Both the entrance into Gerards and the Exit are superb spots to watch from and adequate PA coverage is provided at all points on the circuit.



Will it be another Read victory?

. . . . or can Kenny

Roberts repeat his

Easter whitewash

Perhaps the most interesting part of this year's road racing scene has been the rise and fall in the fortunes of the once supreme Giacomo Agostini who started the year in devastating form by winning Daytona and Imola on the new 750 Yamaha. Although he has impeccably retained his 350 cc title for the seventh time, his spill in Sweden ended all real hopes of regaining the Senior title and left his hitherto untarnished reputation in considerable doubt, particularly after his disappointing performance at Mallory Park in June.

In spite of his third place in the Senior final, there were few who considered his performance worthy of him and later events have, perhaps, written him off in many people's minds as a force to be reckoned with in today's line-up. But it would be a mistake wouldn't it! Although mechanical problems and accidents have spelled a rather disastrous year for Giacomo, the fact remains that his early results with anyone else's name to them would have been hailed the world over rather than used as part proof that the maestro was losing his touch.

His double victory at the Dutch T.T. at the beginning of July rated as one of his finest outings. At the Belgian Grand Prix his new 500 was just not fast enough to keep with the M.V. and perhaps he was trying that bit too hard at the Swedish when he came off endeavouring to avoid Barry Sheene. Has the proud crown slipped beyond recall or will the real Agostini stand up again? Only time will tell.

Remember those two memorable victories in the United States and Italy; remember the classic battles with Kenny Roberts! Both mounted on the very best Yamahas they each gave of their best with the eventual victory on both occasions going to Agostini. Now, for the third time Agostini and Roberts clash again on the big 750's and although both are really in the same team—if you care to

accept Yamaha Europe and Yamaha USA as the same team—each will be out to take the laurels from the other. The once invincible Agostini will be out to stop Roberts achieving his Easter double at Mallory, and although the American must rank as the favourite on today's standings it would be wrong to rule out the Italian completely.

The clash between these two is an obvious attraction, given that they will both be fit and well mounted, but the outright favourite in this weekend's sporting spectacle is, of course, seven times world champion Phil Read. Victor at this meeting last year and joint lap record holder with Roberts and Saarinen. Phil repeated his winning streak in June with a win in the 1000 cc race but was forced into second place in the Senior final by Teuvo Lansiyouri whose one-fifth of a second

victory brought gasps from spectators at the Devil's Elbow. Even within the last 100 yards it could have been anyone's race. Teppe is only one of Phil's problems this weekend but remains one of the major threats particularly in view of the fact that, whereas Giacomo has been declining, the Fin has been steadily putting together some fine wins. He achieved a notable double at the Swedish Grand Prix in both 350 and 500 classes, beating Phil into second place in the 500 race. His performance has shot him into third place in the world championship table ahead of team-mate Giacomo.

Since he entered the M.V. Agusta factory team for the 1973 season. Phil has acted as mentor for the Italian rider Gianfranco Bonera and has been mainly responsible for coaching the rather inexperienced rider who joined M.V's as the second team member. I think even Phil will readily maintain that Franco needed little help, and unlike most Italian riders the world has known—with the odd exception of course—didn't suffer from the forceful nature which tends to typify the race when suddenly promoted to the absolute zenith. His progress has been steady, perhaps unexciting as we know the Italian style, but tremendously successful as he followed Phil into second place in the world championship table, producing a remarkable result for M.V. in view of their earlier difficulties with handling and speed and the promised dominance of the Yamaha in Agostini's hands. Not satisfied with second place all the time he put in a sprint at Imola in May and won himself a world championship round on home territory. His first appearance at Mallory in June was by no means disappointing and he achieved a third and fourth place on a circuit on which he wasn't confident.


Disappointing non-starter at last year's event, Dieter Braun will be making his first appearance at Mallory this time. He suffered concussion during a late meeting last season and the then 250 world champion had to reluctantly withdraw. This huge German raced works M.Z. machines before switching to his own privately entered Yamahas and was reputedly Phil Read's first choice for the M.V. team before Franco. He currently lies in third place in the world 250 championship and second in the 350 championship but both the Yugoslavian and Spanish rounds might well alter those positions. Always a superb rider, his experience on the world's circuits is second to none and his consistency unparalleled. If he can't win he will be found second, third or fourth and it is seldom you see his name out of the first six.



Whatever new names are added to this entry list before this programme goes to print there can be no doubt that this is possibly the finest entry ever assembled for a British short-circuit meeting. The trend these days in motor cycle sport at Mallory Park is continued with the wealth of talent lining up on the grid for each race. For the first time in its history, this Rothmans' sponsored meeting is a two day event with practice and qualifying races on Saturday. The majority of the top drivers are seeded into the finals to avoid the possibility of machine failure on Saturday robbing spectators of their just desserts during Sunday's feast; a sensible precaution aimed at protecting a rather expensive investment as well.

With the season drawing to a close, the championships at this meeting become more important with the ever impressive cash prizes at the end. Suzuki have an impressive one, two, three in the MCN Superbike battle with Barry Sheene, Paul Smart and Stan Woods, all of whom swing into action on Sunday. Tony Rutter and John Newbold contest the Rothmans 350 Championship which is progressively hotting up with every meeting run and the Motor Cycle International Sidecar

Championship could be effected by the appearance of Germany's Werner Schwarzel whose rapid pace will tend to demote the points of the other contenders. Werner came closer this year than anyone has for a long time to defeating the now six times world sidecar champion Klaus Enders. The ShellSPORT 500 Championship will see a tremendously hot battle with the M.V. stars on equal terms, with all capacities being equal instead of having to fight out slightly unfair terms with 750's!

Predictions cannot be founded on anything other than pure conjecture. If you feel like forecasting anything—try the weather!



Rothmans Aerobatic Team

In four years the Rothmans Aerobatic Team has become the feature of air displays throughout Britain and Europe that leaves the crowds gasping and pulls unstinted praise from the pro commentators who appreciate the technical achievement of the pilots as they carry out their precision routines. The story goes back to 1970 when Rothmans decided that they would challenge the crowd pulling power of the professional airforce teams by forming the first European full time civilian aerobatic team.

It was decided that the most suitable aircraft for the team was the Stampe S.V.4. biplane loved by pilots for its manoevrability and sweet handling characteristics. When the team was formed the Stampe had been out of production for 20 years. Rothmans faced a tough problem as they seat out to find aircraft that could be restored to 'as new' condition.

The search took them to Britain, France and the U.S. and eventually five aircraft meticulously prepared by Rollason Aircraft and Engines in Croydon gained their certificates of airworthiness. Most of the airplanes were equipped with Renault motors but one had the more powerful Gypsy Major unit. Painted in the blue, white and gold livery which was to become so familiar in British skies the aircraft were ready for their first display at Blackbushe Airfield, Surrey, in May 1970, only three months after formal discussion of the team's formation had started.

Leading the team then—and still in command—Squadron Leader 'Manx' Kelly, who retired from the R.A.F. after 19 years service to set-up the team. Whilst in the airforce he flew Meteors, Swifts, Hunters and Canberras. He is one of Britain's leading aerobatic champions. Starting competitive aerobatics in 1968 he won the Esso Tiger Flying Trophy flying a vintage Morane 230 in the following year. Since flying full time for Rothmans he has become British Champion in 1971 and has won the appropriately named winter Icicle Trophy in 1971, 1972 and 1973.

There have been changes in the team since 'Manx' lifted off the tarmac in 1970, but one of the pilots who is still with him is lain Weston another ex R.A.F. pilot and squadron leader who lead an R.A.F. formation aerobatic team in West Germany before he flew for Rothmans. The other full time pilots who make up the group are Mike Findlay, a Scotsman who as a co-pilot with the Queens Flight has carried every member of the Royal Family and Derek Mills who during his military service had solo aerobatic experience in Vampires and Jet Provosts. The main features of the teams display which was

The main features of the teams display which was gradually extended, include loops in diamond and vic formation, a Prince of Wales feather burst and tail chase and the rarely seen double mirror where two aircraft fly inverted in formation as mirror images of two further aircraft below them.

Despite continuous innovation and polishing of technique it became clear that development of the performance was being limited by the Stampe's capability. As 'Manx' says, "it was a constant struggle to gain and hold altitude". Rothmans therefore looked for an alternative. They chose the Pitts Special, described by 'Manx' as, "just about the greatest aerobatic aeroplane in the world". The Pitts is a remarkable aircraft in another respect. With its open cockpit, wood, welded steel tube and fabric construction and biplane configuration it looks like a throw-back to pre-world war two designs.

Yet in 1966 when almost everybody who was anybody in aerobatics was flying sleek all-metal construction monoplanes the Pitts arrived at the American Nationals and won. Bob Herendeen who flew the aircraft then went



on to be the highest placed American competitor at the 1966 Moscow World Championships and gained a second American Championship. Pitts beat everyone out of sight at the 1972 World Championships in France.

The Rothmans Pitts are S2 A's. This is the twin seat version, has a 200 H.P. lycoming motor and a constant speed propeller. The team chose this version because it is bigger than the single seater and therefore is easier to see and more enjoyable to watch at airshows. Equally the extra seat allows photographers, film cameramen, journalists and other passengers to be taken for flights. Since being re-equipped the Rothmans team has added the spectacular slow roll in box formation which no other team even those drawn from the armed forces can execute. 'Manx' flying solo undertakes a torque roll which imposes tremendous strain on both the man and machine. Over the four years of its existence the Rothmans team has been invited to fly at far more events than the group can cope with. Nonetheless it has performed at more than 250 airshows during the summer months including Farnborough and twice at the Paris Air Show. During a peak week the teams pilots will have a schedule which can involve three full airshows, several beach shows. ferrying in between and both press and filmwork. Such a routine requires that the aircraft are meticulously maintained. On occasion a mechanic and spares will fly with the team, but normally the work is carried out by Personal Plane Services at the team's base at Wycombe Air Park in Buckinghamshire.




