NATIONAL SEASON OPENS

A preview of today's racing

After the winter lay-off Britain's top-ranking road-racers face the starting flag for the first time this season at the First National Road Races Mallory Park meeting today. The prize money of £1,500 is sure to add excitement to an already star-studded array of top talent.

Rivals—and friends

Great buddies off the track, but deadly rivals on it, John Cooper from Derby—the local favourite at this Midlands venue—and Londoner Dave Croxford are sure to be out for a one-upmanship win at this opening meeting. The value of a victory is a great boost to a rider's morale!

John Cooper has recently bought a Colin Seeley-built Matchless—it will be remembered that on his first ride on this type of machine late last year John romped away from the opposition. He's been practising hard in recent weeks for this meeting—so watch out! Croxford continues to ride the Oakley machines, including a Seeley AJS 350.

Popular stars

But these two apart, the programme entry bristles with top-ranking favourites in all classes. Making his welcome return to racing after his late-season tumble that kept him on the sidelines for much of the latter half of 1967 will be John Hartle. John—Mellano Trophy and Production TT winner prior to the accident—rides an Aermacchi-Metisse 350 and a Cowles Metisse in the 500 class.

Dan Shorey, still a first place contender after almost 14 seasons' racing, rides his quick Petty-prepared Nortons. Flying the Tom Kirby flag on the immaculate "I'm backing Britain" red, white and blue AJS and Matchless-Metisse machines is Alan Barnett, the promising Iver, Bucks, rider, while British Champion Ron Chandler rides brother Reg Kirby's Seeley 350 and Matchless machines.

And there are other top men in the line-up.

Griff Jenkins (350 Norton and 750 Curley-Norton), Rex Butcher (Kawasaki), Joe Francis (Domiracer), Eddie Crooks

(250 Suzuki), Steve Spencer (Yamaha and Nortons), Ray Pickrell (who has yet to nominate his machines) and Paul Smart will all be there. Smart is making his debut on the Ted Broad Yamaha previously raced by Reg Everett; he also rides a Lawton Aermacchi and a semi-works BSA.

Add Malcolm Uphill, Barry Randle, Rob Fitton (third in last year's Grovewood Awards scheme) and Dave Simmonds and you have the ingredients of a first-class quality meeting. Simmonds has a trio of Kawasaki machines and is making his return to racing after his Ulster GP crash last year.

Triumph

Surprise (and sensational) winner of the last big race of the 1967 season at Mallory, Percy Tait, the long-standing works Triumph rider, brings his Daytona model to the grid. Manx winner Brian Ball moves up into the professional status racing with a pair of Yamaha machines and a Norton.

Sidecars

Without a "Mini" in sight, the three-wheeler class looks to be very interesting. Chris Vincent, still the sidecar ace, brings his new low-kneeler into action, confident after winter trials, to compete against his great rival Peter Brown. Both, of course, ride BSA 650s.

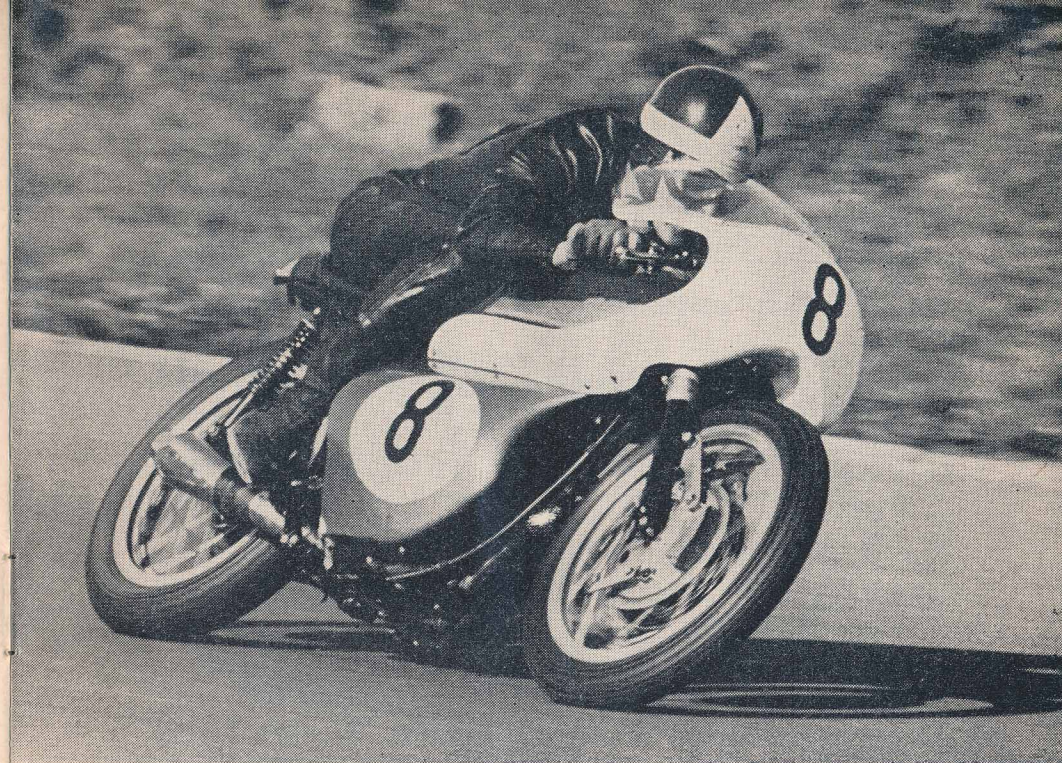
Veteran Bill Boddice and his Premier Grovewood Award-winning son Mick also use BSA engines for their machines, as do the Hanks family (father Fred and sons Norman and Roy) and the most consistent Terry Vinicombe, who has a new, lower model for this season.

Roy Pollard uses a Hillman Minx engine in his special, while Pete Horton has an NSU Prinz unit in his outfit.

Two ladies—Mrs. Rose Arnold (with Norman Hanks) and Jennie Beale (with husband Roy)—add glamour to the occasion, while Terry Harrison, Vincent's ex-partner, adds interest with his Mini-Cooper-engined special of unorthodox styling.

A lot at stake

With so much prize money at stake, riders will be anxious to shake free the cobwebs of winter resting and will road into action for this attractive meeting. Highlight is the 1000 cc final for 1000 cc machines that will prove a test of stamina as well as machine preparation and pace.
