

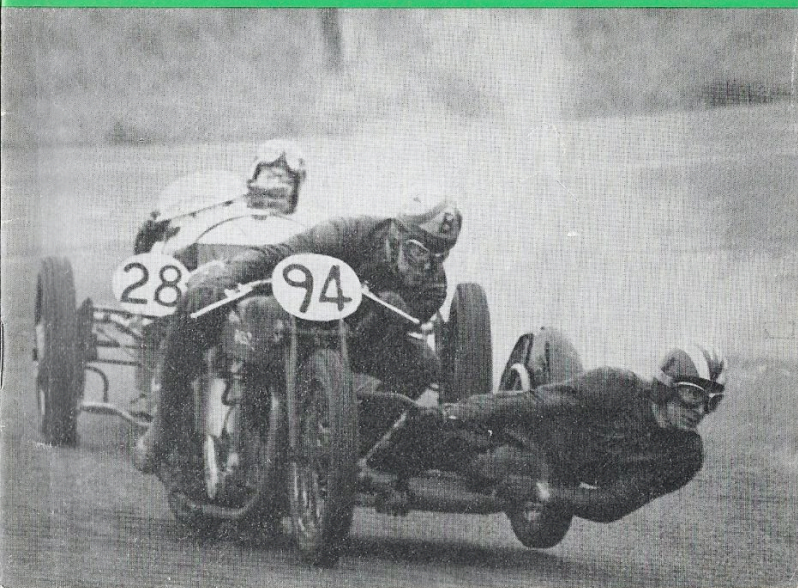

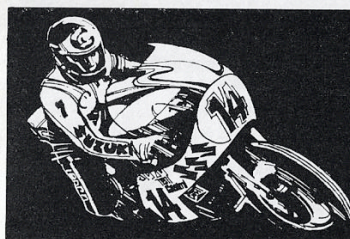

## Stanley Woods writes . . .

### An introduction to the BP Vintage Motor Cycle Race of the Year

(When Val Ward, Racing Section PRO, invited Stanley to write the Introduction to the programme this year, he did not know the great man was in hospital. But, typically, Stanley Woods shook off the effects of the "dope" after his operation to make this contribution).

As I sit up in bed to write these few words, it is with sorrow in my heart, for having just had another hip replacement operation, it seems unlikely that I shall be able to attend this year's meeting.

This is not definite, for like a lot of the old-time bikes that you will see today, there is still plenty of life in me—I've just got to be patient until the new parts are run in and all controls working properly.

The Mallory Park vintage meeting is to me the highspot of the year, for it is here that each year I meet so many of the men who, to the "average spectator," are just names from the past. To me, they are companions from a distant era, friends with whom I shared the joys of living . . .

. . . Of rising, for instance, at 4 a.m. on a sometimes bleak morning in the Isle of Man to do, probably, three or four laps before the roads were open and we were flagged off. Then, over a cup of scalding Cadbury's, to swap lies and generally try to cod one another. Or possibly to learn that so-and-so had done a bit of gardening at such-and-such a place. This was a term invented, if I remember correctly, by my namesake Stanley "Ginger" Wood, to describe some involuntary help given to the Highways Board by a rider who had modified the boundary of the course; a thankless job, for no acknowledgment was ever received from the Highways Board! More serious incidents were not treated in this light-hearted manner . . .

And I remember the bikes of yesteryear. These are what made my life and it gives me the greatest pleasure to see them in action after thirty, forty, even fifty years. But knowing the effort that went into them, from the drawing board stage through all the complicated processes of manufacture to the testing and tuning, and then the final modifications before production began, their survival is what I would expect.

What gives me the greatest pleasure of all is to know that young men, and some not so young, can appreciate the value of these old bikes and be prepared to spend so many hours—uncountable, I am sure—and so much hard cash in the rebuilding and tuning of the old warriors . . . especially when one remembers that the industry that created so many fine machines is no longer with us, so that they must depend on themselves and expect no factory support—not even technical advice—and sometimes owners get their machines to go even faster than when they left the factory.

To the riders and their helpers, I offer my thanks and my congratulations, to both winners and losers, for without the latter there would be no racing. I am sure that all old-time riders, and the spectators here today, will join me in wishing all competitors the best of luck and in thanking the Vintage Club for organising what I trust will be a magnificent event.

May we be blessed with good weather and may I be fit enough to be with you. I feel better already.

## Machines and riders today

Many machines of the type Stanley Woods rode, or rode against, are in action today. For instance, the 1935 350 Velocette of Bruce Boulton, the 1936 348 Norton of William Dodge, the 1927 492 Sunbeam of Peter John, John Broster's 499 1929 Rudge, the 1935 500 Norton of Christian Olivaux, from France.

Opposing them will be some less well-known makes—the mid-Thirties 250 New Imperial singles of John Siddons and Colin Taylor, Kenneth Lee's 1937 248 Excelsior, Geoff Pollard's 1948 490 Cotton, the 1936 499 Matchless of Christopher Davies, and several big-single Ariels.

Though Chris Williams is unlikely to be dicing (he suffered injuries in a recent road accident), there will be plenty of thrilling battles to hold spectators' attention. Up-and-coming riders should test experienced men—and women, for the ladies get their big chance in the three-wheeler events. Look for pilots Rosemary Wilkinson and Celia Walton and passenger Christine Gagg, in sidecar outfits, and Penelope Harper and Caroline Andrews in the Morgans.

Possibly slower, but no less interesting, the belt-drive machine parade at the lunch interval will include many historic specimens, several ridden by famous personalities of the vintage era. The fifty or so entries date from 1900 to the early Twenties, and will provide rare opportunities for photographers.

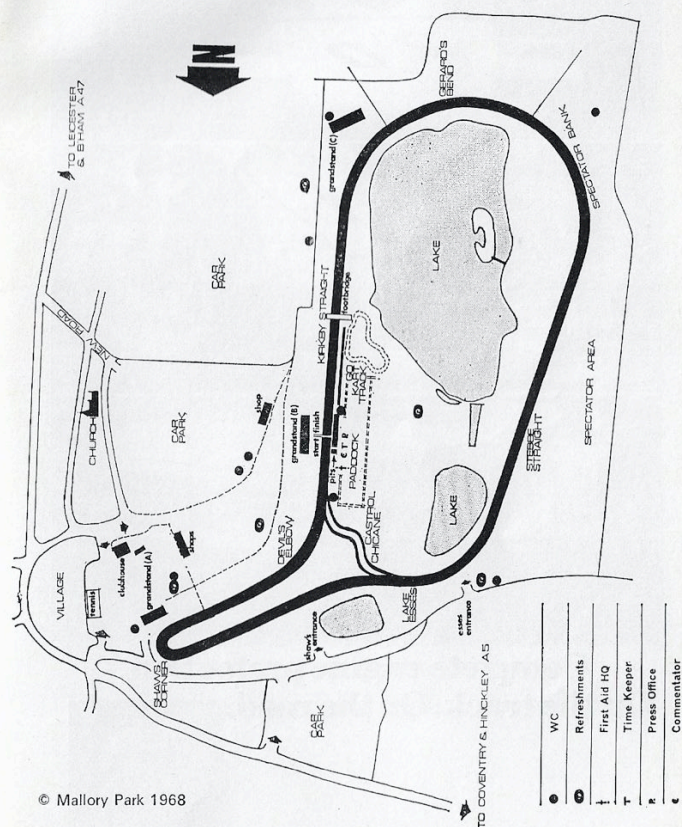

Lap Distance — 1.35 miles

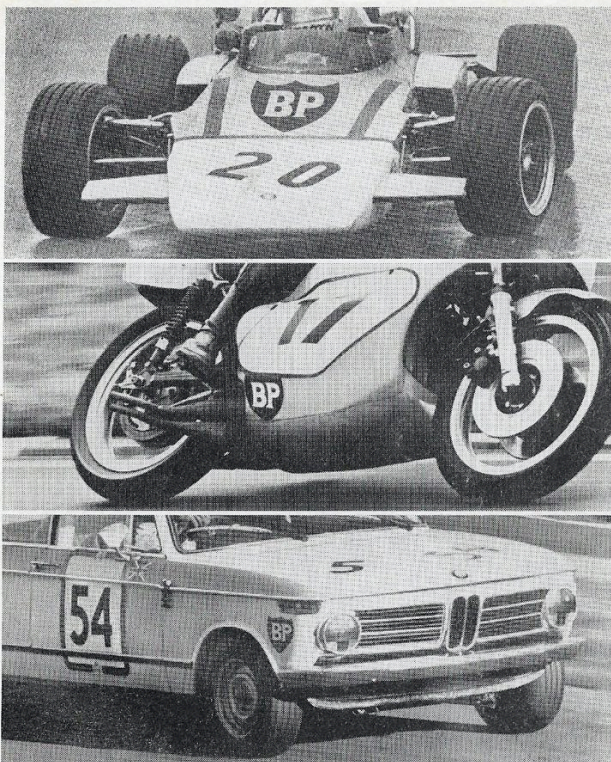
Short Circuit — 1 mile
