





Shell 500cc Championship provides sizzling start to the season


TODAY, March 1, is the date set by the Auto-Cycle Union (governing body for the sport in this country) for the resumption of motorcycle racing. Mallory Park, one of the most popular of all circuits with two-and three-wheeled dicers, provides the curtain-raiser to an eightmonth season with a talent-studded National meeting that promises well for 1970.

One of the highlights of today's events will undoubtedly be the three heats and the 15-lap (20 miles) final for the opening round of the new Shell 500 cc Championship series. One of the main points of interest to all concerned with motorcycle racing in this country will be the use of clutch starts for this event. There has been much speculation about this new innovation and now that it can be seen, perhaps the doubts in some people's minds will be allayed. This contest will extend over another eight meetings — four more at Mallory, three at Brands Hatch and one at Oulton Park. Points will be awarded to the first six finishers in each final in the series—8, 6, 4, 3, 2 and 1—and the rider with the highest number of points at the end of the season will receive £100 and a trophy. There will also be cash prizes of £50, £25, £15 and £10 for the second to fifth best performers in the Shell series.

Top contenders—to judge from a glance at today's programme—will include Dave Croxford, now riding his own Ray Petty tuned Norton; Mick Andrew and Pat Mahoney on Kuhn Seeleys; Alan Barnett (Kirby); John Cooper, Paul Smart, Cliff Carr and Irishman Brian Steenson, all on Seeleys; Peter Williams (Arter Matchless); Ron

Chandler (Reg Kirby Triumph) and Rex Butcher (Quaife Metisse). Interesting entries in the biggest solo class also include Barry Sheene's 360 c.c. Bultaco; Brian Lee's 382 cc Lawton Aermacchi; and a three-cylinder two-stroke Kawasaki from Japan, to be raced by Warrington's Stanley Woods.

At the other end of the scale there is the programme opener, the eight-lap 125 cc race in which a wide range of competing machines includes Japanese Hondas and Yamahas, Spanish Bultacos, West German Maicos and an East German MZ, and one of the unusual desmodromic Ducatis from Italy, to be ridden by Dennis Trollope. Londoner Barry Sheene should make the pace on his works Bultaco but will have to watch out for Andrew Manship from Leicester, on a Padgett Yamaha, fellow-Londoner Terry Grotefeld (MZ), Grant Gibson and Carl Ward, both with Maicos, and some of the other Bultaco men like Fred Launchbury and Canadian Nick Mayo.


The 250 cc field has a strong Yamaha element, with Paul Smart, Andrew Manship, Derek Chatterton and Tony Rutter likely to be well placed. Their rivals include Jim Curry (Honda), Sheene on a Bultaco, and Steenson on the Queens University "special"—a revolutionary, computer-developed two-stroke, now housed in a Seeley frame.

A mixture of 350 cc Yamahas, Seeleys, Nortons and Italian Aermacchi: these make up most of the entry for the two heats of the 350 cc class. Dave Croxford on his ex-Rodney Gould Yamaha; John Cooper, Derek Chatterton and Paul Smart, all also on Yamahas; Steenson, Butcher and the Kuhn pair, all with Seeleys; Brian Lee and Brian Kemp (Aermacchis); Barnett on the Tom Kirby racer; and Jim Curry (Honda) will all be about the place.

However exciting the solo events may be, on the 1.35-mile Mallory circuit there is always a chance that they will be eclipsed by the side-cars for sheer thrills. And with a long list of reserve names in the programme, both heats of the 1,000 cc Three-wheeler class are going to have their full complement of starters.

On paper it looks like being a tussle between the lone Greenwood Mini tri-car, in the competent hands of Andrew Chapman, and a whole bunch of Birmingham sidecar men with B.S.A.-powered outfits. They include Chris Vincent, Peter Brown, Mick Boddice, and the Hanks trio—father Fred and sons Norman and Roy.

Big 998 cc Vincents also figure in the line-up, their drivers including Jack Trustham and Malcolm Attrill. Sheffield veteran Charlie Freeman is among those using a 750 cc Norton; there are the usual "specials"; and a few 650 cc Triumphs, their drivers including lan Macdonald and Michael Horspole.


