Great Men and Machines are here today

Personally, I find it difficult to even begin to describe today's programme, perhaps because I belong to a generation which is not impressed with the type of machine that is a relic of the past. Sad though we all must be that British superiority waned in the face of European domination, the fact remains that history, though once kind, is now something which is perhaps best forgotten. This almost sounds a degrading thing to say about events which have led to this third vintage Motor Cycle Race of the Year. In reality the vast majority of race-goers are of an age that prevented them from witnessing John Surtees astride the M. V. Agusta, or even Gary Hocking come to that, so the lists of entries in today's programme are little more than a curiosity; unless they have a particular interest or enthusiasm for this type of event. Perhaps your father, like my own, has the unhappy knack of reregaling scenes of bygone days when you could buy a motorcycle for next-door-to-nothing and enjoy yourselves on the roads of Merry

for next-door-to-nothing and enjoy yourselves on the roads of Merry England without a care in the world, unless it was the over-reling anxiety about the weather which could shatter your dreams of

trouble-free motoring for that day at least. I was never particularly impressed and I don't believe that many people of my own age were either! A decent big machine under the posterior that can eat up the miles, handle like a dream and stop when called upon to do so is far removed from the early days of acetylene lamps, belt drive and an oil pump which would keep starving itself if you didn't prime it occasionally

prime it occasionally.

drive and an oil pump which would keep starving itself if you clon't prime it occasionally. But history is interesting nevertheless and although we don't go back as far as Michel's steam driven velocipede of 1869, we can present today some of the more interesting machines of later years that have made history not only on the racing circuits of Europe but also in everyday usage. Between 1905 and 1916 we saw the appearance of flexible cables, sprung front forks, control levers, and section leather belt drives—rather than rawhide ones which were twisted into oval shapes—while on the American models, particularly the Indian, chain drives replaced the belt. Instruments started appearing and when, by 1914, Indian had produced an all electric lighting system which even acted a starter motor, the motor cycle was really on its' way.

The volume and variety of motorcycle manufacture had lead progressively to active racing competition commencing at the turn of the century, and a whole new era erupted when the first road race was staged in the Isle of Man in 1905 eventually leading to the first Tourist Trophy in 1907. The law of England at the time prevented speeds in excess of 20 m.p.h. but then, as now, the Isle of Man had a government of its' own which welcomed an increase in trade and thus laid the foundation to the fast development of the modern motorcycle.

From such early beginnings much has happened, today's veteran and belt drive cavalcade bearing witness to the passing years in

just a short few laps of the circuit.

just a short few laps of the circuit.
Brooklands came and then was gone again. Donnington Park, Haddenham, Boreham Wood and then Silverstone and Blandford all played a part in marking Britain's contribution to the history of motor cycling. Different 'eras' produced different names of stardom: Bert Levack, Freddie Dixon, Jimmie Simpson, Stanley Woods, Harold Daniell, Les Graham, Freddie Frith, Eric Oliver, Maurice Cann, Geoff Duke, Fergus Anderson, Cecil Sandford, Bill Lomas and many, many more who were heroes to the many millions of spectators throughout Europe. Many of those riders are in the paddock now and during the rest of today will relive part of their former glory and a few will even hop astride a marque of machine similar to that which they rode in the old days to give both themselves and you, the spectator, a taste of things now past. a taste of things now past.

To me, this is perhaps the most interesting part of the day for their names are legend and even though I haven't seen them in action except on previous exhibitions, I'm a willing victim to such a grand

parade. In todays parade you can count no less than eight world championships and 23 T.T. victories all within eight riders. **Freddie Frith** won every 350 c.c. race in the first year of the world championships ending up with the 1949 world championship and the first O.B.E. awarded to a motor cycle racer. Frith joined the Norton team in 1936 and won the Junior T.T. and finished third in the Senior race.

He retired at the end of 1949 having devastated opponents for all but the war years (1940-1946). Until Hailwood came along, **Stanley Woods'** record of ten T.T. wins remained unequalled. An Irishman from Dublin, he won his first in 1923 a year after his first ride in 1922 at the age of seventeen, when at such a tender age he finished fifth after his machine caught fire! His last win came in 1938. He rode in thirtyseven races, finished in twentyone made eleven fastest rode in thirtyseven races, finished in twentyone, made eleven fastest or record laps, won ten and was placed second three times and third once. He was never lower than sixth and on three occasions won two T.T. races in one week!

won two T.T. races in one week!

Howard Davies achieved his fame not only for his H.R.D.—the forerunner to the famous Vincent marque—but for his 1921 T.T. Victory
on a 350 A.J.S. when he won the senior race! He started his course
to stardom with a second place in the T.T. of 1914 on a Sunbeam.
He again won the T.T. in 1925 on his own H.R.D. and retired from
racing in 1927 to concentrate on manufacturing. Tyrrell Smith
achieved most of his fame with the Rudge Multi between 1928 and
1935 and then with the Excelsiors up to 1939. His only T.T. win was
in 1930 but he can claim three second places and four thirds.

Eric Oliver has never won a sidecar T.T. but he has been world
champion four times which does excuse him. His last world championship win in 1953 marked the last British victory and since then
every winner has ridden a German machine, and every winner has
been German except for Switzerlands Fritz Scheidegger who won
the championship in 1965 and 1966. Bill Lomas rode Velocettes,

A.J.S., M. V. Agusta and Moto Guzzi in a long stream of successes giving Moto Guzzi the world 350 championship in 1955 and 1956 the year before Keith Campbell produced the first Gilera 350 championship. Bill won the 250 T.T. of 1955 on an M V and also won the 350 race on the Guzzi beating Bob McIntyre on a Norton and Cecil Sandford on another Moto Guzzi. Cecil himself won the 1952 Ultra Lightweight world championship on an M. V., and five years later the 1957 250 championship on a Mondial partnering Tarquinio Provini. That year Mordial won their only two constructors world championship and both riders won a T.T., Cecil the 250 and Provini the 125.

Provini the 125. This then is but a small glimpse of past glories. When you see these ex riders in the paddock or on the circuit reflect a little before you smile at their age! Of course there are those amongst us today who do remember both riders and machines and to them I apologise if my descriptions are either too short or inadequate. Certainly you have the great advantage, and indeed honour, to have been part of an age that bred champions who in turn made history. Only a short walk across the paddock bridge (and a small fee) separate you from again being part of it.

Let us then salute the stars, and express a warm debt of gratitude to the Vintage Motor Cycle Club, for allowing youngsters like me the privilege of watching; and more important still, for filling the gaps in

an unworthy education.


