



# THE INTERNATIONAL MOTO-GROSS GRAND PRIX OF GREAT BRITAIN

is the sixth of the races to decide the World Championship. There are nine meetings—each held in a different country—this year. Races have already taken place in Austria, France, Sweden, Italy and West Germany and the remaining Grand Prix will take place in Holland (July 24th), Belgium (August 7th) and Luxembourg (August 14th).

Eight points are awarded for a win, six points for second place, four points, three points, two points and one point go to riders gaining 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th places respectively.

Unfortunately we are unable to give you the Championship table to date owing to the fact that this programme had to go to press before the West German Grand Prix had taken place. This information will come to you today over the Public Address system. The position of riders after the Italian Grand Prix, held on June 12th, was as follows:

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
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
