

FOREWORD W

About today's meeting

Today's programme of seven races is preceded by the ETA BMW Lydden Sprint run by the Rochester Motor Club. We also have a number of additional attractions at today's event including Hot Air Balloons (weather permitting) with a possible take of following the finish of racing. We have the attendance of the HE Services Landshuttle which holds the world speed record for John O'Goats to Landsend by a mechanical digger. This machine will be giving rides to members of the public and may also lift children in it's bucket so why not go along and take a look. There is a classic and hopefully a custom car display. All this is situated just above the paddock area and you will also find some fair ground attractions and a children's roundabout in this area.

The ETA BMW Lydden Sprint has seen a record level of interest from competitors with the entry list being full some three weeks prior to the event and a number of competitors having to be turned away. This event is a round of four regional championships plus the Polkacrest Championship as well as the Tunbridge Wells Motor Club's All Circuit Sprint Championship which receives considerable support from sprint competitors who wish to compete at motor racing venues.

The sprint will be followed by practice sessions for each of the seven races planned for our afternoon's entertainment. Each practice session is of approximately 20 minutes duration and provides the drivers with the opportunity to set their cars up and familiarise themselves with the circuit.

The race programme starts of with the DJ Invicta Silhouette Saloon Car race and this as away's promises some close fought action especially at the head of the field. Expect to John Oxborrow's OX7 home built Sports prototype up there battling it out with Robert Bridger's Toyota Starlet. This formula is for space framed and highly modified saloons and sports prototypes is supported by D J Invicta (Spares) Ltd of Wingham near Canterbury. They are Kent's largest suppliers of |Nuts, bolts and washers. The Silhouettes are followed by the RESB Single Seater race which will be mainly contested by Formula Ford 1600's. Matt Hayes is the quick guy here but

Chris Glazier and Dave Conner will also be there ready to capitalise on any mistakes Matt makes. The popular Formula One Raceway Saloons will be the next cars out on the grid and again the winner is by no means a fore gone conclusion. So far this year we have seen wins from Craig Dawson's Peugeot, Rod Birley's Escort Cosworth and Alex Sidwell's Sierra Cosworth. Even David Abbott's Mini lead one race for a couple of laps.

Next up is the TWMC Sports Car Championship race. This championship has grown in popularity and you can expect to see some very quick cars challenging for the lead. Recent events have all seen Paul Sherlock's Dax past the chequers flag first but Trevor Phillips took a win earlier in the season and last years hot favourite John Lord has still to make his mark in 1998. This will be followed by a combined race for the BARC L&HCC Formula Ford and Single Seater championships and you can expect to see most of the Formula Fords and single seaters out again for this race.

The final race of the day will be the John Taylor Handicap Championship race and anyone who has not been to a SEMSEC meeting previously will probably find this race both entertaining and confusing. The result is decided conventionally on the basis of first past the flag however the start is anything but conventional. To even out performance and ability differences from the various drivers and cars competing there is a time delayed start and the fastest cars can even have one two or three laps additional race distance to cover over the slower cars. Plenty of overtaking is guaranteed and we strongly recommend that you listen carefully to the commentator to establish just who has to cover the additional laps.

We hope you enjoy today's motor sport offering from Rochester Motor Club and the South East Motor Sports Enthusiasts Club and hope you will be back to see the next exciting instalment on Sunday 27th September when we have a really packed meeting featuring a lot of single seater national championships and marking James Hunt's first race win which took place hear at Lydden in a Formula Ford in September 1968 when he also set a new lap record.




BOROUGH 19 MOTOR CLUB

In 1998 Borough 19 Motor Club celebrates 35 years of existence. It was initially formed in the Spring of 1963 and took its name after Bromley and Beckenham became the 19th London Borough. It was formed by schoolmates, workmates, customers and friends of Stoneham's Garage at Eden Park, Beckenham, Kent.

Customers and colleagues at the West Wickham (1936) Garage and Squires Timber joined the Club. Meetings were held at the Eden Park Hotel as were meetings of Eden Park 100 Motor Club. This latter club collapsed and most of its members joined Borough 19 as did several members of the Bromley Motor Club which was soon to suffer a similar fate. Borough 19 Motor Club then became affiliated to the Royal Automobile Club. The first speed event was an Autocross at Stanstead Farm, Caterham int Whitsun 1964 and later followed by a Road Rally. Borough 19 Motor Club is currently organising events for the clubman and grass roots motorsport enthusiast. It offers Production Car Trials and Autotests for members to enter in their standard road saloon cars. For the Speed enthusiasts the Club organises Autocross and Sprint meetings.

Other events which are very popular with the members are the three local indoor Karting evenings and members also participate in Rallycross, Race Meetings and Rallies.

MEMORIAL TROPHY FOR SILHOUETTES


The 'RONNIE WOOD MEMORIAL TROPHY' will be presented to the competitor who in the opinion of a panel of Judges, has presented a tidy well prepared car on a relative shoestring budget with a competitive showing. As well as receiving the Ronnie Woods Memorial Trophy to be held for 11 months, the winner will also receive a replica and an £80.00 cash award. Last year this trophy was won by John Oxborrow driving his self built prototype sports car Ox 6.

The Ronnie Woods Memorial Trophy is an accumulative award in memory of Ronnie who was tragically killed at Silverstone in 1985 whilst racing his Modsports/GT Ginetta G15.

Ronnie was a Kent motorsport enthusiast who lived in Gravesend, who successfully campaigned a Modsports/GT Ginetta G15 during the early eights at various circuits around the country. He had quite a few outright and class wins at Lydden during that time, the circuit suiting the nimbleness of this car. It is therefore appropriate that this award be associated with Lydden Silhouette/GT

racing. The Trophy will be presented to the competitor in the Lydden series who competes in the style and manner that was typified by Ronnie. Namely a car that is well presented, self prepared for the most part and has utilised a 'shoestring' budget.

In 1997 Chris Everill was the recpient of the presigious award and Judges will be viewing the cars entered in all the qualifying events throughout the 1998 to decide exactly who will be the winner of 'RONNIE WOOD MEMORIAL TROPHY' will be for this season.

Race Report - 6th June 1998

All over the television Sunday 12th July 1998 was made out to be the glorious twelfth of sport. However they seemed to forget that the greatest sporting action of the day was SEMSEC's latest meeting at a very wet Lydden circuit. OK so I may be exaggerating slightly but with an ambitious nine-race programme there was action aplenty despite the treacherous conditions.

First to splash on to the circuit was a combined race for the DJ Invicta Silhouette Saloons and the TWMC Sports cars. With Steve Hall away John Oxborrow pushed his OX 7 to a mightily impressive pole position one and half seconds ahead of Robert Bridger now coming to terms with his new Starlet. Fastest of the Sports car runners, Paul

Sherlock lined up fourth in his Westfield just ahead of last years champ, John Lord. Bringing up the tail was Leigh Parkes slick shod TR7V8. With no wets his attitude was "I'm here so I'm going to race". When the race ran it was no surprise that the first three cars were silhouettes. What was a surprise was that when the flag fell they were covered by just three seconds after 10 laps round a swimming track surface. The order was the same as qualifying with John Oxborrow first, Robert Bridger then Rod Birley with the Honda Prelude. In the Sports Cars Paul Sherlock skilfully guided his car around to take the win with John Lord not far behind. Leigh Parkes came home last three laps adrift but gained championship points for second in class as just reward for his efforts.

Next out was a combined race for the Kent County Formula Ford zetec class and the RESB Single seater championship. Marius Erlandsen in the team Jamun car ahead of local man Peter Alexander won the race on the road. However the two had been duelling all race long despite the very wet conditions. Marius finally took the lead for the last time on the last lap in

the last corner. Sadly for Marius a yellow flag was being shown at the time which left the Clerk of the Course no choice but to dock him 10 seconds and therefore hand the win to Peter. First of the RESB runners was Matt Hayes who again showed his skills in the wet to stay ahead of Dave Connor.



One of the visiting championships was next up, the BRSCC Fiat Championship. This class caters for all front wheel drive varieties of the marque up to 1300 cc. The race was cut short when Clive Jones parked his car in a dangerous position at the elbow on lap eight. Kevin Walkers Uno took the honours ahead of Derek Flegg in his 128.

When the Sports Racing and GT cars come to Lydden it always seems to rain. For the spectators this means some very wild looking driving as these V8 monsters fight to get the power to the tarmac. Hong Kong driver Cheng Lim managed the best with the conditions to cross the line first in his Ram SC ahead of defending champion Paul Castaldini's Lister Knobbly.

The Drayton Manor Park MGs are regular visitors to SEMSEC's meetings. Twelve cars took to the grid in what became an eight-lap race. The poor conditions meant that by now the meeting was running late despite the organisers' best efforts. However when you have equally matched cars the race was never going to be spread that far, and so it proved. Rupert

Lloyd took the flag by just 0.2 of second from Dave Javes.

The Kent County Formula Fords were on one of their regular visits to SEMSEC but rarely have encountered worst conditions. In practise they had the worst of the rain and then one of the competitors spread an oil slick the Torre Canyon would have been proud of. Mark Langfield still managed to post and impressive time on his way to pole position ahead of old stager Trevor

Stiles. From the green light though it was ex rallycrosser Matt Hayes who made the best start taking the lead round the outside of Chesons on lap one. His lead was short lived though as Langfeild pushed ahead on lap two and held on to take the win from Hayes and in third Treyor Stiles.

Qualifying for the Formula One Racewear was thrown in to a lottery after the oil laid by the Formula Fords.


The first three laps were held in an American full course yellow whilst the combination of rain and tyres scrubbed the surface clean. Rod Birley made the best of the condition to post pole position ahead of Dave Abbott's Mini Miglia. 


