down, be prepared to stop.

Yellow with Red Stripes: Slippery surface ahead.

GARDEN 'T' PARTY

Welcome from the BRSCC SE Centre to our second visit in less than a fortnight, but sadly our final visit to Lydden Hill this year. Our Eurocar meeting on Spring Bank Holiday Monday provided plenty of spectacular action, and with racing on both days this weekend, another bumper feast of motor sport is assured.

Hardy enthusiasts arriving early on Saturday morning may well wonder what is occupying the track for a couple of hours. The answer is BRSCC T-Cars, with the competitors taking part in an exclusive test session. T-Cars spokesman Nick Carter tells explains the background to

"British motorsport has taken a bold step towards the future with the launch by the British Racing and Sports Car Club of its T-Cars initiative, a youth motorsport programme which for the first time sees drivers as young as 14 licensed to race on international-class circuits.

Featuring ultra-safe purpose-designed training cars capable of speeds approaching 100mph, intensive track tuition and, most significantly, training under real race conditions, T-Cars is a ground-breaking project, which not only provides an entirely new path into motorsport but also enjoys the full backing of the UK's racing governing body, the Motor Sports Association.

Safety is the key theme of every aspect of T-Cars. Rather than adapt an existing road or racing car and risk any compromise in safety, the BRSCC commissioned its own chassis from Eurocar builder SHP Motorsport. The 1.6-litre T-Car has one of the most intricate and comprehensive safety cages ever seen, plus a host of other safety-related features. T-Cars is initially open to drivers aged between 14 and

Candidates undergo an assessment of basic driving skills in a road car and progress via tuition from experienced race instructors to taking the official ARDS (Association of Racing Drivers Schools) test in a T-Car. Only if they pass this standard examination - to the same level as that required of an adult candidate - have they the option of buying into the full T-Cars programme.

With three T-Cars meetings held already this season (at Castle Combe, Cadwell Park and Donington Park) the battle for honours has been fairly evenly solit between three 15-year-old drivers. At Combe in April Somerset's Ben Reeves drove away with overall honours, he and Stuart Hall (Essex) sharing the race wins. Reeves and Hall once more did the winning at Cadwell in May, this time with Hall, son of BTCC racer Pete, claiming overall honours. A fortnight ago it was Tom Kimber-Smith's turn to claim the limelight. Having finished all four of the Combe and Cadwell races in second place, he stepped on to the top step of the podium at Donington with an emphatic double victory."

After the morning test session, the T-Cars have a 15 minute qualifying session, and then take to the track for no less than three races during the course of the weekend. Will we see one driver dominate, or will the honours be spread about. Perhaps there will be a new name in the frame come Sunday afternoon.

Saturday's first race is for the BRSCC Ford Saloon Car Challenge, a multi-class event for all manner of modified Ford saloons. Escorts of various vintages battle with Fiestas and Sapphires, with Julie Hassell's Ka representing the more modern variants, Expect Bob Ross to be at the sharp end of the race, with Tim Watson nipping at the heels of larger machinery. Sunday's second outing sees the cars line up for Race

More Ford machinery can be found lining up for Race Two, with the BRSCC Ford Si Challenge. Featuring Fiestas that were formerly on the BTCC support race package, the Challenge is one of the most keenly-fought series in UK motorsport. Jason Hughes has done a fair amount of winning, but at the time of writing had yet to submit an entry. Canterbury's Peter Daniels is a stalwart of the category, and a win at his local track would be a great bonus, David Willoughby and Roger Mahoney should not be discounted. Race 16 sees the cars return for their second

After two tin-top races, Race Three sees the weekend's first single-seater action, with a 12-lapper for the BRSCC Super Classic Formula Ford Championship, which caters for some of the more recent Formula Ford models, solit by year of manufacture. Revnards and Van Diemens predominate, so Michael Valentine's Elden and Rui Santos's Swift provide welcome variety. Graham Unwin's Class B Reynard FF89 heads the points chase, but Richard Ellis could close the gap if he lines up on the grid. Sunday's second race could see a complete change in positions after the weekend.

After saloons and single-seaters, it's the turn of sports cars for Race Four, with the First National Global GT Lights. These Yamaha-engined 'pocket rockets' are another category that provides fiercely competitive action. Great Totham's Dave Mountain won the first three rounds, but has had to give best to John Carding in the last two rounds. These two lead the championship ahead of Richard Cottrill, whose consistent finishing has earned him third. Tracy Hathaway scored a second at Snetterton's season opener, her best-ever result. Jim Cammack appears to have overcome early-season problems, so a victory may be just round the corner.

Race Five is the turn of the Janspeed Road Saloons, another of the BRSCC's most popular and enduring championships. Classes A & C are combined for this event, with the Simons Taylor and Turner likely to be locked in combat in their Honda Civics at the head of Class A. Tim Dawson's Golf GTi lies in wait to profit from any mistakes. Richard Jones' Fiesta starts favourite for Class C.

After the first T-Car sortie, it's the turn of single-seaters again with the first of two rounds for the Kent County Formula Ford championship. With entries from Zetec-engined cars a little thin on the ground, they are combined with the Kent-engined runners. Dave Hardisty's Van Diemen should secure overall victory, but the chase for Kent Class points is likely to feature Chris Pennington and Matt Wood, with Christian Ackerstrom

Saturday's action classes with the 'B' Class race for the Janspeed Road Saloon Championship Gareth Porter's Peugeot's tally of tow wins, plus two second place with fastest lap, has propelled him to the top of the table. Victory at Snetterton on Spring Bank Holiday Monday went to John Strickland's similar car, but with a win at Castle Combe his only other score, he languishes in the points. Henry Rice is the other race winner and he will want to repeat his opening round success.

All the cars that race on Saturday have another outing on Sunday, and there's the bonus of two extra events, with a round of the BRSCC/ SEMSEC Sports & Saloon Car Series and a race for the SEMSEC Closed Wheel King of Lydden Trophy. Entry details are still to be confirmed, but expect Peter Thurston's Rover-engined Escort to be one of the leading Class B runners. Rod Birley will probably be out in an Escort WRC, but could call on his Honda Prelude if he has any problems. The cars will be familiar to Lydden regulars, and when they raced at Brands Hatch earlier in the year, provided some cracking action.

Well, that's 19 races previewed in a single page. Fortunately the on-track entertainment will last somewhat longer. The Garden of England Raceday promises to produce some prize-winning specimens. Let's hope the weather treats us well, and we have a safe and enjoyable weekend's motor sport.

After this weekend, the BRSCC South Eastern Centre returns to its more familiar Brands Hatch base for a two day meeting. Further details of this, and other BRSCC SE Centre meetings can be found elsewhere in this programme or by accessing our website: http://www.brsccse.co.uk.


