



Following a short lunch break the afternoon will be taken up entirely with race practice and a programme of 6 races. Those of you who regular attend SEMSEC or BARC events at Lydden

will be familiar with the 5 Lydden based championships for saloons, single seaters and sports cars which have races as part of today's event. For those of you who would like to know more, details are contained later in this programme.

The guest Championship for today's meeting are the Drayton Manor Park MG Metro Cup Cars. This is a national championship run by the MG Car Club. They have visited us here at Lydden on several occasions in the past and have always provided close, entertaining and exciting racing. We feel sure you won't be disappointed today.

The day will be completed with a Single Seater Trophy Race followed by the John Taylor Handicap Championship Race where you can be certain of plenty of overtaking and drama as faster cars try to make up time and distance penalties to catch up with some of the slower cars. Often the slower cars can have a two lap start of the fastest car so there should be no shortage of action.



Unfortunately you may have seen from local TV and press reports that Lydden Motor Racing Circuit has an uncertain future due to the redevelopment plans of the circuits owner McLaren International. Sunday 2nd July Saturday 2nd September Saturday 23rd September Saturday 28th October


The meeting on Saturday 28th October will provide the final rounds of each of the five Lydden Championships together with the last event in the South East Sports and Saloon Challenge.



The First National evo Caterham Academy is the ideal introduction to motorsport. Designed specifically for novice drivers, it offers an inexpensive entry to racing, sprinting and hillclimbing. The series was in introduced in 1995 (as the Caterham Sport Scholarship) and has enjoyed such popularity that for 2000 two entirely separate calendars have been created, permitting a total of 50 new competitors to find their feet in motorsport.


Each of the calendars (competitors can compete in either, but not both) offers three hillclimb events, two sprints and two circuit races. It's exceptional value for money. For a subsidised outlay of just £11,950 inc VAT, competitors receive a road-legal Caterham 1.6 sports car, full ARDS tuition for their MSA National B licence, medical exam, club membership, a test day with instruction and all event and championship entry fees.

The championship, which is organised by the British Automobile Racing Club and administered by Entreprix, is

designed to introduce drivers to a range of motorsporting disciplines, and to encourage drivers to continue in the sport in years to come.

The 1999 champion was Jason Sutherland and he is intending to progress his career in the Caterham Roadsport Challenge in 2000. Many Academy drivers go on, with their cars, to contend club-level events in the Caterham Graduate series. The technical regulations are the same as for the Academy, but the series is open to all and provides the perfect stepping stone for driver not wishing to become involved in higher-cost, higher-profile championships.

Top prize in the 2000 First National Caterham Academy is a test drive in a Caterham roadsport car, plus a trophy. Points are awarded for each round on the scale 20-19-18-17 and so on down to 2 points for 19th position, with 1 point for all other classified finishers; competitors count all their scores.

Championships

TWMC, SEMSEC & BARC SEC LYDDEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

This year there are again three Tunbridge Wells Motor Club Lydden Racing Championships one of which is jointly promoted by British Automobile Racing Club South East Centre. The South East Motor Sports Enthusiasts Club (SEMSEC) promotes the John Taylor Saloon and Sports Car Handicap Championship and jointly promotes the Astratech Single Seater Championship with BARC South East Centre. Today's event provides the first round of all of these championships and the fifth round for the John Taylor Handicap Championship. The Astratech Single Seater Championship will be contested over 10 rounds whilst the John Taylor Handicap Championship has 6 qualifying rounds and all the remaining championship will each be contested over 10 rounds except the Formula One Motorsport Saloon Car Championship which consists of 11 rounds.

Astratech Single Seater Championship

As its name suggests this championship is for Single Seaters. This year we are pleased to again have the support of Astratech, a firm which specialises in the manufacture and supply of specialist race timing equipment.

There are classes for Formula Ford 1600's, Zetec Formula Fords, Formula Ford 2000's and all other single seaters up to 2 litre.

Credit Professionals Sports Car Championship

This years Lydden sports car championship benefits from the support of Credit Professionals and provide some cash prizes for the overall championship winner and runner up. The championship is for a wide variety of sports cars. It includes a class for Caterham Seven type cars as well as classes for other mass-produced sports cars, 'roadgoing' sports cars and a class for sports cars with a limited production run. This will be the sixth year that TWMC have promoted this

championship and it increases in popularity each year. Points are awarded according to class finishing position so the outright race winner may not always be the only high scoring championship contender. There are several new contenders lining up to compete in this years championship and we wait to see who will challenge last years champion Paul Sherlock in his Dax kit car. The degree of allowable modification to cars is quite large and we wait to see just how competitive some of the new comers to this year's championship are.

FORMULA ONE MOTORSPORT Saloon Car Championship


FORMULA ONE MOTORSPORT return to support the popular Saloon Car Championship. Formula One are retails of various motoring and motor sport accessories based in West Malling close to Brands Hatch. The Formula One Motorsport Saloon Car Championship is a combination of the Tunbridge Wells Motor Club and BARC L&HCC Lydden Saloon car championships which were run up until 1998. Both SEMSEC and BARC South East Centre will promote rounds at each of their Lydden meetings during 2000 and there is a special away round to be held at Brands Hatch on 22nd July. This is a championship is for saloon and hatchback cars retaining the original engine block and head. There are restrictions on what can be changed with regard to both mechanical and bodywork. The class structure caters for cars running on slicks or 'road going' cars using normal road tyres. There is also provision for the inclusion of forced induction saloons and classes are again structured to recognise the power advantage these cars may have although there are restrictions on the type of Turbo unit and intercooler the cars can use. As with the Sports car championship, championship points are awarded according to a competitors class finishing position not overall position so there is plenty of chance for some of the smaller less powerful cars to compete for the overall championship honours. Craig Dawson was the 1998 champion but there are lots of new challengers and new cars for 1999 hoping to lift the 1999 title.

TWMC Lydden Silhouette Saloon Championship

The TWMC Lydden Silhouette Championship allows much greater modification to cars than the saloon car championship with many of the cars being space framed. The choice of engines and transmissions is free. The cars should retain the silhouette of an original manufacturer's model but as you will see there seems to be a little poetic licence in this area. For the second year we have also allowed home built non commercial sports prototypes to compete in this championship and new for this year we have also introduced a class for special sports racing cars up to a 2000cc limit. This championship is again increasing in popularity and provides some very fine racing.

The John Taylor Handicap Championship Race

Our Chief Timekeeper at SEMSEC events between 1995 and 1997 was John Taylor and it is John who introduced us to the idea of running a Handicap Saloon and Sports Car race at each of our meetings. Unfortunately John has had to retire from officiating at our events due to work commitments but the championship lives on still carrying his name. This has proved to be a very successful formula and in 2000 continues it's full championship status for a series of six races. The aim of this format of racing is to even up all the different power, weight and driver advantages and disadvantages from a wide range of saloon and sports cars. This is done by giving each competitor a time handicap according to his/her known performance. In some cases the slower cars may have a one or even two lap advantage over the fastest cars so having to complete 10 instead of 12 laps. This means that to win the fastest cars may have had to lap the slowest cars twice. This all makes for very exciting racing and whilst you will find it hard to follow at first you can be sure that when the cars all start bunching together the end of the race is not far away because in an ideal world, and if the handicapper got it right, the whole grid should finish across the line

BOROUGH 19 MOTOR CLUB

Borough 19 Motor Club was initially formed in the Spring of 1963 and took its name after Bromley and Beckenham became the 19th London Borough. It was formed by schoolmates, workmates, customers and friends of Stoneham's Garage at Eden Park, Beckenham, Kent.

Customers and colleagues at the West Wickham (1936) Garage and Squires Timber joined the Club. Meetings were held at the Eden Park Hotel as were meetings of Eden Park 100 Motor Club. This latter club collapsed and most of its members joined Borough 19 as did several members of the Bromley Motor Club which was soon to suffer a similar fate. The Trophy will be presented to the competitor in the Lydden series who competes in the style and manner that was typified by Ronnie.
