

FLAG SIGNALS

Blue/ Steady: Another competitor is close.

Blue/Waved: Another competitor is trying to pass. White: Service vehicle or very slow moving car on

circuit. Yellow/Steady: Danger ahead, no overtaking, slow

Yellow/Waved: Great danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down and be prepared to stop.

Yellow with Red stripes: Slippery surface ahead. Green: Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared. Also shown at marshals posts to indicate their positions to competitors on the first lap of all practice sessions.

Red: Stop racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals.

Black/Orange Disc displayed with White number: Warning of mechanical failure or of a fire which might not be obvious to the driver. Call into pits immediately.

Black/White Rectangular displayed with White number: Warning to driver that his behaviour is suspect and he may be black flagged.

Black displayed with White number: Driver must return immediately to the paddock and report to the Clerk of Course.

Black and White Chequered: End of race.

National Flag: This is used to start races in the absence of electric starting lights, and where races have split starts.

On behalf of the London & Home Counties Centre of the British Automobile Racing Club, welcome to our first meeting of the season at Lydden.

If the healthy entry is anything to go by we believe we should see some excellent racing.

The first race on the programme is a round of the national BARC Westfield Sports Car Championship and it should serve as an excellent appetizer.

Practice for this event is likely to be hectic, to say the least, with 30 cars scrapping for 21 places on the grid. Those who miss out will be able to take part in a consolation race.

Keith Scarfe won the opening round of the Westfield series at Brands, but it was a pretty fraught affair with numerous spins on the wet track.

Bill Tully and Ian Stinton revolved with the best of them, but fought back impressively, and so they are

bound to be in the thick of it at the head of the field today.

The slicks and wings FF2000 cars used to be very popular at Lydden when the formula was first introduced, and so it is good to see the standard is maintained today in the URS Classic series. Trevor Stiles and Bob Davis have raced here many times.

If the Westfields and URS car are the starters on the menu, then the main course must surely be the four Lydden championship rounds which will be fought out here throughout the rest of the season.

The opening round of the AstraTech/RESB Single Seater Championship was won by sprinter Paul Shipp and the runner-up was Ian Osborne, but neither are here today, and so no doubt Matt Hayes will be hoping for a win from his first outing with the Zetec-powered Jamun. Watch out for the BARC's

vice-chairman and former Mini racer, Ian Bax, who is due to return to the circuit today.


The F1 Racewear Saloon event should be close, with Rod Birley hoping for more reliability from his Escort-Cosworth. But his regular rivals Alex Sidwell and Craig Dawson, as well as series newcomer and former Lydden champion Peter Ware will be doing their best to give him a hard time. Birley will be out again in the TWMC Silhouette event, when he will face strong opposition from John Oxborrow's self-built Ox-7 and

Robert Bridger's Vauxhall-powered Toyota.

The 2-litre Vauxhall engine is becoming increasingly popular in the TWMC Sports Car series as well. Former champion Peter Keel, Paul Sherlock, John Lord and former saloon champion, John Dewing all rely on similar power units.

The two invitation events which close the programme should offer good value for competitors as well as fine entertainment for the spectators.



London & Home Counties Centre

- THE Centre

Some 86 years ago - on December 12 1912 to be precise - a group of cyclecar enthusiasts gathered at the Hut Hotel, Wisley, in Surrey to compare notes on their machines.

Cyclecars (virtually four-wheeled powered cycles) provided the real enthusiasts motoring of those days, and the group decided there and then to form the Cyclecar Club.

The Hut Hotel was demolished in 1978 to make way for the old Portsmouth Road improvements, but the little acorns sown that day sprang into the mighty oak that is today's British Automobile Racing Club. And last year it was the club's proud boast that it organised more events of International Status than any other in the world.

The Cycle Car Club was soon to become the Junior Car Club, racing at Brooklands and elsewhere in Britain, organising foreign tours and generally looking after the interests of the enthusiast. Brooklands was to play a big part in the BARC's childhood and adolescence, as the JCC was destined to merge with the Brooklands Automobile Racing Club to become the modern day British Automobile Racing Club.

The BARC's past is mile-stoned with all the great races at Brooklands, Donington, the Goodwood Formula One and Formula Two meetings, the British Grand Prix at Aintree and Crystal Palace.

Brooklands was its first home, Goodwood

its second and, since 1968, Thruxton its third.

Housed in its headquarters at Thruxton the BARC now oversees race meetings at all the major circuits in the country and now oversees 18 of the 24 rounds of the British Touring Car Championship. The club officiates at the highly-successful Goodwood Festival of Speed and the

Goodwood Revival meeting.

In addition national race meetings are run throughout the country alongside sprint and hill climb championships in the hands of the successful network of local centres, including the London and Home Counties Centre.



THE Club - THE Centre

As one of the largest Centres in Britain's biggest and brightest motor club, the London and Home Counties Centre is truly a club within an club.

In 1955 the South Eastern Centre was formed, to be followed three years later by the Surrey Centre founded as the Leatherhead Group which became the North Thames Centre in 1962. These all amalgamated in 1977 to form the now highly-successful London and Home Counties Centre.

January 1st 2000 will see the Centre revert to the name South Eastern Centre to better reflect its area of activities. The

London and Home Counties name will continue through this year, while new marketing material is introduced ready for the change in the new Millennium.

This year the Centre will organise three race meetings at Lydden Circuit and copromote a finals day with the South East Motor Sports Enthusiasts Club at the circuit in October; co-promote three rallycross events at Lydden Circuit, organise two sprint meetings at Goodwood Circuit; it has already co-promoted a sprint meeting with Sevenoaks and District MC at Lydden Circuit and organised a championship sprint and race meeting at Silverstone's Stowe Circuit.


