

FLAG SIGNALS

Blue/Steady: Another competitor is close.

Blue/Waved: Another competitor is trying to pass. White: Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit

Yellow/Steady: Danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down. Yellow/Waved: Great danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down,

be prepared to stop.

Yellow with Red Stripes: Slippery surface ahead. Green: Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.

Red: Stop racing, proceed slowly to pits or startling as instructed by marshals; (at startling and individual marshals posts) race stopped.

Black/Orange Disc displayed with White number: Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver, call into pits immediately.

Black/White rectangular with White number: Warning to driver that his behaviour (i.e. corner cutting) is suspect and he may be black flagged.

Black display with White number: Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.

Yellow/Black Quartered Flag: On passing the flag at the Start/Finishline, the race leader must slow down significantly (to around 50mphmaximum) until the obstruction on the track is clear.

Black/White Chequered: End of race.

Races are started using a system of Red/Green traffic lights.

SPORT & SALOON HEAVEN

Welcome to Lydden Hill for the BRSCC (British Racing & Sports Car Club) South Eastern Centre's Duryea Motor Race Weekend - So named in celebration of the winning car in the first-ever American 'dash for cash' held in Chicago, Illinois in 1895. The entry, made by the Duryea Motor Wagon Company of Springfield, stormed to success and a \$2,000 purse at a Blistering 7mph ahead of no-less-a-rival than a Mueller-Benz. So now you know! As for race action this weekend, Lydden Hill is sure to echo to an altogether more modern engine note with a packed timetable seeing a range of the BRSCC's more popular championships on track.

First up in the 20-race programme are the Road Saloons. Twenty-Six cars on the grid was a wonderful sight on the Indy circuit at Brands Hatch a fortnight ago, and more of the same is anticipated here this weekend. Lee Scott was in great form having arrived at the circuit straight from the airport after his holiday in Greece. He qualified in pole position and duly won the race - his first ever overall win - even though he is the reigning champion this was his first win. We had our first young lady for a while at Brands too, and Claire Tippet is certainly one to watch for the future. In her first ever race she qualified 19th out of 27 other more experienced competitors and was in 17th place before posting a retirement on the 10th lap with technical problems - the boys had better watch out!

Alan Duly made a return in Class D at Brands, but spent much of his race in and out of the paddock hill bend gravel trap. He'll be hoping for better things this weekend.

With two more Rounds to go, Paul Sanderson has a very healthy lead in Class B and leads overall with a slim margin of just 13 points over Class A's Simon Taylor.

Without a doubt, 2003 has seen some of the best ever racing in Classes A & B of the Alfa Romeo Championship with Tim Lewis, Graham Presley, Bob Godbold, Nick Humphrey and Andy Page all taking overall wins in the opening eight Rounds. One car, however, that has always been expected to make a strong challenge is the beautifully built 33 16V Turbo of Ray Mears. The season has been little

shy of a nightmare for the Autopoint Motorsport entered racer though, with turbo, transmission and engine woes plaguing early Rounds. Mind you, nightmares have a tendency to disappear when one wakes up, and one can only surmise that whilst Ray may have (figuratively speaking) dozed in the first half of the year, he is now sat bolt upright and wide-eved for the second! Round 9 and Donington Park heralded the arrival of Ray to the top step, who then - having rather enjoyed the taste of champagne - powered his way to an emotional victory in the Kevin Griffiths Trophy race at Brands Hatch a fortnight later too. A dramatic engine failure whilst leading at Snetterton two weeks ago came as a painful reminder of earlier troubles, but a smile or two from above should see the fabulous looking 33 back in charge here at Lydden.

In Classes E & F Graham Heels in his 2 litre 146 Ti (Class E) continues to lead both his class and the championship overall, although fifth place last time out at Snetterton was overshadowed

by a superb drive from Chris Forrest (Class F) in his 33. Spencer Shirley driving another 33 is sure to feature this weekend too.

Sitting pretty between the two Alfa races on Saturday and running prime time on Sunday are encounters for the AON Global GT Lights. The championship moves from strength to strength under the professional guidance of Graham Hathaway Engineering Ltd, who both owns and runs the championship.

The formula is strictly policed with

sealed standard Yamaha 600cc engines mated to sequential 6 speed gearboxes. The cars run on Avon control tyres whilst the Ohlins suspension system gives the cars exceptional handling and grip levels in excess of 1g in the wet and 1.9g in the dry!

Costs are controlled with no permitted development and the adopted power unit is extremely reliable, giving 3 years or more of competitive use. Heading the Championship going into the penultimate Round is Dominic Lesniewski with 5 victories to date.

previous champion Dave Mountain and Mondello Park winner Eddie Masson. Long time AON Global GT Light racer Tommy Gilmartin holds fourth place in the standings courtesy of three runners-up finishes and a third so far this season, but right on his heels is ex-karter Linton Stutley who tasted victory at Anglesey earlier in the year. The Irish invaders in the shape of David Byres, and John and Michael Conway expect to be under attack from the ever-improving duo of Clint Bardwell and Tony Impieri. Joining the regulars this weekend is Zip Formula powered by Ford campaigner, and British Racing News Editor Steve Skinner. This is Steve's first visit to Lydden Hill behind the wheel, so the learning curve is going to be somewhat steeper than the Hill for the 37 year-old from Staplehurst. On show in the Paddock will be the new for 2004 1000cc, 150bhp R1 Global GT, to be driven this weekend in prototype form by Graham Hathaway in the Southern Sports & Saloon Car.

Chasing hard in joint second place are

Making a return to Lydden Hill, having been here back in May are the V Sport Racing V6 and Super Silhouette Championships. In the VSRs, it's once again Mike Doble, Jonathan Hoggarth and Steve Offer fighting for Championship honours, with Doble holding a slender 130 point advantage going into the Oulton Park doubleheader which took place last weekend

(details unavailable at the time of going to press).

In the new for 2003 Super Silhouette Championship the title battle is even tighter. White in the VW Corrado heads Hall's Audi TT by just 30 points with Field Jnr a further 560 points adrift in third. Certainly, the Super Silhouettes are an exciting addition to the BRSCC's folio, and especially so here at the tight Lydden Hill circuit. Spectacular action is guaranteed!

The www.eatinorout.com BRSCC Ford XR Challenge makes its first ever visit to Lydden Hill today. The two class championship is well represented with the Ford Fiesta XR2s and Ford Escort XR3is. The Fiesta class championship is headed by Ray Grimes, whilst the Escort class is headed by Chris Jones. The cars run on Yokohama control tyres.

Interest in the www.dees.co.uk BRSCC Fiesta championship is very high this weekend as any number of drivers can take their respective class win, and therefore take the class championship honours. The two class championship for Fiesta SI and Fiesta Zetec is certainly very open at present. The Si class is led by Brian Roper on 168 points from second place David Abbot on 160. The Zetec class looks seemingly sewn up by Terence Clark who has amassed 163 points from Stuart Quittenten in second place. Cars run on DUNLOP slicks.

The Mill Street Motors Ford Saloon Car Championship, now in its 14th season,

is poised nicely to see the championship decided this weekend. Current championship leader Bob Ross, on 151 points, leads Craig Rainer (2002 champion) by a mere point. With both men scoring points right through till the end of the season a riveting and exciting end to this very popular championship must be a very real possibility. These saloons run on DUNLOP DO1J (road tyres), Additional support comes from Mountune Race Engineering and Sennocke International Insurance Services. Joining the regular Ford Saloons will be Mark Scott in the new for 2003 Ford Focus Cup car.

All the Ford cars from these popular championships will be parked in the paddock, and spectators are encouraged to come and have a look at the cars and talk to the drivers. Any inquiries as to how you could start in motor racing should be directed to the championship co-ordinator Kevin Shortis who will be available in the Paddock or can be contacted on 01323 423767.

The Southern Saloon and Sports Car Series caters for a wide variety of cars as the name suggests and the race today incorporates a round of the Ingear Motorsport Magazine Saloon Car Championship. This Championship has been one of the major successes of the club racing scene in the south this


A recent win at Silverstone gave Rod Birley a narrow lead over Chris (sorry, M'Lud) Lord Fulke Greville (Vauxhall Astra) who has recently been elevated to the House of Lords and has missed two rounds while on holiday. He has the stiffest opposition in his class, but that can also work to his advantage as points are scored against competitors beaten in class. Richard Brent (Peugeot 205) seems to be in a comfortable second place, but there is quite a squabble between Neil Armstrong (Honda Civic), Tim Dodwell (VW Scirocco and BMC Mini), Neville Moore (Ford Fiesta) and late starter, Jason Watkins (Ford Fiesta) for the minor placings.

However, the runners-up spot is close between Steve Weatherley (Sierra Sapphire Cosworth) and Malc Best (Ford Capri). Class C is almost certainly now a straight fight between Graham Muff (Peugeot 205) and Andy Wickens (Ford Escort).

The 2003 Welsh Sports & Saloon Car Championship is reaching a crucial stage with only 2 points separating the main championship contenders as we reach the penultimate race weekend of the season here at Lydden Hill. The Welsh Championship has a record of providing close finishes and this year looks like no exception. Having already visited Silverstone, Oulton Park, Mondello Park and Mallory Park, Lydden Hill is the last 'away' Round of the year prior to the finale at Pembrey on October 24/25th.

In the lead coming to Lydden is WRDA Chairman Rhodri Jenkins. Rhodri, driving a Honda Civic, leads with 58 points, from Terry Brown driving a Radical

Terry, the reining champion, has won the championship for the past 2 years and is looking for a hat-trick of championship wins. However, although Terry has been dominant at Pembrey, the championship's home base, he has been less lucky away from home. Nonetheless Terry is likely to be right at the front this weekend and although he has won the greatest number of races, lack of opposition in Class A has seen the consistent Jenkins outscore him with high value points wins in Class G.

In the Welsh Championship the class structures and points scoring systems start with 5 points if there are 4 or more starters in the class, moving down to lower points for a lower number of starters.

Another championship contender in the news is Richard Rhozon who is now a World Land Speed record holder. Richard recently set a new world record in a new High tech milk float. Richard has become quite a celebrity, as news of his achievements has spread worldwide. However class wins and points will be on his mind this weekend.

Joining the regular runners in Saturday afternoon's race will be campaigners from the Extreme Mighty Mini series. New for 2003, and run under the ever watchful eye of Mighty and Super Mighty Mini Supremo Rodger Tello, the Extreme Mighty Minis could well surprise the WRDA establishment with their pace. Last time out at Brands Hatch, Bolton's Barry Murphy in his Mini Cooper scorched his way to fastest lap at some 79.19mph.

The only single seater action of the weekend falls on the shoulders of the Southern Formula Ford Kent campaigners, and whilst Gillingham's Chris Glazier in his Swift SC92F has wrapped-up the title, it is all to play for between Matt Green (Van Diemen RF88) and David Jermy (Van Diemen RF90) for the runners-up spot. Last time out at Brands, Gavin Wills stormed to victory mind, so Sunday's decider could yet throw a surprise or two.

Rounding out the programme is an invitation Sports & Saloon race, which is sure to provide an exciting and explosive climax to what is sure to be a top class weekend of tin-top action.

The BRSCC trusts that you have a safe, enjoyable and successful weekend here at the picturesque Lydden Hill circuit, and we look forward to welcoming you all to the highlight of the year, the 32nd running of the Formula Ford Festival and World Cup incorporating the Caterham Festival over the weekend of 17-19th October at Brands Hatch.




