Mallory Park

Motor Cycle Championships 1959

- 1. The Competition will be known as the Mallory Park Motor Cycle Championships and will be open to motor cycles (two and three wheelers). The awards will be to the most successful riders in each of the following specified classes:—
 - Class 1. Solo machines up to 250 c.c.
 - Class 2. Solo machines from 251-350 c.c.
 - Class 3. Solo machines from 351-500 c.c.
 - Class 4. Motor Cycle and Sidecars up to 1,000 c.c.
 - 2. Events qualifying for these championships will be held as follows:—

Sunday, March 22nd Sunday, April 19th

Sunday, May 3rd

Sunday, June 7th

Sunday, July 12th

Sunday, September 27th

3. All events qualifying for the solo championships will be scratch races of not less than 15 laps.

All events qualifying for the sidecar championships will be scratch races of not less than 10 laps.

- 4. A race will not be counted as a championship race unless there are at least 6 starters, and a championship will not be awarded in any class unless at least 4 championship races in that class have been held during the year.
- 5. All machines must comply with the international sporting code and supplementary regulations of the Auto Cycle Union.
- 6. All competitors must comply with the international sporting code and supplementary regulations of the Auto Cycle Union, and in all matters arising from the running of the races qualifying for the championship, competitors shall be subject to the regulations issued by the body promoting the meeting.
- 7. Points will be awarded for each qualifying race as follows:—

N.B.—Fastest lap in each class—2 points

The four best performances from each class, by any competitor, from the aforementioned meetings will count for the championships.

Any ties will be decided as per appendix M (1958) paragraph 8 (this in the absence of any subsequent appendix for 1959) of the international sporting code for motor cycle racing.

8. Awards for qualifying races, excepting classes in which overall winners are entered, are as follows:—

Class 1—1st, £10; 2nd, £8; 3rd, £6; 4th, £5; 5th, £4; 6th, £3; 7th, £2; 8th, £1. Class 2—1st, £15; 2nd, £12; 3rd, £10; 4th, £8; 5th, £6; 6th, £4; 7th, £2;

Class 3—1st, £25; 2nd, £20; 3rd, £15; 4th, £10; 5th, £6; 6th, £4; 7th, £2; 8th, £1.

Class 4—1st, £25; 2nd, £20; 3rd, £15; 4th, £10; 5th, £5; 6th, £2-10-0.

Class 4—Winning Passenger £2-10-0 (First place only).

9. The championships will be decided at the meeting on September 27th and the winners in each class will receive the following:—

Class 1—1st Prize: £60 and a Challenge Trophy and Replica.

2nd Prize: £40 and Replica. 3rd Prize: £20 and Replica. 4th Prize: £15 and Replica. 5th Prize: £10 and Replica. 6th Prize: £5 and Replica.

Class 2—1st Prize: £90 and Challenge Trophy and Replica.

2nd Prize: £60 and Replica. 3rd Prize: £40 and Replica. 4th Prize: £30 and Replica. 5th Prize: £20 and Replica. 6th Prize: £10 and Replica.

Class 3-1st Prize: £125 and Challenge Trophy and Replica.

2nd Prize: £85 and Replica. 3rd Prize: £50 and Replica. 4th Prize: £40 and Replica. 5th Prize: £30 and Replica. 6th Prize: £20 and Replica.

Class 4—1st Prize: £90 and Challenge Trophy and Replica.

2nd Prize: £60 and Replica.
3rd Prize: £40 and Replica.
4th Prize: £30 and Replica.
5th Prize: £20 and Replica.
6th Prize: £10 and Replica.

- 10. Only pump fuel will be allowed to be used as available to the general public.
- 11. In addition to the Championships, riders finishing in the first eight places in any of the six qualifying races for class 3 (solo 500 c.c.), will be accepted as entries (subject to completing the usual entry form), for the 'Race of the Year' at Mallory Park, on Sunday, September 27th, 1959.

To be eligible a rider must have started in at least two qualitying races on separate dates. The race will be over 40 laps, for the Mallory Challenge Trophy (present holder—John Surtees). Winners will receive the following cash awards:—

1st \$\ \frac{500}{250}\$ and a Challenge Trophy and Replica.
2nd \$\ \frac{1250}{250}\$ and Replica.
3rd \$\ \frac{1150}{150}\$ and Replica.
4th \$\ \frac{1100}{150}\$ and Replica.
5th \$\ \frac{175}{250}\$ and Replica.
6th \$\ \frac{150}{250}\$ and Replica.

The same rules to apply as for the Mallory Park Championship races. Riders requiring any further information or entry forms should write in the first instance direct to the Mallory Park Circuit, who will then forward names to the various organising clubs as applicable.

FLAG SIGNALS. National—Start. Red—Stop Immediately. Yellow held stationary—Danger, drive carefully. Yellow waved up and down—Extreme Caution, Great Danger Ahead. Chequered Flag—Finish of Race. Black Flag and Number—Exclusion of that driver. Yellow and Red Stripes—Oil on Course.

After receiving the Chequered Flag, each driver shall proceed round the course back to the Paddock. There shall be no travelling in the reverse direction of the course at any time. PENALTY—EXCLUSION.

STARTING. Massed pushed starts from dead engine (no kick starts allowed). In case of a driver suffering from a disability, one pusher may be employed starting from the rear of the grid, three seconds after the first fall of the flag. Competitors will be lined up in 3 or 4 rows or as many as may be necessary. Positions in heats will be by ballot before leaving the paddock. Positions on the grid in Finals will be determined by heat times with the fastest men on the front row. No unauthorised assistance may be given to a driver at the Start or during the race.

FINISHING. A race will be deemed finished two minutes after the first man has crossed the finishing line. No fresh laps may be started after the winner has crossed the finishing line.




