

FIAG SIGNALS

Blue/Steady: Another competitor is close.

Blue/Waved: Another competitor is trying to pass. White: Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

Yellow/Steady: Danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down. Yellow/Waved: Great danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down,

be prepared to stop.

Yellow with Red Stripes: Slippery surface ahead. Green: Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.

Red: Stop racing, proceed slowly to pits or startling as instructed by marshals; (at startling and individual marshals posts) race stopped.

Black/Orange Disc displayed with White number: Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver, call into pits immediately.

Black/White rectangular with White number: Warning to driver that his behaviour (i.e. corner cutting) is suspect and he may be black flagged.

Black display with White number: Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.

Yellow/Black Quartered Flag: On passing the flag at the Start/Finish line, the race leader must slow down significantly (to around 50mph maximum) until the obstruction on the track is clear.

Black/White Chequered: End of race.

Races are started using a system of Red/Green traffic lights.

Welcome to Lydden Hill for the British Racing & Sports Car Club's Channel Race Day. Today's schedule offers everything from top quality single-seater action, through BRSCC T Cars - The Club's youth development programme for youngsters, to the mighty roar of the V Sports racers. Singleseater action comes in the shape of the Kent 1600cc powered Southern Formula Fords, whilst for tin-top enthusiasts there's the awesome V Sport Racing Grand Slam and V6 Championship encounters - today supported by BRSCC T Cars, BRSCC/BARC Southern Sports & Saloons and BARC Formula One Motorsport Saloons.

Almost one third of today's action is courtesy of the V Sport campaigners and if earlier rounds are anything to go by, these races will be nothing short of spectacular! Barry Lee, driving the BLR General Pattern Jaguar V8 has been supreme in the Grand Slam series to date with crushing victories in all four rounds. Chelmsford based Lee may well hold a few years over some of his counterparts, but they are years that amount to experience, and his hunger for success burns as strong today as it did 30 years ago. "I'm really enjoying my motor racing this year," beamed



enthusiasm is clear to see, his fellow V8 V Sport racers are being left to quite literally pick up the crumbs.

Challengers this afternoon for those crumbs come in the shape of an 'on-form' Mark Loveland and Warren Kent. Also watch out for Chris Dawkins who made a welcome return to the VSR V8 campaigne at Brands Hatch last time out. Chris has been burning the midnight oil to get here today after a suspension failure at Brands forced his Mercedes SLK into the tyre wall at Druids. Let us hope that repairs can be completed in time. In the V Sport Racing V6 MSA sanctioned Championship Steve Dance heads the standings but with 15kg of 'success ballast' added for today's race he could struggle around the tight sections

of the circuit. The 2002 championship is a very open affair indeed and Mike Doble is closer than ever this year, both on the track and in the points-standings. In fact, just 100 points separate the top three and without success ballast the driver to watch this afternoon is John Hoggarth in the Pontiac Coupe number 61. Having shed his earlier 'success ballast' at Brands Hatch the car will be 'running light' here at Lydden as will the similar coupe of Baz Johnson. Andy Pike drove the TW Hawkins Toyota Avensis to a welldeserved win at Brands, having been forced to change both cylinder head gaskets on the V6 between heats and he knows Lydden Hill well so he could well be challenging at the front in this afternoons championship encounter.

their bags and head east after today's races as both will be running at the BRSCC's Trans Manche Race weekend at Croix-En-Ternois in France next weekend. The less powerful but highly innovative BRSCC T Cars (the youth development category introduced by the BRSCC for 14-17 year-olds) kick-off proceedings this afternoon, and it's 15 year-old Matt Wilson, son of Rally guru Malcolm, who has snatched the early season advantage with two dominant wins at Snetterton a fortnight ago. This weekend sees the third and fourth rounds of the 2002 BRSCC run series. The championship, now in its third year, is open to those aged between 14 and 17 who are more than 4ft 9ins tall and able to drive a manual transmission car. The purpose built racing cars, built by SHP Motorsport and powered by Vauxhall's 130bhp 1.6 litre, 16v engines, reach a top speed of around 100mph and offer youngsters the chance to learn top International circuits and develop essential racecraft prior to reaching the adult classes. Looking at the results of the opening two rounds, it would be easy to expect double race winner

light. That may well be the case here today, but at Snetterton, a few other names really shone too. Phil Rose (16) from Middlesex pushed Wilson hard in the second race, and last year's series runnerup cannot now be far away from taking his first series victory. One of the new names who impressed on his car racing debut is Jonathan Mahony. The fourteen year-old from Hook was running well up in second places in the opening round before his inexperience caught him out and he missed a vital gear selection on the very last lap. Both Jonathan Cocker and Jonathan Kennard had strong runs too at Snetterton, and are more than capable of filling the top spot of the podium here this weekend.

Of the other new faces, Dan Hoy and Tom Onslow-Cole enjoyed close battles in the opening two rounds - this will continue throughout the season no doubt - spurred on by the rivalry they enjoyed together in karting. They are joined by James Sothcott - winner of the inaugural Building Environmental Services PLC/Motorsport News T Car Scholarship, and Will Bratt, the youngest car driver on a UK grid. Look out too for Anna Walewska, who at 14 is making her 2002

debut. Anna has already claimed her place in the record books having become the youngest girl ever to gain her circuit racing licence.

Whilst considering things youthful it is interesting to note that the youngest ever podium finisher in a British Touring Car Championship race is last year's T Car graduate Tom Chilton – Proof indeed that the BRSCC T Car concept really can be the launching platform to a high level international career in motor sport.

Moving away from 'tin tops' and the Southern Formula Ford Championship makes it's first of two visits to Lydden Hill today. The races today are solely for the Kent powered 1600cc cars, whilst both the Kent and Zetec cars will be here over the weekend of 15-16th June

16th June.

As we closed for press the championship was about to set-up camp at Castle Combe for round 5, and with printing deadlines as they are we are unable to bring you results from that meeting.

However, prior to Combe it was last year's championship runner-up, John Rickarby who headed the standings on 39 points in his Van Diemen RF94. Close on his tails was the first of the Jadlam Racing Van Diemen entries in the shape

of Richard Marsh on 35 points. Marsh's teammate at Jadlam, David Male held fourth spot on 28 points having missed the double-header meeting at Snetterton. Third, and leading division 2 campaigner Colin Johnson in his Reynard RF89 has driven superbly against far newer machinery to net 32 points. Perhaps with some despondence for Rickarby, both David Male and Richard Marsh are acknowledged Castle Combe specialists so by the time the cars arrive here today the championship order may well have switched...

The BRSCC's Southern Formula Ford series (The Oasis Kent County Formula Ford Championship last year) is enjoying a real resurgence this year with a new title alongside separate championships for Kent and Zetec powered cars. Perhaps one of the better-supported Formula Ford championships of 2002, the series more than proves that there is still a healthy future for Formula Ford in the UK. Enjoy today's single-seater action.

Back to 'tin-tops' and the

BRSCC/BARC Southern Sports & Saloons arrive here today for round 3 and the first of four races here at Lydden Hill over the next five weeks. Today's meeting

almost represents a doubleheader for the competitors as they are here again tomorrow for round 4 under the BARC's guidance.

Similarly, the BARC Formula One

Motorsport Saloon Championship arrives here in Kent for round 2 and the first of six visits between now and October. Again, the competitors are here tomorrow for round 3 and then back in 4 weeks time for round 4. Regrettably, as we closed for press no details were available regarding entries for these races so we are unable to preview the action. As such,

please do listen out for announcements from the commentator.

The BRSCC South Eastern Centre wishes you an enjoyable and successful day's racing, and we look forward to seeing you again across the waters in France next weekend, or back at Brands Hatch over the weekend of 25-26th May for a bumper meeting featuring Formula Palmer Audi, BRDC National Supersports, Radicals - Enduro and BiDuro, Southern Formula Fords and a host of sports and saloons.


