

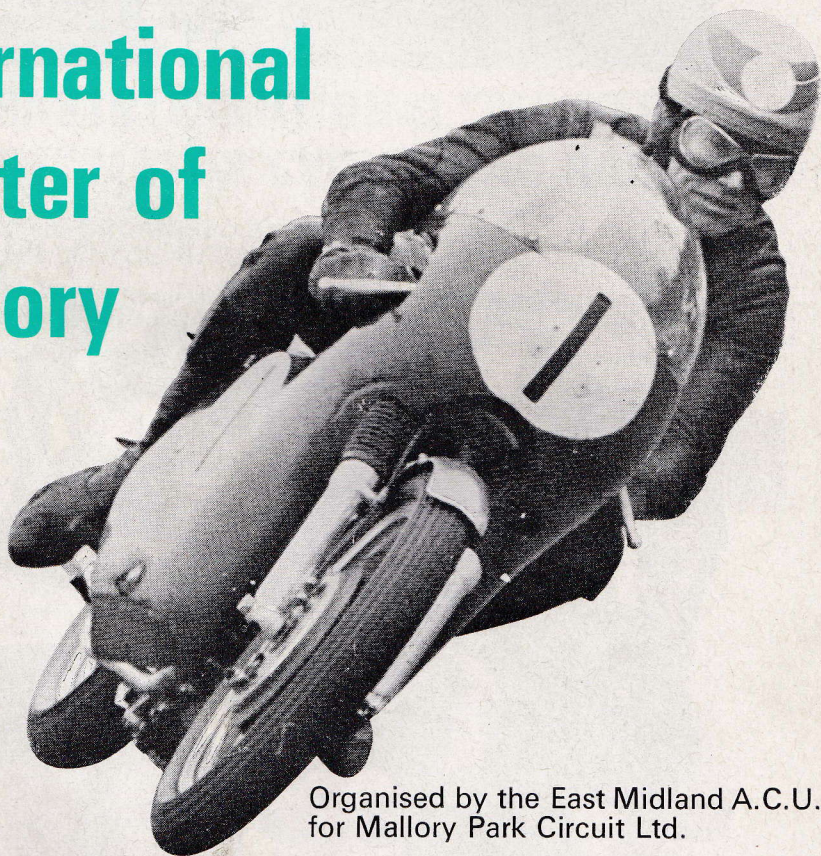

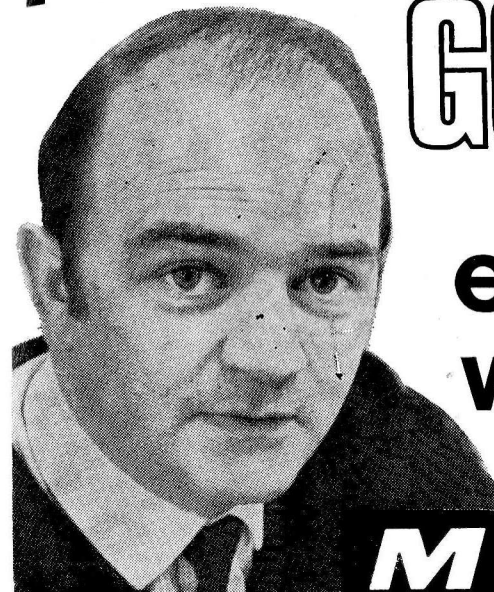

WHO WILL BE "MASTER OF MALLORY" TODAY?

Although, as a sidecar rider, he will have no part in the "Master of Mallory" competition, world champion Helmut Fath must take pride of place today in a grand line-up of competitors for this Carreras sponsored meeting.

It is the first engagement of a busy Easter weekend for Fath, the champion who broke a B.M.W. stranglehold on the title series with his own home-built four-cylinder Urs (named after his home village of Ursenbach, near Heidelberg in Germany). Tomorrow, Fath will be racing at Oulton Park in Cheshire, and he is then due to put in an appearance at the Brighton Motorcycle Show, where one of his Urs-4 engines is on display.

Other sidecar drivers come from Sweden, Switzerland and South Africa to compete against a British line-up which includes all the aces: among them B.M.W. men Pip Harris from Wolverhampton and Tony Wakefield from Spaldwick; B.S.A. exponents Peter Brown (the British national champion), Chris Vincent, Mick Boddice and Fred, Norman and Roy Hanks, all from Birmingham.

But it would be wrong to think that the meeting will be dominated by the sidecars. There are at least a dozen riders from abroad in the solo classes. They include Rhodesian Gordon Keith, Malcolm Stanton from Australia, the American Lance Weil, Pierre Tebec from France and a big Swedish contingent which includes well-known Kent Andersson and Bo Granath.

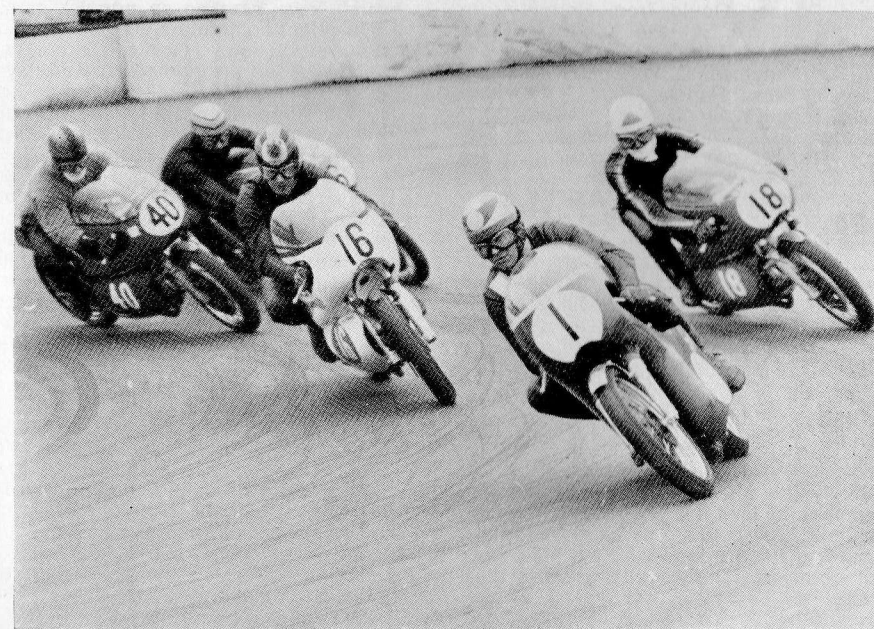
Home riders include Dave Croxford from Ruislip, Middx., national 500 c.c. champion and holder of the "Master of Mallory" title, 350 c.c. national champion Alan Barnett from Iwer, Bucks., and 125 c.c. national champion Jim Curry from Broadway, Worcs.

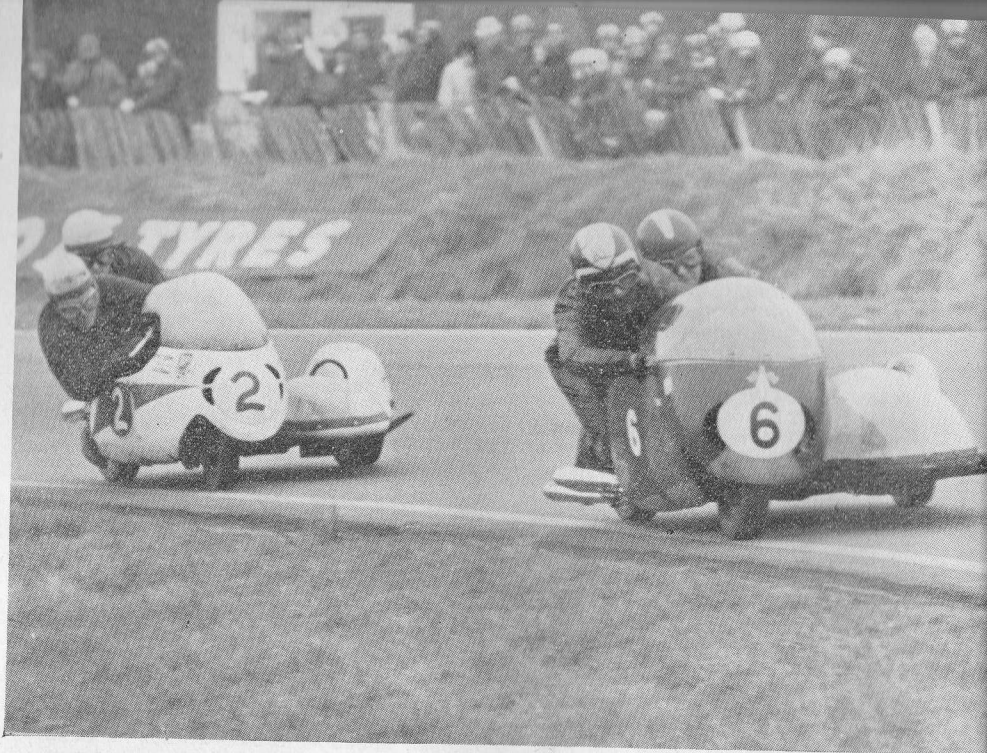
With a top engine capacity limit of 750 c.c., the Senior event should provide one of the epic races of the year. Watch to see if the Midlands factory men, Tony Smith on a 654 c.c. B.S.A. and Percy Tait on a 490 c.c. Triumph — both hotbed versions of ordinary sports road machines—can repeat their 1-2 finish ahead of Croxford and the other riders of "real racers" that they contrived at the March 16 meeting here.

Croxford, Ron Chandler from Sevenoaks and Rodney Gould from Banbury are all on 500 c.c. Seeleys. Londoner Peter Williams and Dan Shorey from Banbury are on Matchlesses. Welshman Malcolm Uphill, Barry Randle from Stourbridge and Lance Weil all have "faithful old" Nortons. Also pinning their faith on 500 c.c. engines are Barnett, with the Kirby Metisse; Rex Butcher from Tcnbridge, Kent, with the Oakley Quaife; Granath who has a single-cylinder two-stroke Husqvarna; and Switzerland's internationally famous Gyula Marsovszky, who has forsaken his Matchless for one of the new Italian twin-cylinder Linto machines.

Taking full advantage of the 750 c.c. capacity limit are Paul Dunstall's ace rider Ray Pickrell from Harrow, Canadian Bert Clark, Londoner Mick Andrews and Kent stars Pat Mahoney and Paul Smart.

Nearly all these riders will also be competing in the 350 c.c. event, which should have Barnett and Croxford duelling for the lead with a whole pack of evenly matched challengers on their tails.

Mounted on the Japanese Yamahas which have become so popular among Lightweight contenders, Kent Andersson, Marsovszky and Gordon Keith are going to keep the home experts busy in the 250 c.c. class. Derek Chatterton from Boston, John Ringwood from Buckhurst Hill, Essex, Charles Mortimer from Guildford, Gould and Mahoney—all on Yamahas — Paul Smart (Ducati) and Uphill (Suzuki) can be counted among those who should be well to the fore. Smallest class of the day, in engine size and entries, is the 125 c.c. Top of the list here is Stuart Graham with his ex-works Suzuki. Granath and Ringwood on East German MZs, Andersson and fellow-Swede Borje Janssen on West German Maicos; Gordon Keith, Dave Browning from Cheltenham and Derek Chatterton, fast twin two-strokes developed by the Italian Villa brothers; Martin Garney from Wallington on the Shepherd Special; Londoner Barry Sheene on a Spanish Bultaco; and Jim Curry on his Japanese Honda ail help to make this an extremely open race. Prize money of £1,500 is to be won, including £200 for the winner of the "Master of Mallory" title.

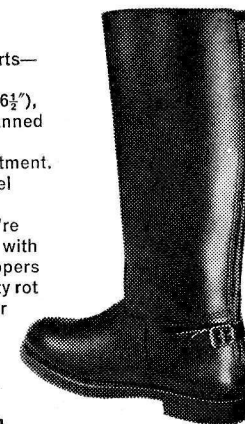

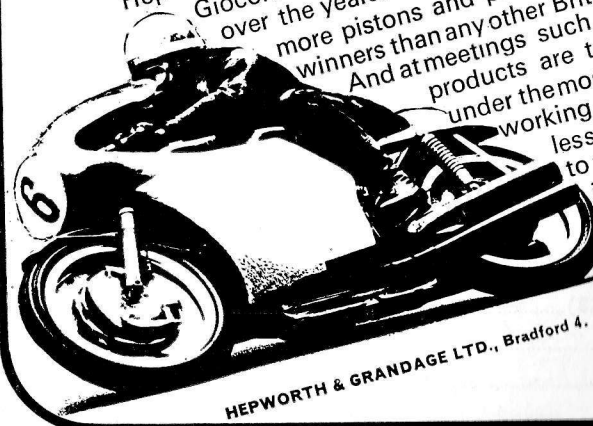
