

Bill Boddice writes . . .

An introduction to the tenth annual Mallory Park BP Vintage Motor Cycle "Race of the Year" meeting on Sunday, May 7th 1978.

(Note: In the fifties and sixties, Bill Boddice, latterly an East Midland Centre ACU official, was a leading sidecar driver and regularly raced at mainland short circuits. He was second in the 1955 Isle of Man Sidecar T.T., won the 1959 Mallory championship, held the Watsonian Trophy six times and gained ACU Gold Stars in the 1960-62 British championships. He is now chairman of a Wolverhampton garage business).

Mallory Park — what memories the name conjures up. I can't remember when I first saw it, but at that time it was still a pony racing track, just a plain oval with white posts. I first raced here on a 596 cc dope Norton sponsored by the late lamented Ernie Earles of front fork fame. I had a lot of wins with the Norton on that grass track, but my memory files the time when, after I had had a run of victories, Jack Surtees, John's father, put his 1,000 cc Vincent on dope. That gave the Norton something to think about and from then on we shared the honours.

Having won many races here, I was most disappointed to find on starting in a British grass track championship against Cyril Smith that my Norton would not produce full noise for several laps. When it did chime in, I thought I could still catch Cyril. This I did on the last bend with plenty of steam to pass, but he was too wily to fall for that and in a flash "closed the door," an attempt round the outside being thwarted in the same way. At the finishing line, there was less than half a wheel in it but it could have been a mile for all the difference it made to the result.

When roadracing at Mallory was mooted, Jack Shaw (Shaw's Corner) asked me over to see what they were up to. To this day, I have a movie of Jack in his famous "plus fours" surveying the hard core laid for the present course.

Memories keep flooding back . . . of holding the lap record for brief spells . . . and having a do-ordie race with Florian Camathias for the Mallory championship. On the last lap, the return pipe burned through, smothering everything with hot castor (Shell!) oil. I should have retired but a lot was at stake a large cup, £90 and the championship title. I figured that while my engine still smoked there was enough oil in it and kept going. I finished in first position winning, or so I thought, the championship.
 But Camathias got the cup, the cheque and the ride in the winner's car. All I had was the oil bath until a week later when a recount made us top.

... seeing competitors come into view from Devil's Elbow, rightly named, without their machines ... my Norton breaking a con rod and shaking off my passenger John Tanner ... John Cooper beating Agostini and so reducing the legend — "I was as fast as him, but he came out of the corners better!" .. Mike Hailwood demonstrating a Formula 5000 car and lapping at 113 mph ... watching my son Michael coming towards me sideways from Devil's Elbow and capsizing at my feet. I also remember a long-suffering cameraman laying out a thug who had been spitting at him all afternoon ... taking John Cooper on the pillion of a Steve Lancefield Norton on a lap of honour ... the out-of-this-world speed of marshals and first-aid men, with only fifty seconds or less to clear the track ... threading my way past a gyrating Fred Wallis when the heavens opened, then finding a complete stretcher aquaplaning round Gerards ... racing side-by-side with Helmut Fath on the URS, his passenger holding *my* sidecar's handles ... returning as an official to inspect the track and having to cancel a meeting because of mud a foot deep in the paddock . . . it would take a book to record it all. Happy days. all. Happy days

PEOPLE and MACHINES

Please give a warm welcome to our chief Guest George Rowley, AJS's supreme allrounder in the pre-war years. In the Famous Names Parade, he wears riding jacket number 41 and rides — what else? — and AJS.

Bill Boddice unfortunately had a prior engagement today but he sends this message to his many

friends at Mallory: "I hope you all have a grand day."

Spectators, please note: in the Famous Names Parade, riders can be identified by *Riding Jacket Numbers* (these may not, in all cases, tally with machine numbers).

Many of the Famous Names here today have travelled considerable distances to be with us, Stanley

Woods, riding jacket Number One, having flown in from his home in Downpatrick, Northern Ireland.

Largest capacity machine in the Famous Names Parade is the 1,000 cc 1950 Black Lightning of Ted Davis, at one time Chief Development Engineer at Vincents.

A great rarity is John Kidson's works 250 NSU twin, the fabulous 1953 Rennmax, No. 16 in the

Famous Names Parade. This machine Reg Armstrong and Geoff Duke "winkled out" of the factory in 1957/58. Details: four speeds, Reynolds special frame, gear primary drive, Hirth type crankshaft, Reynolds leading link front forks. Max. revs 10.800. The original wheels are used.

A word of thanks here to the three people whose vision, initiative and hard work behind the scenes also helped to make the other nine annual Vintage Mallory meetings successful — Titch Allen and Jack and Margaret Walton. Jack and Margaret are again organising today.

Potted history on the racing Scott outfit which roadracer/sprinter Ossie Neal rides in the Famous Names Parade: Harry Langman's 1923 works TT machine, which that year set a Mountain course lap record at 54.60 mph. Owned by Ossie since August, 1923. Mileage approximately 120,000 on the same engine (no rebore!). Ossie wears jacket No. 77.

Riding jacket number 33 is worn by roadracing's Iron Man of the 1930's, "Ginger" Wood. Do you know his real name? (Answers at foot of page 6).

The 1927 Rex Acmer acer of Brian Woolley, well-known as a two-stroke tuner, is believed to be Wal Handley's Lightweight TT winner. A recent "top-end" conversion has increased cubic capacity from 250 to 350. Brian wears jacket number 91.

A surprise for Owen Greenwood, who has come out of retirement to race a 1950 650 cc Triumph in


