

TODAY'S RACING

It is interesting to see how the Dunlop Track and Race saloon car championship has grown in stature over the last couple of years. In 2006 "Motorsport News" voted it the third best championship in the UK. As an occasional spectator I can vouch that it is highly entertaining. Not only are the classes carefully constructed to give every car and driver combination a chance, but it also provides good close genuine racing. This year will no doubt see even more variety as several new vehicles and competitors are due to appear.

Although Rod Birley proved untouchable last year with his Ford Escort WRC, winning every race, he did come across some stern opposition. At the Lydden meeting in October he twice had to pass Peter Wilkinson in his fast starting Mitsubishi. Peter has traded one Japanese car for another, this time acquiring an ex-BTCC Nissan Primera. In November Rod had to use all his local circuit knowledge at Brands Hatch to stave off the Mercedes 190Evo driven by Grea Rose. This year expect to see the

white Merc driven by it's owner Martin Johnston, or he may wheel out a former thundersaloon Ford Sierra.

Moving up to class A is last year's class B champion Nigel Craig. Nigel and his son Stephen have purchased a pair of Subaru Imprezzas. These four wheel drive supercars will add yet more variety and a distinctive engine note from the flat four boxer engine. Another new car will be the Renault Clio of Stewart Thomas. This fits into class A because it has a sequential gearbox.

In class B we find several new vehicles. Anthony Ahmed and Ray Adams have both changed their German VWs for Spanish Seats. Anthony is using the Ibiza Cupra version whilst Ray has gone for the Leon. Barry Barnes now has a BMW M3 having previously campaigned a Toyota Carina. Class regulars Steve Weatherley and Andy Wickens both return with their fauthfull Ford Sierra Cosworths along with Graham Bahr in his potent turbo charged BMW.

Twice runner up in the championship, Richard Brent, has elected to shoe horn a larger engine into his very rapid Peugeot 205. This moves him from class E to class C, where he is joined by Andy Woods-Dean in his pretty Renault Megane.

The closest class battle in 2006 was between class D protagonists Greg Pye (Alfa Romeo) and Alex Ribbens (Ford Escort Mk.2). Greg emerged victorious after the final round, where Alex was unfortunately involved in someone else's accident. Both are returning again in their same cars and are joined by Andy Pipe in his neat Mk.1 Ford Escort, Darren Bly in an Opel Manta and Jamie Goldthorpe in a Honda CRX.

Finally in class E we find a resurgence of Minis. Not only has Bill Richards returned with his 2005 championship winning example, but he is joined by local rival Lee McNair and Gemma Morris. Gemma recently won a sponsorship deal with Millers Oils, which should help her compete for the whole season. Also bringing their Minis from the West country will be Mike Edgell and Peter Crewes.

Moving on to the southern "tin tops", it is refreshing to note what a success this

has been. Having been launched at last September's festival of motorsport, here at Lydden, the series has quickly grown. Several drivers have joined in from the sprinting fraternity, most notably Steve Dann with his rapid VW Golf. Another newcomer is Gary Chappell from Wrotham who will be enjoying only his second ever race. Gary drives a very smart self prepared Toyota Celica which is just as well as he runs a coachworks, spraying customers cars. Also in this race we find the ever versatile Bill Richards. who is currently offering Minis for this series at very competitive prices. Bill has also helped Tristan Barden who campaigns another one of the British Leyland products.

In the sports and saloons it looks like John Hill should be the front runner in the Caterham he shares with Derek Parker. Joining him should be a number of the Tiger sports cars.

Club Motorsport At Its Best

On December 12 1912 a group of cyclecar enthusiast, gathered at the Hut Hotel, Wisley, Surrey to compare notes on their machines.

Cyclecars (virtually four-wheeled powered cycles) provided the real enthusiasts motoring of those days, and the group decided there and then to form the Cyclecar Club.

The Hut Hotel was demolished in1978 to make way for the old Portsmouth Road improvements, but the little acorns sown that day sprang in to the mighty oak that is today's British Automobile Racing Club.

The Cycle Car Club was soon to become the Junior Car Club, racing Brooklands and elsewhere in Britain, organising foreign tours and generally looking after the interests of the enthusiast. Brooklands was to play a big part in the BARS's childhood and adolescence, as the JCC was destined to merge with the Brooklands Automobile Racing Club to become the modern day British Automobile Racing Club.

The BARC's past is mile-stoned with all the great races at Brooklands, Donington, the Goodwood Formula One and Formula Two meetings, the British Grand Prix at Aintree and Crystal Palace.

Brooklands was its first home, Goodwood its second and, since 1968 Thruxton it's third. Housed in its headquarters at Thruxton the BARC oversees race meetings at all the major circuits in the country and now runs the British Touring Car Championship among other major championships.

The club officiates at the highlysuccessful Goodwood Festival of Speed and the Goodwood Revival Race meetings.

In addition national race meetings are run throughout the country alongside sprints and hillclimb championships in the hands of the successful network of local centres.

In 1955, the original South Eastern Centre was formed. Over the years a number of developments took place culminating in the formation in 1977 of the highly-successful London and Home Counties Centre.

Recent years have seen the Centre spread it s geographic area of activities and revert to the name South Eastern Centre to better reflect this.

The centre this year has another busy programme with Race and Sprint events at Lydden, Goodwood, Castle Combe, Brands Hatch and Silverstone Circuits.
