

Hot and exciting a view of today's Rothmans International

The Post TT International has now become a tradition in every sense of the term following closely upon the Isle of Man TT, Britain's contribution to the world championship.

Barry Sheene heads the entry list on 500 and 750 Suzukis entered by Suzuki of Great Britain. Since giving up his Yamahas and consequently any hope of competing successfully in the world championships, Barry's switch to the more unfamiliar bigger capacity machines has been without significant success for a good while. However, all this came to an end at Clermont Ferrand three weeks ago when Barry had very little trouble disposing of the entire entry including his closest rivals, the John Player Nortons of Peter Williams and Dave Croxford, who will in all probability be out to seek quick revenge today. Barry retained his King of Brands crown after a rush back from France so will be well prepared for today's meeting at one of his favourite circuits. Although bruised and battered after his latest spill at Brands the indominatable spirit which is Barry Sheene remains unquenched—except perhaps by a few quick ones afterwards!

Stan Woods, Barry's team-mate, will make his first appearance at Mallory on the watercooled 750. Stan finished fourth at Clermont which is significant as this was his first placing on the 750. Previously renowned for his ability on smaller

two-strokes, Stan, like Barry, will take a while getting used to the ultimate power. Ignoring the stars for a moment, let us look at a newcomer to the scene and one who has quietly devastated fortunes at Mallory. In March, John Cooper loaned his "old" 350 Yamsel to a 20-year-old rider from Jacksdale, Nottingham—John Newbold. This butcher's son finished third in the first qualifying round of the British 750 championship on a 350 and headed Dave Potter, Geoff Barry and Alan Barnett across the finishing line. At the Spring Bank Holiday meeting we witnessed one of the most dramatic of all races for the Rothmans 20 lap 350 Trophy, which he won from Bob Heath and John Cooper, at the same time breaking Mike Hailwood's ten year old race record, although it should, of course, be recorded that there have been precious few, if any, 20 lappers for the 350 class since then.

Thinking of 750s, once again thoughts turn to the John Player team—Peter Williams and new team-mate Dave Croxford. Peter was significantly one of the most stylish and successful riders at the Easter match races and has since further reinforced his determination with a win at Brands and a third place at the second round of the F I M 750 championship, putting him into equal third with Walter Villa with five more rounds to go.

Tony Jefferies on a three-cylinder Triumph is making a one-man attack on the works machines. Tony won the 1971 Junior TT in devastating style; won the National Formula 750 race the same week and was second to Ray Pickrell last year in that incredibly fast Formula 750 race. He had trouble at Easter with his home-brewed three' and somewhere hopes for his luck to change. It could have already changed during TT week.

Today's racing will be hard fought, make no mistake. The laurels will be earned the hard way with every inch a struggle. We wish competitors safe and successful racing and spectators a memorable day's sport.



Motor Cycle News Superbike Series



Britain's leading Superbike heroes return from the Isle of Man for today's fourth round of the MCN Superbike series.

After three rounds, Peter Williams leads on the John Player Norton. He is six points ahead of Suzuki GB rider Stan Woods, who scored his first major victory when he won the last round, at Brands Hatch.

The championship is scored in world style—15, 12, 10, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1—with five bonus points to the rider setting the fastest lap at each round. If the fastest lap is shared, each rider receives five points.

Points scored in all rounds will count. Similar to the past two years, the last round, at Brands Hatch on October 28, will count as double points with double prize money.

Leading scores after three rounds: Peter Williams 37, Stan woods 31, Barry Ditchburn 25, Daxe Croxford and Barry Sheene 20, Tony Jefferies 17, Paul Smart 15, Barrie Scully 11, Dave Nixon 8, John Barton and Percy Tait 6.

In a new bonus system, amounts of £35, £20, £10 and £5 will be given to the first four men to cross the line at the end of the sixth, 12th and 18th laps. In addition, there will be a mystery prize of £15. This award will be kept secret until shortly after the start of each of the eight races in the series.

Norton Villiers again back the fastest lap award with a £25 prize at each round. Today's round is being backed by Lewis Leathers, Britain's oldest established suppliers of racing clothing.






