Well behind the safety ropes folks, for today's title clashes are going to be real crackers from start to finish.

Both forty minute races, which are the seventh and eighth of the ten round series are extremely vital for John Banks, who held the title in 1971, reigning supremo Bryan Wade, Andy Roberton, and Malcolm Davis, as with only two further rounds, in Essex, in September, to come, only they have a real chance of landing the title.

After winning the two previous rounds at the National Kidston scramble near Builth Wells last month, "Big John" Banks from Bury St Edmunds in Suffolk, is an odds on favourite.

He has led the title chase right from the opening rounds at Hawkstone Park in Shropshire, where, although beaten in the first race by Wade, who incidently failed to finish in the second, Banks netted fourteen points to Roberton's ten.

However, on the South Molton clubs tough moorland circuit at North Radworthy in May Wade closed the gap slightly. With Roberton away in Poland taking part in a World championship meeting, Wade got eleven points which hoisted him up to second spot, whilst Roberton dropped to fourth behind Malcolm Davis, who, with two seconds, was top scorer on that memorable day in North Devon where so many fancied stars fell by the wayside through spills and machine trouble. One of the main features of that meeting, to my mind, was the determined riding of one of Britain's bright "new boys" - Bob Wright.

In the second race, run in thick drizzle, Wright lost his oil filler cap in the early laps. Soaked in oil from the chest downwards this tough Northerner battled on to finish a very creditable fifth.

So Banks went to the Kidston with a three point advantage over Wade, and the question on everyone's lips there was could Wade overhaul the four stroke machine exponent? well the result was that Wade, dogged by the knee injury that has laid him low all season, had an off day scoring only nine points whereas Banks was indeed the master winning both rounds with contemptuous ease. Scot Jim Aird, who says that he isn't seriously contesting the title this year because of the travelling involved, upset the form book in a big way getting nine points. Roberton, whose machine seized in the first race grabbed third place in the second, but Malcolm Davis, like his Bultaco team mate Vic Allan left the meeting pointless, which brings us to today's eagerly anticipated encounters. Wade, who has since visited a Leeds knee specialist needs to win both

rounds to stay in tow, but Banks badly wants that title, which also acts as a passport to next years World championship series, and this with Robertson, Davis, and likeable New Zealander Ivan Miller holding third, fourth and fifth positions respectively, and trying to improve on their positions no quarter will be asked or given. Another added incentive is the prize money for the meeting which totals over £600. Of course there are plenty in the all star line up who could really put the cat amongst the pigeons. Aces like Rob Taylor, who always gives of his best, especially at Leighton, AJS development engineer Vic Eastwood on the factory's full blown 500, and colourful Roger Harvey, just to name a few, and of course Bob Wright. Remember his last minute win in the National Wessex scramble at Glastonbury? I reckon that he could repeat that performance today. Another highlight in this real value for money programme is the Rob Walker trophy race, which this year is sponsored by Castrol, and this could produce a few more fireworks as after having won highly paid races at the Kidston, and more recently at the National Cotswold scramble near Stroud, Robertson is hoping to clinch his hat trick, equally his rivals will be trying to stop him. Over to you Mr. Starter.

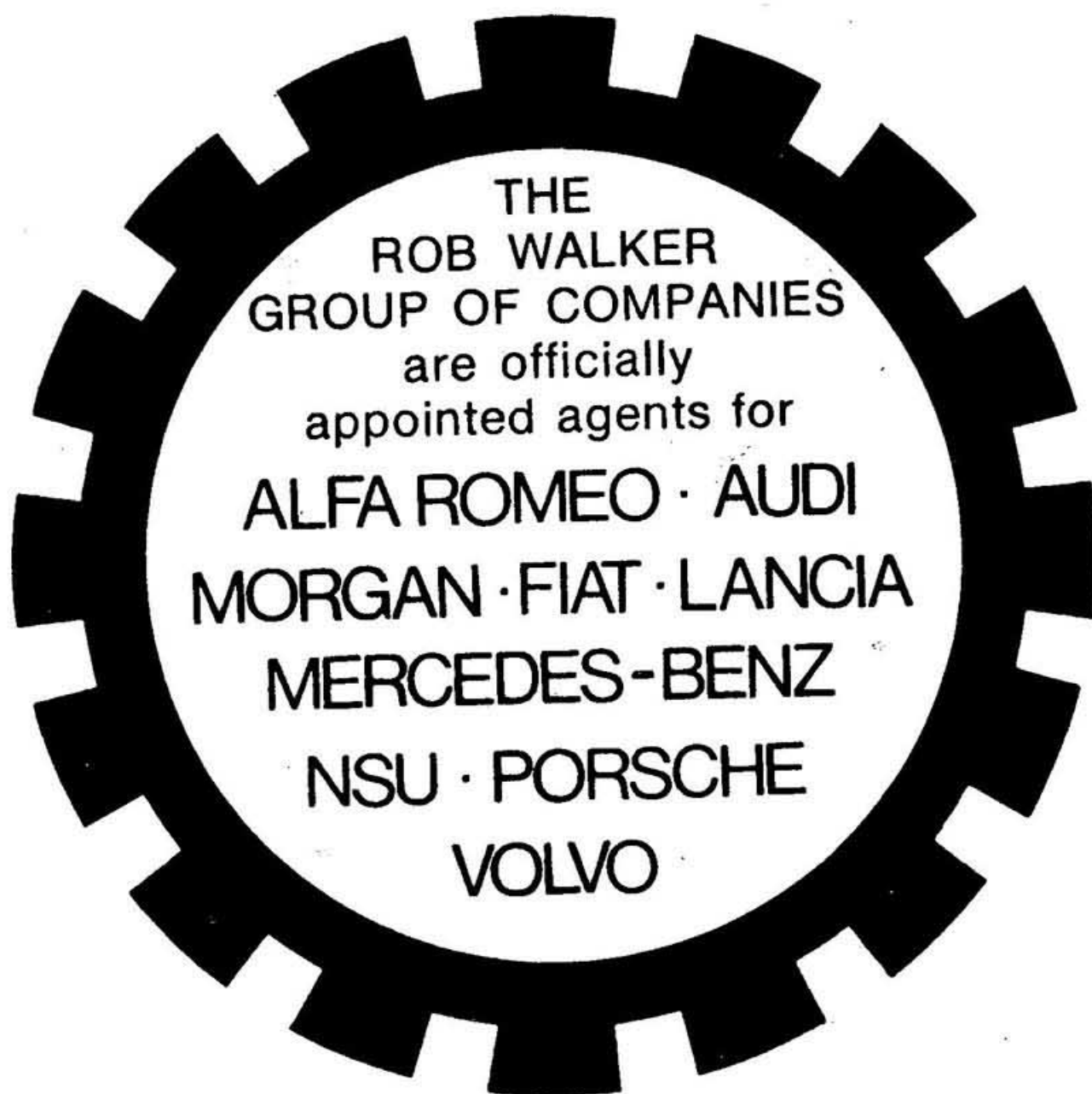
