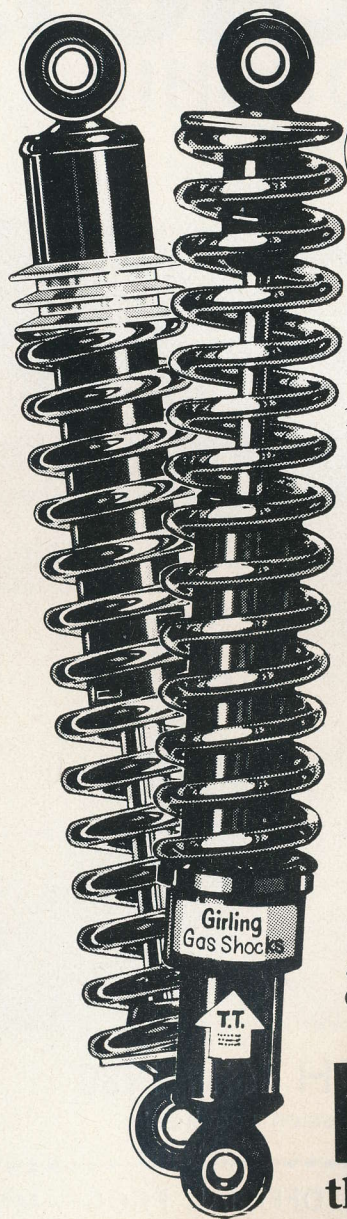

Red Flag Danger. All machines stop.

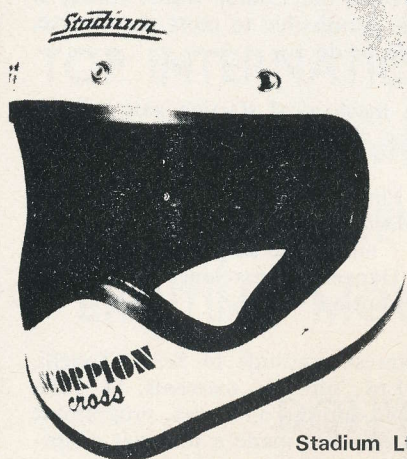

BRITISH MOTO-CROSS CHAMPIONSHIP

Foreword by Alex Hodgkinson (Trials and Motocross News)

It is only fitting that Graham Noyce, Britain's first world motocross champion for fourteen years, should begin the defence of his British title at the home of British motocross, Hawkstone Park.

After a winter operation on the knee which he damaged whilst racing for Britain last September, Graham has undertaken a strenuous training programme in Sweden, here at Hawkstone and with the paras at Aldershot before racing abroad for the last three weeks.

Not only will today's meeting be his first appearance of the year in this country but also the first chance that British fans have had to see the new single shock 'Pro-Link' Honda.

Graham's main challenger in his quest for a fifth successive British title should be Neil Hudson, runner-up to Graham for the second time last year and also second in the world 250 series.

At the time of writing these notes it was not known whether Neil would be riding a German Maico machine or if he would be making his British debut on a Yamaha.

He will be anxious, along with other 250 Grand Prix contenders Vaughan Semmens, Rob Hooper and Billy Aldridge, to get practice in today as the British round of the world championship will be run here on June 22nd.

Britain's other world championship contenders this year are Geoff Mayes, Steve Beamish and Pete Mathia in the 500 class; Geoff in particular is expected to do well today after winning here on New Years Day.

Old favourites like Vic Allan, the last man apart from Noyce to win a British title, and the four-stroke enthusiast's hero Bob Wright are sure to be well in the fore but keep an eye on the top youngsters from last year's qualifying championship, Kawasaki's Dave Thorpe and Husqvarna's Perry Leask.

European amateur champion Gary Evans hopes to take over Thorpe's mantle in the qualifying races but other favourites for honours are Kevin Ruddock, riding Graham Noyce's 1979 machine, and Neil Hudson's younger brother Gary.

Today is just the first of eight rounds throughout the country but a good start is the aim of all the stars. Enjoy your day's racing and don't forget to note June 22nd in your diary — that is the day that the stars of world motocross are here at Hawkstone for the British Grand Prix.
