FLAG SIGNALS

Blue/ Steady: Another competitor is close.
Blue/ Waved: Another competitor is trying to pass.

White: Service vehicle or very slow moving car on circuit

Yellow/Steady: Danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down.

Yellow/Waved: Great danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down and be prepared to stop.

Yellow with Red stripes: Slippery surface ahead. Green: Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared. Also shown at marshals posts to indicate their positions to competitors on the first lap of all practice sessions.

Red: Stop racing, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals.

Black/Orange Disc displayed with White number: Warning of mechanical failure or of a fire which might not be obvious to the driver. Call into pits immediately.

Black/White Rectangular displayed with White number: Warning to driver that his behaviour is suspect and he may be black flagged.

Black displayed with White number: Driver must return immediately to the paddock and report to the Clerk of Course.

Black and White Chequered: End of race.

National Flag: This is used to start races in the absence of electric starting lights, and where races have split starts.

BILL CHESSON

We are sad to announce that Bill Chesson, the founder of Lydden Circuit and the organiser of the Rochester Air Shows, died on Wednesday, at the age of 76.

Bill was a one-off, a showman and promoter rather than just a man who built the circuit as a business venture. He started in the mid-fifties by buying up old cars, storing them at Geddinge Farm nearby, and then leasing them out to anyone who wished to race them around the grazing land which has since been developed into the current circuit.

That was the start of banger racing. At that time he could have had no idea that he would go on to invent rallycross as well as the world-famous international speedtrack event which attracted world champions such as Barry Briggs, Ronnie Moore, Ivan Mauger and Ole Olsen.

The construction of a tarmac track in 1960 allowed many racing drivers to serve their apprenticeship, notably James Hunt and Damon Hill. Having built up the track and extended it to its current length Bill became respected as a firm but fair promoter and one who always fought for what he believed was right for "his" competitors.

It was a clash with the RAC over their insistence that he should erect armco barriers (which he felt were dangerous for motorcycle racers) which eventually led to him selling the circuit to Tom Bissett in 1989.

Bill had not been at all well for the last three years. Our thoughts are with his wife Ann, two sons Will and Richard, and two daughters Liz and Vicky. There are nine grandchildren. The family wish to have a private funeral, so no flowers, please.

Donations should be shared between the RSPCA and the ACU Riders Benevolent Fund. Arrangements are in hand for a memorial service, details of which will be announced soon.

Motorsport will never be quite the same without Bill Chesson.

As a tribute to Bill, the organisers of today's meeting, the British Automobile Racing Club, London & Home Counties Centre, request spectators, competitors and officials to observe one minute's silence immediately before racing commences this afternoon.

AFTER the spectacular Easter event at Lydden Rallycross returns to the circuit on August Bank Holiday Monday.

At the Easter Monday meeting, Tony Bell hit the headlines - and a very solid bank which launched his Toyota Corolla into a series of somersaults pictured below.

Bell's dramatic exit came at the climax of the meeting, the Supercar Final. After a bad start the Durham driver was making ground rapidly in his efforts to gain a place on the rostrum.

But on the penultimate lap, as he accelerated out of North Bend with a reputed 640 horse-power under his right foot, he lost control and slewed onto the verge. The Toyota careered down Hairy Hill on the grass, launched itself high into the air off a protective earth bank and then landed in the middle of the track with a sickening crunch. There was a brief flicker of flame from the engine compartment, but mercifully the fire never took hold.



Marshals were quickly on the scene to rescue the trapped driver, who was still conscious. He was given oxygen while the car was cut away from around him. Then he was removed to hospital and fortunately, was allowed to leave later that evening with nothing worse than severe bruising.

The London & Home Counties Centre of the British Automobile Racing Club extends a warm welcome (literally, we hope) to everyone at this, our second meeting of the season.

We hope that the strong entry and varied categories will combine to provide some excellent entertainment.

The sixth round of the national Modified Production Saloon Championship is just one of the highlights in today's nine-race programme.

So far the series has proved highly competitive with a different winner at each round. As the championship reaches the halfway stage the current champion, Scott Austin (Escort RS2000) is just one point behind the series leader, Doug Anderson (Peugeot 205 GTi). But Richard Shepherd (Fiesta XR2) and the most recent winner, John Warren (Ford Capri) are close behind, we should see a good battle for the lead.

The Modprods will be running together with the regular Lydden Silhouette contenders such as Rod Birley (Escort-Cosworth) and Bill Richards (Metro-Cosworth), and so it will be interesting to see how the two categories compare.

The two MG Owners' Club's championships, for Midgets, Bs and Maestros are just as close - too close at times, because the cars are very evenly-matched and so contact is almost unavoidable. But it does make for very exciting racing. Long-time Midget campaigner Terry Farman has a firm grip on the sports car category at the moment, while the saloon series seems to be developing into a battle between Andy Campbell and John Lane.

The racing is just as tight in the other two national championship rounds - the BARC/BRDC K

Sports Clubmans series and the Caterham Graduates Championship - although the more exposed wheels mean that the drivers need to be a little more judicious when going for a narrow gap in the heat of the battle.

The ever-popular K Sports category is currently led by Peter Clark from David "Ipsden" Williams, while in the Caterham Graduate Championship Christian Marryat and David "Guildford" Williams are the ones to watch.

CLOSER

Of the remaining Lydden championships it's even closer in the F1 Racewear Saloon series where Ashford's Craig Dawson leads Birley by just one point. Paul Sherlock seems to have the upper hand in the sports car series, but John Dewing and the ever-improving John Lord are close behind in the championship chase.

And in the Single Seaters event Matt Hayes must be the favourite, although Anthony Wadie will be hoping to build up his championship lead as Dennis O'Sullivan, who is currently tying with him on points, has not entered for today.

The meeting ends with a Closed Wheel invitation event to give us all another chance of some excellent racing and value for money. Please enjoy it.

SMART CAR PRESENTATION

The BARC (L&HCC) has decided to offer a prize of £50 to the driver of the "best presented car" at each of its Lydden race meetings this year as an incentive to make cars look even smarter.

The decision will be made by a panel of judges consisting of the Chief Scrutineer, the Commentator and a Centre official.

The winner of the award at the Centre's first meeting of the season in May was Nicholas Oakes, from Heathfield, who drives the green Cooper S (see page 10) which will also be taking part today.

Some 86 years ago - on December 12 1912 to be precise - a group of cyclecar enthusiasts gathered at the Hut Hotel, Wisley, in Surrey to compare notes on their machines.

Cyclecars (virtually four-wheeled powered cycles) provided the real enthusiasts motoring of those days, and the group decided there and then to form the Cyclecar Club.

The Hut Hotel was demolished in 1978 to make way for the old Portsmouth Road improvements, but the little acorns sown that day sprang into the mighty oak that is today's British Automobile Racing Club. And last year it was the club's proud boast that it organised more events of International Status than any other in the world.

The Cycle Car Club was soon to become the Junior Car Club, racing at Brooklands and elsewhere in Britain, organising foreign tours and generally looking after the interests of the enthusiast. Brooklands was to play a big part in the BARC's childhood and adolescence, as the JCC was

destined to merge with the Brooklands Automobile Racing Club to become the modern day British Automobile Racing Club.

The BARC's past is mile-stoned with all the great races at Brooklands, Donington, the Goodwood Formula One and Formula Two meetings, the British Grand Prix at Aintree and Crystal Palace.

Brooklands was its first home, Goodwood

its second and, since 1968, Thruxton its third.

Housed in its headquarters at Thruxton the BARC now oversees race meetings at all the major circuits in the country and now oversees 18 of the 24 rounds of the British Touring Car Championship. The club officiates at the highly-successful Goodwood Festival of Speed and the

Goodwood Revival meeting.

In addition national race meetings are run throughout the country alongside sprint and hill climb championships in the hands of the successful network of local centres, including the London and Home Counties Centre.

THE Club - THE Centre

As one of the largest Centres in Britain's biggest and brightest motor club, the London and Home Counties Centre is truly a club within an club.


In 1955 the South Eastern Centre was formed, to be followed three years later by the Surrey Centre founded as the Leatherhead Group which became the North Thames Centre in 1962. These all amalgamated in 1977 to form the now highly-successful London and Home Counties Centre.

January 1st 2000 will see the Centre revert to the name South Eastern Centre to better reflect its area of activities. The

London and Home Counties name will continue through this year, while new marketing material is introduced ready for the change in the new Millennium.

This year the Centre will organise three race meetings at Lydden Circuit and copromote a finals day with the South East Motor Sports Enthusiasts Club at the circuit in October; co-promote three rallycross events at Lydden Circuit, organise two sprint meetings at Goodwood Circuit; it has already co-promoted a sprint meeting with Sevenoaks and District MC at Lydden Circuit and organised a championship sprint and race meeting at Silverstone's Stowe Circuit.




