

Blue/Steady: Another competitor is close.

Blue/Waved: Another competitor is trying to pass. White: Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

Yellow/Steady: Danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down. Yellow/Waved: Great danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down,

be prepared to stop.

Yellow with Red Stripes: Slippery surface ahead. Green: Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.

Red: Stop racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals; (at startline and individual marshals posts) race stopped.

Black/Orange Disc displayed with White number: Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver. call into pits immediately.

Black/White rectangular with White number: Warning to driver that his behaviour (i.e. corner cutting) is suspect and he may be black flagged.

Black display with White number: Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.

Yellow/Black Quartered Flag: On passing the flag at the Start/Finish line, the race leader must slow down significantly (to around 50mph maximum) until the obstruction on the track is clear.

Black/White Chequered: End of race.

CHURCHILL'S 'V FOR V SPORT & VARIETY

Welcome to Lydden Hill for the first of two visits this year from the BRSCC's (British Racing & Sports Car Club) South Eastern Centre. Today's programme features a wide variety of club sport action from V Sport Racing V6s, Super Silhouettes and Southern Saloons & Sports, through Formula Honda single seaters and Southern Formula Ford, to Building Environmental Services BRSCC T-Cars for youngsters between the ages of 14 and 17.

With many of today's races being double-headers, it will be more important than ever to not only get a good finish in race one, but to get a finish full stop! The old motor racing adage that 'to come first, first one must finish' will certainly be the order of the day, and restraint in race one could lead to a healthy haul of championship points by this evening.

Today marks the third round of the somewhat rejuvenated Formula Honda single seaters series, and it's a win apiece so far for Scotland's David Roper and Heathfield's David Scott. So saving, neither will be competing here today, which will play very much into the hands of, particularly, Adam Saward and Louis Hamilton-Smith. Louis, a 19 year-old student from Evesham in Worcestershire, together with his father Simon, do all of the preparation of the car themselves, and bring a real 'family' element to the series. The youngster enjoyed a good string of results in Formula Honda last year, and finally made it to the podium at Donington Park in the very last race of the season. He could well muscle his way there again today. Other drivers showing good form at

the moment include Mark Hosken, a Midlands Fire-fighter, and Mark Poole, a company director from Bedfordshire. Regular competitors will be joined by newcomers Paul Saunders, Len Turner and Dax Ward today, and it will be interesting to see how they perform in this extremely competitive series. Look out also for Formula Honda's first ever female racer in the shape of Jodie Hemming. The 17 year-old Sywell Leisure Sports employee from Earls

Barton in Northamptonshire is a highly competitive racer and could certainly spring a surprise, or two, this afternoon.

New for 2003 is the introduction of a 1000cc Class to the Formula Honda single seater series. Here, last year's front-runner Nigel Reuben will be trying to improve on what has been a disastrous start to his season. A drive shaft failure when leaving the grid at Snetterton was followed by a gearbox failure at Mallory Park whilst in a commanding lead. Things are sure to turn themselves around, and when they do, Nigel will fly. Nigel is joined today by Rob Horsfield, who claimed the two class victories, John Lord, lan Blunt and Bob Couchman (out today in the ex-works Jedi of John Corbyn). Perhaps one of the more interesting aspects of the Formula Honda encounters today, will be to see if any of the 600cc cars can beat the more powerful 1000cc cars around the tight and twisty Lydden Hill lap. We'll know very soon!

More top class single seater action, this afternoon, is assured from the Southern Formula Ford Championship for Kent 1600cc cars. David Jermy in his Van Diemen RF90 has so far been the class act, but last time out at Brands, Colin Johnson in his Revnard 89 pushed the Camberley driver all the way in race one and crossed the line just 0.193 of a second adrift. Johnson followed this highly impressive performance with a DNF in race two, so he'll be all fired-up to take the challenge to Jermy again this afternoon, and remind him that the championship battle's not over yet!

Chris Glazier from Gillingham grabbed a pair of podium finishes at Brands (second and third place finishes), and if being a local counts for anything, then the Medway Swift SC92 mounted runner should feature at the front today. Whatever the outcome of today's two races, the Southern Formula Ford boys know that they need to put a halt to Jermy's winning streak or he's going to be taking the championship spoils to Surrey some time too soon. Switching from single seaters to saloons, and the innovative Building Environmental Services plc BRSCC T-Cars Championship heads to Lydden Hill today for rounds 5 and 6. The championship, now in its fourth season, is open exclusively to 14 to 17 year olds, and has produced many star drivers who have progressed up the motor racing ladder, including Tom Chilton and Tom Boardman in touring cars, Ryan Lewis, Jonathan Kennard and Adam Sharpe in FPA and Matthew Wilson in Formula Renault.

So who will be the next driver to follow in their footsteps? Fifteen year-old Dan Hoy currently leads the series, having taken victory in the four previous rounds. This weekend though expect fireworks with the battle for honours being fought out between four drivers. James Jakes and Simon Walker-Hansell, both in their first full season in the Championship put up a strong challenge at Donington and Brands, so too did Will Bratt, who like Hoy is in his second year in car racing. All are more than capable of taking their first race victories here this afternoon.

Watch out too for Ruth Senior, the Building Environmental Services BRSCC T-Cars Scholarship in association with Karting magazine winner in her first season of car racing. The youngster driver on the grid, and the series' first international competitor, Fredrik Nordstrom (Sweden) will be back in action and will be joined in the Advent Motorsport team by Jonathan Miller, who has hopefully fully recovered from his Brands cold.

Completing the line-up will be Ry Leon, who missed Brands due to karting commitments, but shone at Donington's season opener last month. If today's T-Car action wets the appetite and you fancy having a go yourself, why not check out the T-Cars website at www.t-cars.org.uk Sticking with Saloons, and today sees the Southern Saloon & Sports Car Series (incorporating the Ingear Motorsport Magazine Saloon Car Championship) make its first visit of the year here to Lydden Hill. Today should see the return to the race track of West

Kingdown's Rod Birley (Ford Escort

WRC) after a recent back operation, and there's nothing that the prolific race winner would enjoy more than a victorious return. Certainly, having missed a number of races, Rod will be out to claw back the points deficit to Tony Ryan (Ford Sierra Sapphire), Chris Fulke-Greville (Vauxhall Astra GSR) and Graham Bahr (BMW 2002Tii). Rounding out today's programme are the V Sport Racing V6s and Super Silhouettes. In the VSR V6 Championship Steve Thompson is on a role, but having suffered an aweful first Round at Donington Park, Mike Doble is now playing catch up, and the battle between these two here today will be intense. Scott Booth, who finished third at Donington Park should be right on the pace too, so it could well be a three-way battle at the front. Steve Hall, driving an Audi TT, and Keith White in a VW Corrado share top honours in the new for 2003 Super Silhouette series, and both have every intention of making the break here at

Lydden Hill. Tony Paxman finished third on his maiden appearence at Donington Park and could star here. whilst Jon Frazermand driving a Peugeot 206 enjoys considerable Lydden experience, and will be hoping to put it to good use for a strong podium finish.

The South Eastern Centre of the BRSCC now has a short break before our next meeting which is 'SuperClub 3' at Brands Hatch over the weekend of 14-15th June. The SuperClub package offers amazing spectator entertainment at great value, and with races for Radical BiDuros and Enduros. Caterham Roadsports and the VW Cup. amongst others, it is sure to be a thrilling weekend of motorsporting

The BRSCC trusts that you have a safe, successful and enjoyable day's racing here at Lydden Hill, and we look forward to seeing you at Brands Hatch in 6 weeks time.

Single seat and either left or right hand drive, the cars run on control Avon tyres with a 'live' rear POINT hand drive, the cars run on control Avon tyres with a "live" rear axle and independent front suspension. Utilising either 4 or 5 speed gearboxes, Super Silhouettes are clothed in kevlar GRP bodies resembling road going models. Power comes from normally aspirated 2 litre single or twin overhead cam units based on production engines. Fuel injection is not permitted so all cars run on carburetters. Most of the engines in Super Silhouettes are based on units manufactured by Vauxhall, VW 3 T FIELD JNR and Ford.
