
# **Drayton Manor Park** M G Metro Cup

# Mini 50th Aniversary




2009 marks the 50th anniversary of one of the world's most successful small cars. Not only in racing but rallying and rallycross as well. The car in question is the Mini.

race for every engine size and body shell. The quickest drivers in these 2 races will then qualify for the 'Fastest Mini Race' at the end of Sunday.



# BARC SEC Dunlop Motorsport News Saloon Car Championship



The 'DMN' continues to go from strength to strength. Focussing on two key areas: costs and regulations, the BARC SEC has developed the Championship to permit almost any type of saloon car to race (with only a few minor exceptions).

This season sees Richard Brent defending the Championship in is Peugeot 205 Gti from previous title holders including Bill Richards and Rod Birley. There are also a number of new drivers to the Championship in 2009 who are keen to acheive the top spot.

In class A Malcolm Wise, from London, has a similar Ford Escort WRC to that which Birley campaigns. Wise has scored points in every round so far this year and is improving at every meeting. The two wheel drive Cosworth powered Fords of Ray Barrow (Mk. 1 Ford Escort) and Peter Taylor (Sierra RS500) are neck and neck in the championship, and both drivers have enjoyed their close on track competition. We welcome German visitor Frank Nohring with his BMW E46 which could spring a surprise in this class.

Class B sees West countryman Kevin Bird, with his self prepared Seat, taking on class points leader Andy Woods-Dean who has rejuvinated his Renault Megane. Steve Dann, from Maidstone, has a newer version of the VW Golf he campaigned last season. The star at Brands Hatch four weeks ago was Rick May with his Sierra Cosworth. He really took the fight to the class A cars and at one stage actually led the second race. Wonder how Rick will cope with the twistier Lydden track.

Reigning champion Richard Brent pops up in class C with his faithful Peugeot 205. Richard dominated class D last year and has so far been the man to beat in C. James Lindridge (Vauxhall Astra) and Graham Bahr (BMW E30) will be keen to have a go. Bill Richards has also moved up a class, this time to D, with his incredibly rapid KAD engined Mini. He will face strong opposition from Alex Ribbens whose Mk.2 Ford Escort inflicted a rare defeat on the Ashford man back in March at Brands Hatch. Nick Proudlock will be hoping his reliable retro style Mk.1 Ford Escort keeps racking up the points.

Class E sees the beautifully prepared Minis of Steve King and Ken Welch tied on points, as both have shared the spoils evenly this year. Mike Edgell may upset the status quo this time though.


# Cannon's MSA TinTOP Challenge

# Sports & Saloons Festival

t's hard to know which way to look for the best bits in this midsummer BARC South Eastern fixture.

It brings together some of the most popular and exciting of Britain's amateur saloon and sports car championships and gives fans of traditional circuit racing a rare opportunity to see some amazing V8 machinery on the tight Lydden oval.

All of this, plus some special events to celebrate the Mini's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Stand back and enjoy the action.

For many fans, expectations will be particularly high for the **Dunlop/Motorsport News** races. Championship pace-setter and BARC SE Chairman Rod Birley has now raised his career total to 491 victories but a turbocharged Ford Escort may not be the

ideal car here, even when harnessed to fourwheel-drive.


Talking of rapid machinery, if Mark Biggers has overcome the reliability problems which have dogged his massively quick Nissan Skyline, he will be a leading contender.

Local Mini ace Bill Richards went on the record recently with his ambition to win a "DMN" event outright and with the championship classes split for the first time this year because of grid size restrictions, this could be his best chance. A win would be a fitting result on a weekend marking the Mini's half-century, but he still has to overcome defending champion Richard Brent who brings his potent Peugeot from the West Country.

One of the attractions of this championship is the near-certainty of seeing close competition,

often involving unlikely rivals, throughout the race order.

still plenty of scope for some crowded track action.

The same applies to the Tigers, outwardly identical sports cars with various engine specifications which also provide all the ingredients for a good scrap. The Cambridgeshire company offers an attractive complete racing "package" to drivers, and one to keep an eye on here is Adam Wilkins, Editor of Complete Kit Car magazine who is also a local man from Teynham.

The Tin Tops are much more closely related to their roadgoing counterparts than many of the saloon cars on view this weekend and have produced some spectacular racing this season. Bill Richards fields another of his Minis in this one and Joanne Gordon in a Fiesta couldn't live much closer to the track. She lives just down the road at Densole.

The Tin Tops contrast strongly with some of the Intermarque cars, where what you see is not necessarily what you get. The faster cars tend to be running in a "silhouette" formula so that Steve Hall's front-running car may look like an Audi TT but has no connection with the German manufacturer under the lightweight skin. German guest driver Bert Cristian is due to be a welcome addition to the entry.

Bob Morris writes elsewhere about the special Mini celebration events. Suffice to say here that entries were still coming in at the time of writing and it will be interesting to see drivers like Richard Brent and James Lindridge, better known for their "DMN" antics, guest driving in borrowed Minis.

Last, and certainly not least, if you're attending on Saturday be sure to watch the European Late Model races on the oval at the Chessons end of the track. The rather mundane title disguises the fact that something like 20 cars bearing a visual similarity to American NASCAR racers seen on tracks like Daytona will be battling it out in these confined surroundings. A sight not to be missed.

The European Late Model Series was designed to bring the ideals of American stockcar racing to Europe. We believe the ingredients for a successful motor racing series are: entertainment for the fans and the drivers alike: a multi-format media offensive to ensure teams and their marketing partners get top value for money, and fast, high-power race cars with real presence that are cheap to buy, run and maintain.

There are many American Late Model stockcars in Europe and we felt it was time to bring them together to race on the ovals of Europe.

What is a Late Model? According the Michigan Department of Motor Vehicles, a Late Model vehicle is defined as:

· A vehicle 8,000 pounds or less, manufactured in one of the last six model vears, or

· A vehicle 8,001 pounds or more, manufactured in one of the last 16 model years

Late Model racing is the highest level of stockcar racing run by most oval track organisations in the USA. There are many varieties, all with very significant differences. Some classes of Late Models race on dirt, some race on asphalt. They vary in performance too; some classes have unlimited engines and some use the conventional Pinto four cylinder engine found in most UK stockcars. The majority of Late

Model formulae require the use of a V8 crate engine, as found in the CAMSO Late Models of Belgium.

Asphalt Late Model racing is a common stepping-stone for drivers on their way to the top echelons of NASCAR racing. NASCAR has its

own touring and regional Late Model championships for drivers to progress through on their way to Craftsman Truck Series, Nationwide Series or the Sprint Cup. The cars

Almost any American stockcar can compete. The Series' technical committee has a range of performance-limiting augmentations to impose on cars in order to create an even playing field.

#### The future

In 2010 the European Late Model Series intends to increase the number of races held in the UK and expand the Series to include races in the Netherlands and France.

It is our aim to combine top-level oval racing with the media presence of top-level circuit racing. creating a package which has never been seen before in Europe and can cost less than club circuit racing or Hotrods.



After todays racing there will be little time for celebrations or commiserations for the drivers as the European Late Model Series are required to race at Warneton in Belgium the very next morning!
