#### FLAG SIGNALS

Blue/ Steady: Another competitor is close.

Blue/ Waved: Another competitor is trying to pass. White: Service vehicle or very slow moving car on circuit.

Yellow/Steady: Danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down.

Yellow/Waved: Great danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down and be prepared to stop.

Yellow with Red stripes: Slippery surface ahead. Green: Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared. Also shown at marshals posts to indicate their positions to competitors on the first lap of all practice sessions.

**Red:** Stop racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals.

Black/Orange Disc displayed with White number: Warning of mechanical failure or of a fire which might not be obvious to the driver. Call into pits immediately.

Black/White Rectangular displayed with White number: Warning to driver that his behaviour is suspect and he may be black flagged.

**Black displayed with White number:** Driver must return immediately to the paddock and report to the Clerk of Course.

Black and White Chequered: End of race.

**National Flag:** This is used to start races in the absence of electric starting lights, and where races have split starts.

Our timetable today gets off the grid with two races for the burgeoning BARC SEC Track and Race Cars Championship. One of the leading drivers in the series, Rod Birley gives his special insight into the event elsewhere in this programme.

Next up are the Classic and Historic Saloons which will be combined with the York Fitness Post Historic Championship. Clearly we can expect the leading runners to be from the latter category for pre '74 cars, so look for a good battle between the wheel-waving Lotus

• Group One championship leader Andre Severs (Renault 5).

Cortina of Roger Stanford, who always goes well here, Stephen Primett (Escort RS2000) who is leading the championship and Neil Bray (3-litre Capri) who is pushing him hard. Jeff Handley will be looking to extend his Classic championship lead with his matronly Morris Minor.

Also on the menu is the Ibis Packaging Solutions Group One Touring Car Championship in association with Dunlop – to give the event its full title. Martin West held a one-point advantage over Dave Thomas in Class B when they arrived at Cadwell for the previous round, but then Thomas beat his fellow Capri rival in a close battle for second

At the time of writing Thomas has not entered for today's meeting, but in the meantime he might have had second thoughts? He can't afford to miss it . . .

Despite all the rapid Capris, Escorts and Golfs in this series the overall leader is Andre Severs whose humble Renault Five just keeps on going (and winning) its class.

In the Rawles Motorsport event the only driver so far to enter one of the gorgeous big Healeys is Bill Rawles – well he would, wouldn't he? Just listen to the sound as he takes on a sprinkling of Sprites including special Sebring and Speedwell models as well as the ubiquitous "frog-eye."

Steve Dillon will be hoping to close the gap on the absent Waxoyl Classic Thunder Touring Car Championship leader, Nigel Garrett, but Joss Ronchetti will be pushing him hard, as he did at Cadwell recently and local expert Gordon Streeter will be looking for another class win in his Ford Anglia.

The Toyo Tyres event should see a good battle between Gerry Cain's rorty Rover, Marc Taylor's Starion and plenty of Peugeots driven, among others, by Gareth Porter who won at Anglesey recently and former rallycrosser, Sean Holland.

Simon Davey and Paul Walton are the frontrunners in the URS Classic FF1600 series at the moment, but former Lydden champion Paul Sleeman could spring a surprise in his older Jamun T2.

Judd Coupland and Clive Wood dominated the most recent round of the URS Classic FF2000 series, but Nicholas Pearce used to be a regular winner at Lydden and so did Anthony Hancock, father of up-and-coming youngster, Olly, who makes a rare appearance here today.

## Tight Title Tussle

ALTHOUGH the current points positions make it look like a four way tussle for overall supremacy, there are in fact many more drivers who will have a say in the destiny of this year's championship, writes Rod Birley.

Since the first round back in April the grid sizes have been bulging which has resulted in a split grid here today.

The first group will comprise of classes A, C and I. Here we will see Rod Birley in his flame spitting Ford Escort WRC closely pursued by Nathan Mills in his ex-Robert Bridger Toyota Starlet. These two had a wonderful battle at the "away" round in Croix-en-Ternois, northern France, with Rod just getting the verdict. The main protagonists in class C will be Ashford's Peter Wilkinson in his immaculate Peugeot 306, and Harlow's Leigh Franklin in his well driven VW Golf Gti. Leigh harried class A driver Ray Barrow at the previous Lydden round, eventually nipping by on the last lap, which earned Mr Franklin the Quaife engineering "Driver of the Race" award.

There is also an invitation class comprising of two production sports cars, namely Derek Parker's Caterham and the TVR of Peter Reeve. Both will be keen to mix it with the saloons.

The second group will comprise of classes B and D. Here again we had a titanic battle at the last Lydden round back in May. Whilst Nick Williamson stayed clear of the pack to take a well deserved win in his Peugeot 205, the battle for second comprised of five cars. The class B turbo cars of Steve Weatherley (Sapphire Cosworth) and Steve Govett (Rover 220) found themselves embroiled in the class D fight between Richard Brent (Peugeot 205), Bill Richards (Mini) and last year's champion Jason Watkins (Ford Fiesta). Constant place swapping kept the crowd well entertained.



Weatherley finally secured second place, which earned him a special award, whilst Brent somehow out fumbled Richards on the last lap to win class D. Expect more of the same today, especially with Joss Ronchetti (Talbot Sunbeam), Gordon Streeter (Ford Anglia) and Mr "Rollover" Les Beer (Ford Fiesta) also joining in. Plenty of action is guaranteed.

Throughout the summer there is a programme of events when visits are made to local festivals, road runs and weekends away.


During the winter, when the vehicles receive their well-deserved TLC, there are easy old bicycle rides finishing in local pubs.

## British Automobile Racing Club

# - South Eastern Centre Club Motorsport At Its Best

On December 12 1912 a group of cyclecar enthusiasts gathered at the Hut Hotel, Wisley, in Surrey to compare notes on their machines.

Cyclecars (virtually four-wheeled powered cycles) provided the real enthusiasts motoring of those days, and the group decided there and then to form the Cyclecar Club.

The Hut Hotel was demolished in 1978 to make way for the old Portsmouth Road improvements, but the little acorns sown that day sprang into the mighty oak that is today's British Automobile Racing Club.

The Cycle Car Club was soon to become the Junior Car Club, racing at Brooklands and elsewhere in Britain, organising foreign tours and generally looking after the interests of the enthusiast. Brooklands was to play a big part in the BARC's childhood and adolescence, as the JCC was destined to merge with the Brooklands Automobile Racing Club to become the modern day British Automobile Racing Club.

The BARC's past is mile-stoned with all the great races at Brooklands, Donington, the Goodwood Formula One and Formula Two meetings, the British Grand Prix at Aintree and Crystal Palace.

Brooklands was its first home, Goodwood its second and, since 1968, Thruxton its third. Housed in its headquarters at Thruxton the BARC oversees race meetings at all the major circuits in the country and now runs the the British Touring Car Championship among other major championships.

The club officiates at the highly-successful Goodwood Festival of Speed and the Goodwood Revival Race meetings.

In addition national race meetings are run throughout the country alongside sprint and hill climb championships in the hands of the successful network of local centres.

In 1955 the original South Eastern Centre was formed. Over the years a number of developments took place culminating in the formation in 1977 of the highly-successful London and Home Counties Centre.

Recent years have seen the Centre spread its geographic area of activities and revert to the name South Eastern Centre to better reflect this.

The centre this year has another busy programme with Race and Sprint events at Lydden, Goodwood and Silverstone Circuits.
