He filled many posts in that long period and among those, we shall remember most that he was Chairman of the Club from 1948 to 1964, and then President until his retirement.


Norman

The 1973 (Golden Jubilee) Manx Grand Prix

During T.T. Week last year I was approached by senior officials of the Manx Motor Cycle Club and asked whether I would consent to come over to the Island again in September as the Guest of Honour at the Golden Jubilee Manx Grand Prix.

This was for me at one and the same time a great honour and a terrific shock—on an earlier occasion the Guest of Honour had been in my recollection the late Lord Brabazon of Tara and not even my most generous and most flattering friends would equate me in any sphere with the great "Brab." That made me diffident about accepting and, furthermore, I was already committed to being in Poland in the early part of Manx Week, and I must be at the "Bemrose Trial" on the Saturday. The Manx officials listened to my story with great sympathy (?) said "Yes, we quite see your difficulty, we shall expect you, and thank you very much for accepting."

As a consequence my wife Marjorie and I flew to the Island on the Wednesday, unfortunately missing two exciting races including the late Phil Haslam's wonderful "Junior" victory at 99.420 m.p.h. to say nothing of his electrifying second lap at 103.150 m.p.h. Dave Arnold's success in the Lightweight Race had also included both lap speed and race speed records. From the moment of our arrival at Ronaldsway to the time we left we were most splendidly looked after by the Manx M.C.C. and their hospitality was unbounded. Of course, this was not my first experience of their excellent organisation—for several years I was one of the two ACU Stewards appointed to the Manx Grand Prix but, more important, as Chairman of the T.T. Races for 26 years I enjoyed throughout that period enormous support from the Manx Motor Cycle Club both in the preparation for and the running of the T.T. Races.

Then came for me the highlight of the week—Senior Manx Day! This was an RAF triumph with Paddy Reid riding a spdendid race to win the Trophy and the RAF Motor Sport Association Team (John Goodall, Paddy Reid and once more Dave Arnold) carrying off the Club Team prize. Not many fans can have attended more Prize Presentations, Manx Grand Prix and Tourist Trophy, than I have, but no-one has ever enjoyed one more than I did that Senior night. Why? DENIS PARKINSON

Our Guest of Honour

DENIS PARKINSON was born in Wakefield in June, 1915 and, in the intervals between his visits to the Isle of Man (130 to date), has lived in Wakefield ever since.

He first rode in the Manx Grand Prix in September, 1932. The regulations stated then, as they do now, that "every entrant-driver shall be a male person OVER the age of 18 years" and it is certain that D. Parkinson must have "exaggerated" his age on his entry form because he certainly was not 18.

He finished in both Junior and Senior Races riding a 350 c.c. machine in each and that was a good start for a juvenile.

In 1933 he again finished in both Races. He rode in 1934 and 1935 without achieving any notable success, and then apparently decided that his apprentice days were over. At that time there was in the Junior Race a race within a race, inasmuch as there was a special class for "Lightweight" or 250 c.c. machines. Denis proceeded to make this class his own private property, and he won the "Lightweight" three times in succession — 1936, 1937 and 1938; in 1937 and 1938 his speed on the 250 c.c. machine was so high that he actually won Junior Race Replicas as well as his "Lightweight" Reps. He also rode in the Senior Race of 1937, finished thirteenth and got another Replica, making a total of three in one year; nobody had ever done that before, no one has done it since and no one now can do it.

There was no race in 1939 and after the war in 1946 back came Denis and finished third in the Junior and fourth in the Senior. He won the Junior Race in 1948 and in the next three years was respectively fourth, third and eighth in the Senior Races. In 1953 he won the Senior Race at record speed and became the first man ever to do a lap at 90 m.p.h. in the Manx Grand Prix.

In practising and Races he has lapped the T.T. Course 388 times — a distance of 14,647 miles — he made record laps four times, has twice been a member of a winning team and has won fifteen replicas.

Denis also won the Junior Clubman's T.T. Race and had innumerable successes on short circuits and has won, in all, over 600 awards.

When he retired from racing, he devoted himself to "helping." He has been a Travelling Marshal in the Manx Grand Prix, has "commentated" at 178 scrambles for ITV, worked on BBC broadcasts of the T.T. and Manx Grand Prix for very many years and is at present Chairman of the A.C.U. Publicity Sub-Committee.

We are very proud to have him as our Guest of Honour and we hope that he will enjoy being with us as much as we will enjoy having him at the scene of his many successes.

A NEW ASSOCIATION

For a considerable number of years there has been in existence a flourishing T.T. Riders' Association, membership of which is open to all who have ridden in the T.T. Races.

The Association hold its Annual General Meeting in the Isle of Man in T.T. Week and has a marquee behind the Grandstand where members can meet, have something to eat and drink and talk of times past.

The Manx Motor Cycle Club has long wished that there was a similar association for those who have ridden in the September Races.

We suspect that a number of former M.G.P. riders come to the Island every year to watch the races but few of them call at the Race Office and make themselves known to us.

This is a matter for regret because we are always glad to see our "Old Boys" and it is possible that modesty prevents some of them calling.

It does now seem that things may be better in the future.

A large number of "old" riders came to the Island for the Jubilee M.G.P. last year and as a result of much talk it is now intended to form a Manx Grand Prix Riders' Association. The first meeting of those interested in becoming members will be held at the Woodbourne Hotel, Alexander Drive, Douglas, at 11.30 a.m. on Sunday, 1st September.

A pilot committee consisting of Wilf Harding, Harold Rowell, Jack Wood and Bob Dowty have drafted rules for consideration and among many distinguished former riders who have already said they want to be members are Austin Munks, Freddie Frith, Bob Foster and Geoff Duke.

Membership is open to anyone who has been a qualified starter in any Amateur T.T., Manx Grand Prix or associated race (Newcomers' or Snaefell) promoted by the M.M.C.C. If you want to be a member (this applies to the 1974 entry) but cannot attend the meeting, write to Bob Dowty at Island Garages, 45 Buck's Road, Douglas, or telephone to Bob or Jack Wood at Douglas 3781.

The Committee of the M.M.C.C. would like it to be known that it heartily approves and welcomes this new Association.

It may well be that we can be of some help—if so, that help will be forthcoming and we give this splendid venture our unqualified blessing and our very best wishes for its success. We are sure that the design is first class—may the production be smooth and the finished product fast and very reliable.

AWARDS

The following awards are offered for competition in the Manx Grand Prix Races for 1973:—

(a) THE MANX GRAND PRIX TROPHY to the winner of the Senior Race; (b) THE JUNIOR MANX GRAND PRIX TROPHY to the winner of the Junior Race; (c) THE LIGHTWEIGHT MANX GRAND PRIX TROPHY to the winner of the Lightweight Race; (d) THE NEWCOMERS SENIOR TROPHY to the newcomer making in the Senior Race the most meritorious performance in the opinion of the Club Committee; (e) THE NEWCOMERS JUNIOR TROPHY to the newcomer making in the Junior Race the most meritorious performance in the opinion of the Club Committee; (f) THE NEWCOMERS LIGHTWEIGHT TROPHY to the newcomer making in the Lightweight Race the most meritorious performance in the opinion of the Club Committee; (g) THE MANX GRAND PRIX CLUB TEAM TROPHY to the club having the winning team in the Senior Race; (h) THE MANX GRAND PRIX JUNIOR CLUB TEAM TROPHY to the club having the winning team in the Junior Race; (i) THE MANX GRAND PRIX LIGHTWEIGHT CLUB TEAM TROPHY to the club having the winning team in the Lightweight Race; (j) A TROPHY to the driver making the fastest lap in the Senior Race; (k) A TROPHY to the driver making the fastest lap in the Junior Race; (1) A TROPHY to the driver making the fastest lap in the Lightweight Race; (m) THE LORD WAKEFIELD CUP to the driver making the best overall performance in the opinion of the Club Committee in the Junior and/or Senior Race who is not a winner; (n) THE LADY HILL ROSE BOWL to the driver who is a local resident making the most meritorious performance during the meeting in the opinion of the Club Committee.

In accepting the above trophies, recipients undertake to return them to the Club within one year, and not less than 30 days before the next Manx Grand Prix Races.

A SILVER-PLATED REPLICA of the Manx Grand Prix Trophy will be awarded to the winners in the Senior, Junior and Lightweight Races respectively. New-style replicas of the Manx Grand Prix Trophy will be awarded to those who finish within eleven-tenths of the time taken by the respective winners.

Each member of the winning team in each race will receive an award.

Drivers eligible for the Newcomers' Trophies shall be those who have not previously practised for or competed in any motor-cycle event run over the T.T. Mountain Course.

Finishing Plaques will be awarded to drivers who complete the race in compliance with the Regulations but fail to qualify for any of the premier awards or replicas.

To All Competitors . . .

1,000

One thousand — that is approximately the number of individual riders who wanted to ride on the T.T. course this year and we, the members of the Manx Motor Cycle Club Committee, feel that we are doing a very worthwhile voluntary job organising an event in which 456 of the above number wanted to ride. Unfortunately, we cannot accept all the applications we receive because of the limited number we can reasonably start in each race. We do apologise, most sincerely, to those riders whose entries have not been accepted this year and assure them that refusing entries is an extremely arduous and depressing task for us.

Now, a few words to our competitors this year. Firstly, on behalf of us all, congratulations on being accepted. We sincerely hope that you will arrive on the Island full of commonsense having read the regulations carefully. We hope you fully understand them, in particular what the flag signals mean, what keeping inside the white line in front of the pits means at the end of your practice session, and lastly, but by no means least, we ask you to have your machine fully fuelled and oiled prior to coming to the weigh-in.

Your machine will be examined prior to each practice session by the Scrutineers. Please ensure that it is meticulously prepared, for each session as well as for the races, not to please the Scrutineers, but for your own and other's safety. When you go out on the closed road do not try racing or even riding quickly until you know exactly where you are going and what you are doing, be much more cautious in wet and damp conditions and give every consideration to your fellow competitors, in particular, the newcomers who will be wearing white waistcoats during the practice sessions for identification purposes.

We, the Committee members, are here to help you. The hundreds of Manx Motor Cycle Club members and voluntary marshals will help you, the Travelling Marshals will help you. If you are in any doubt about anything to do with the Manx Grand Prix, no matter how small your problem, please tell us about it.

Finally, the basic rule of racing a motor-cycle successfully is on its wheels, between the hedges.

Thank you for coming, enjoy yourselves and the very best of luck to you all.

Whilst the land adjoining the circuit is private and therefore under the jurisdiction of the landowner, certain areas where accidents are most likely are designated prohibited areas and this is done FOR YOUR SAFETY. Moreover the normal laws of trespass shall apply.

Accidents can, however, happen anywhere and THE TOPS OF WALLS, BANKS and HEDGES ARE PLACES OF RELATIVELY GREATER DANGER.

You are reminded that with the exception of certain crossing points between races under the direction of Police Constables all parts are closed and it is an OFFENCE IN LAW to be on them.

Finally, obey the instructions of Police Constables and Marshals at all times. Their concern is your safety.

Remember if an accident happens near you all the foregoing still holds true. The Police and Officials are experienced in emergencies and your presence in an area of danger, however well meant, could turn a minor accident into something far worse.

THE HELICOPTER

"Motor Racing" warning notices say, "is potentially dangerous," and from time to time it produces accidents. When an accident occurs the speed with which a casualty can be removed to hospital is often crucial and for this reason a helicopter ambulance is a very important and valuable part of our rescue services.








Quarter Bridge (sharp right-hand bend) 1½ miles

Braddan Bridge (fast S-bends) 1³/₄ miles

Union Mills (fast bends) 2½ miles

Glen Vine (fast straight) nearly 4 miles

Crosby Village (fast straight) 4³/₄ miles

Ballacraine (sharp right-hand turn) 7½ miles

Ballig Bridge (now fast short straight (8 miles)

Laurel Bank (fast right-hand turn) 83 miles

Cronk-y-Voddy (very fast straight and slight switchback) 10³ miles

Barregarroo (fast bends) 12½ miles

Kirk Michael (fast right-hand turn) near 14th milestone

Ballaugh Bridge (fast jump and turn) 17 miles

Sulby Cross-roads (fast straight) 19 miles

Sulby Bridge (fast right-hand turn) 193 miles

Glentramman (fast bends) 22 miles Up Douglas Quay; up Railway Station Hill; bear left along Peel Road past Power Station.

As for Quarter Bridge but turn left over railway lines at Power Station; first right and proceed to "Halt" sign at Spring Valley; turn right, then first left and proceed along Saddle Road to end; turn right down hill to Braddan Church and to an enclosure.

As for Quarter Bridge but turn left up the hill at the "Halt" sign at Spring Valley; at top of hill turn right to Braaid. Turn right at second right and down narrow road (good view) to Union Mills. Or from Braddan Bridge turn left at end of Saddle Road up hill; turn right on the Braaid road; turn first right.

As for Union Mills, but continue to turn right to Braaid Chapel and then turn right down hill, and right at bottom and over railway lines.

As for Glen Vine to Braaid but straight on past Braaid Chapel and turn right at next cross-roads; straight on and down School Hill (very steep) over railway lines.

As for Crosby Village but after passing Braaid Chapel keep straight on down hill to Eairy Dam; ignore hairpin bend and keep right along edge of lake (twisty narrow road) and down second left hill to "Halt" sign at Hope Corner; turn right and straight on to Ballacraine.

As for Ballacraine to Hope Corner then straight over cross-roads to "Halt" sign in St. John's Village opposite Tynwald Hill; straight over cross-roads down hill behind Tynwald Hill (narrow and twisting), over river, narrow stone bridge, and up hill to "T" junction; turn right and proceed to Ballig.

As for Ballig Bridge, but turn left at "T" junction; first right (Switch-back Road) at top of hill turn right along narrow road; after approximately half a mile at very sharp turn right, leave vehicle and walk down hill to course. (Narrow lane to be kept clear for ambulance).

As for Ballig but turn left at "T" junction then turn right to Switch-back Road; then either turn right at top of hill as for Laurel Bank and proceed to cross-roads and turn right for course. Or proceed to end of Switch-back Road to "Halt" sign; turn right along coast road towards Kirk Michael Village, turn first right on hill and proceed to course.

As for Cronk-y-Voddy but proceed along coast road towards Kirk Michael, turn right after sudden drop down to Glen Mooar (railway viaduct on right) and proceed to course.

As for Barregarroo cross-roads, but when on coast road proceed to Kirk Michael.

PLACES OUTSIDE THE COURSE BETWEEN BALLAUGH — RAMSEY — DOUGLAS

As for Sulby cross-roads, but straight on over Sandygate cross-roads, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, straight over cross-roads, then left around Old Ballaugh Church (twisted gate pillars), bear right, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to course past Ballaugh New Church and over railway crossing.

As for Sulby Bridge, but instead of turning left at St. Jude's, straight over cross-roads, and turn left at Sandygate cross-roads (signposted), two miles to course.

Turn left opposite road into Ramsey Cottage Hospital as for Milntown and Glentramman, but take fourth left at St. Jude's cross-roads (after passing St. Jude's Church).

Through Ramsey, across stone bridge at top of harbour (turn right for Mooragh Park), straight on, turn left opposite road into Ramsey Cottage Hospital, then third left (first after Cronk Ruagh Hospital) to cross river by ford.

Brandywell Road (fast left-hand turn) 31½ miles (fast right-hand corner), May Hill (fast right-hand corner), Parliament Square (slow right-hand and left-hand turns) — approximately $23\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

As for Waterworks. But proceed as far as possible along narrow road then on foot to the end.

Along main road Douglas to Ramsey. When dropping down into Ramsey and at electric railway crossing turn left up narrow road running along-side railway line. Leave vehicle on side of road and walk up through the woods to the course.

Along main road from Douglas towards Ramsey; $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles beyond Glen Mona Hotel turn left up very narrow road opposite right-hand turn to Maughold. This very narrow road is really only suitable for motor-cycles, as other vehicles would block the road for ambulance service.

To Laxey Manx Electric Railway Station. Then on electric car to course.

Motor-cycles only. As for Creg-ny-Baa, but turn right at "T" junction then left along narrow twisty road; after three-quarters of a mile and after sharp rise with sharp left-hand hairpin straight on up track (road bears right) past Glen Roy Farm to course. (Please close gate at farm).

Proceed to and through Onchan Village on the main road; down to White-bridge and up opposite side, at top turn left and after $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles turn left at "T" junction.

As for Signpost Corner but straight on past "Manx Arms" turning left at third left (after Commissioners' Offices) up School Road, right at top of hill, past Dowty factory, keeping to main road.

Along Douglas Promenade and up Summer Hill to "Halt" sign at Main Road in Onchan Village; turn right then left after "Manx Arms" up hill to course.

Along Promenade and up Summer Hill (near Derby Castle); turn left near top of hill and up to "Halt" sign; turn left.

PLACES INSIDE THE COURSE ACCESSIBLE ONE WITH ANOTHER WHILE ROADS ARE CLOSED

From top of Bray Hill along Ballanard Road, left at cross roads downhill to Tromode, bear slightly right over stone bridge and then very slightly left up hill, at "Halt" sign at "T" junction turn left down past Braddan School.

As for Braddan Bridge, but at "Halt" sign at "T" junction turn right up hill and past Infirmaries; turn left at cross-roads downhill to course.

As for Union Mills, but at the last cross-roads, straight on; bear left at next "T" junction up slight hill; first left down twisty road (railings on junction).

As for Glenvine but keep on main road, continuing down steep hill to Crosby.

As for Union Mills, but straight over the last cross-roads, turn right up Baldwin Valley; along left-hand side of the Douglas Reservoir; up hill and down to Brandywell Cottage, keep left down road; after "S" bends take very sharp turning left (notice re Sartfield Cafe), proceed cautiously along very narrow winding road downhill through farm and to course.

As for Cronk-y-Voddy, but at notice for Sartfield Cafe keep straight on down to course.

As for Brandywell Road end (Mountain Road), but on reaching Brandywell Cottage and turning right immediately after crossing cattle grid, turn left down narrow road, opening and closing the gates as required, dropping down into Ballaugh Glen. At bottom of "T" junction turn right down glen road to course.

As for Cronk-y-Voddy, but on reaching Brandywell Cottage turn right, over cattle grid and proceed 3½ miles to course.




