A TRIBUTE

Cambridge is not a city I know very well and last October I found myself lost in its suburbs. My habitual reluctance to ask the way was breaking down when I spotted a scooter, enamelled in a shade of blue appropriate to the University, propped at the kerbside near a police telephone box. Alongside stood a middle-aged, reliable-looking constable: I pulled up. "Good morning," I said. "Could you direct me to the Cambridge crematorium?" Politely and explicitly he routed me and then added, "You'll be going to Brian Stonebridge's funeral . . . such a pity, just when he was beginning to do so well in business. We thought a lot of him round these parts."

We all thought a lot of Brian—around all parts of the country. Those who knew him by watching from the sidelines loved him like a brother for his dashing, uniquely relaxed, nonchalant style of riding. Those who claimed his personal friendship valued it highly, for although his mien was generally quiet and thoughtful, he was so completely *genuine*.

In fact, he was a man of striking contrasts. His apparently carefree riding technique, plus his generally casual appearance—shirt tail often flying in the breeze—could lead the beholder to believe that here was a young man for whom there were few serious problems. Actually, of course, this was far from being so, for Brian took his chosen sport very seriously indeed.

The seemingly off-hand way in which he handled his machine was entirely misleading—as all who rode against him will confirm. He always rode hard and fast, but he always had his tactics pre-planned and cut and dried. Machine-wise he was almost fanatically particular: I never saw him ride a mount that was not beautifully prepared for the job it had to do.

His talents as a development technician were channelled into business rather late in his career, but during his unhappily curtailed and comparatively brief term of experience in the Greeves experimental shop, he left no doubt as to his ability as a motorcycle engineer.

We meet, therefore, today to honour the memory of a fine type of motorcycling sportsman—a rider who knew how to get what he needed from his steed and was at all times its complete master. Such men are the backbone of our game, and among them Brian was one of the best.


