



Francis Beart writes ...

An introduction to the eleventh Mallory Park B.P.-sponsored "Vintage Motor Cycle Race of the Year" on July 1st, 1979

July 1st, 1979

I first became aware of motor cycles at the age of twelve, when I was a day boy at Dulwich College. Going there was no trouble but coming back up the hill to my parents home was hard work. Never having been keen on walking, I could not help but notice — and hear — the 680 cc Indian ridden by a senior boy named Cox, and I made up my mind that I would own a motor cycle.

That decision led to many years of very happy racing, and in 1960 Terry Shepherd, whom Shell Mex were then sponsoring, introduced me to Mallory Park as an entrant. I had a contract with Lew Ellis, Shell's competitions manager, and I was providing Terry with machines for the TT, Ulster Grand Prix, Silverstone, Oulton and Mallory meetings. He was to ride my 499 Manx Norton ad 7R AJS I had purchased from Harold Daniell. I had a new Thames van with a high axle ratio so driving to Mallory and other meetings was a real pleasure. We enjoyed the racing and that to me is very important.



The run up from Brook in Surrey was 130 miles so with a 5 a.m. start we could be at Mallory in time for scrutineering which began at 8 a.m. and then have breakfast. One of the best things at Mallory was the absence of red-tape. We always seemed welcome, which makes such a difference.

After the 1960 season, Avon Tyres asked us to carry out tests on tyres at Mallory during the winter; for this, we used the 499 Manx. The weather was bitterly cold. Avon arrived with a number of tyres, none of which Terry was allowed to see. He would test a tyre on the circuit but it was possible to do only eight or nine laps at a stretch before he had to come in for a warm-up over a coke fire. Testing took two days, Avon having booked us all in at a Nuneaton hotel. After many tests, a very soft compound, known as the Avon Sport, was found to be best. It was worth a second a lap.

We managed to obtain one of these tyres for the 1961 Race of the Year meeting at Mallory and my assistant Phil Kettle helped to prepare a new 499 Manx with a view to winning. The machine was fettled with the utmost care and lightened wherever possible. As it was not to be used for long distances, it could have among other things small petrol and oil tanks.

The motor had a twin-plug head, the second plug being exactly opposite the original. This meant removing the cambox to change a plug, but we never oiled a plug at any time, even at the TT, Ulster GP etc., when starting from cold with the race plug on the offside and a soft plug in the nearside. We tested the machine thoroughly and set the ignition at 28 degrees before top dead centre; Terry was very pleased with the performance.

On the day of the meeting, I had arranged to take Phil Kettle with me. As things turned out, that was very fortunate — in practice, Terry was unlucky to drop the machine at the Hairpin and the accident wrote off the front forks.

Bob McIntyre was also riding that day and as I knew him well, I asked him if he had any spare fork legs. He offered the front end from his 7R Special, which had Norton forks and a Gilera front wheel, provided we put everything back before he left for Glasgow. We managed to effect repairs just in time for me to ride the machine round the paddock to check the new front end.

Terry made a shocking start and for some time I did not bother to follow his progress. He was about 18th when someone said, "Your runner is going through the field like a dose of salts," and shortly afterways Terry passed the race leader Mike Hailwood (Norton) and stayed ahead for several laps. Then Terry's righthand footrest worked loose and his foot kept slipping off — Terry always raced with the ends of his footrests turned up — and the loose rest cost us a second a lap. Mike, of course, won but we managed to finish second and won £250. We refitted the front end to Bob's machine and thanked him for his generosity, which was so like him.
