



Not everyone is able to make it to the Isle of Man, of course. Some of us have to work for a living. Others have to cope with nonsense like buying curtains or carpets. And the rest have to put up with the ridiculous notions of an angry wife, pile the family into the sidecar, strap on a deck-chair and/or mother-in-law, and spend a frustrating week at some dreadful seaside resort which looks nothing like Douglas.

So—we unfortunates eagerly glue our ears to our transistor radios on the Big Days, fighting off the kids and ignoring pleas for "Mrs. Dale's Diary" to listen to those beautiful sounds of MVs and Hondas and Yamahas shrieking their way around those magical and serpentine 37³/₄ miles of Manx countryside.

For those who are lucky enough to have made the annual pilgrimage and more especially for those who haven't, the East Midland Centre of the ACU and Motor Circuit Developments Ltd. have gone to enormous trouble to assemble for your entertainment today just about the biggest gathering of racing talent we have ever seen on the mainland. You realise, of course, that this is the first occasion this year on

which all the reigning world champions in the classes for which today's meeting caters are racing at the same venue on the same day? The entry list looks like the visitors book on Coronation Day.

Right at the top of the tree there are Mike Hailwood and Giacomo Agostini. Many millions of words have been written about the talents and personalities of these two — and the "titanic struggles" and "epic battles". Suffice to say that they will be titanically struggling and epically battling today and that one—or perhaps both—will be taking that familiar slow ride around the circuit on the back of the truck, wreathed in smiles and laurels and waving a very empty bottle of "champers".

Friend of Hailwood — and of most people, actually, with the possible exception of the odd continental race official—is Bill Ivy, world champion in the 125 c.c. class. His little Yamaha is bound to be at the forefront today—but not if Stuart Graham can help it. Stuart has the works model which the Suzuki factory loaned him following their withdrawal from the sport earlier this year. In the 250 c.c. class there's Ivy again,

together with his team-mate Phil Read who lost his world championship to Hailwood last year. Look for either of those two fairings coming first out of the Devil's Elbow.

Those so far mentioned are on the exotic, multi-cylindered, terrifyingly-fast works machines and may be expected—hardly surprisingly—to gather all the glory. But those in pursuit make up an entry list which would make any enterprising promoter burst his waist-coat buttons with pride.

There's John Hartle, who has 350 and 500 c.c. Metisses to contend with the Honda and MV of Hailwood and Agostini.

Reigning "Master of Mallory" and "King of Brands" as well as being British 350 c.c. champion, Dave Croxford is going to show you just how he won two titles in one weekend. John Cooper will be intent on taking those well-known knees first past the flag. Ron Chandler, current British champion in the 500 c.c. class, has a brace of those beautiful Colin Seeley machines with him. And Percy Tait, who doesn't always have the best of luck, has the 500 c.c.

Triumph. Basically standard, so they say.

There's Australian Kel Carruthers with a trio of machines—125 c.c. Honda, 350 c.c. Aermacchi/Metisse and 500 c.c. Norton; Ray Pickrell, Griff Jenkins and Pat Mahoney on enormous, 750 c.c. Norton twins; Rex Butcher and his 500 c.c. Norton; Rod Gould has that phenomenally quick 250 c.c. Yamaha as well as a 500 c.c. Norton.

For sidecar enthusiasts—and who isn't?—the names should be spoken of in hushed tones. World champion, little West German Klaus Enders (BMW) and Countryman, double T.T. winner Siefried Schauzu (BMW) are here. So is fellow German Otto Kolle and his BMW. And former world champion Helmut Fath has that extraordinary four-cylinders Urs. There's a powerful big contingent from around Birmingham way. All on Brummagem-made BSAs are the Hanks family—father Fred, sons Roy and Norman; Bill Boddice and young Mick; and Chris Vincent and Peter Brown.

If you don't leave here bedazzled, breathless and very impressed, you might as well take up crochet.






