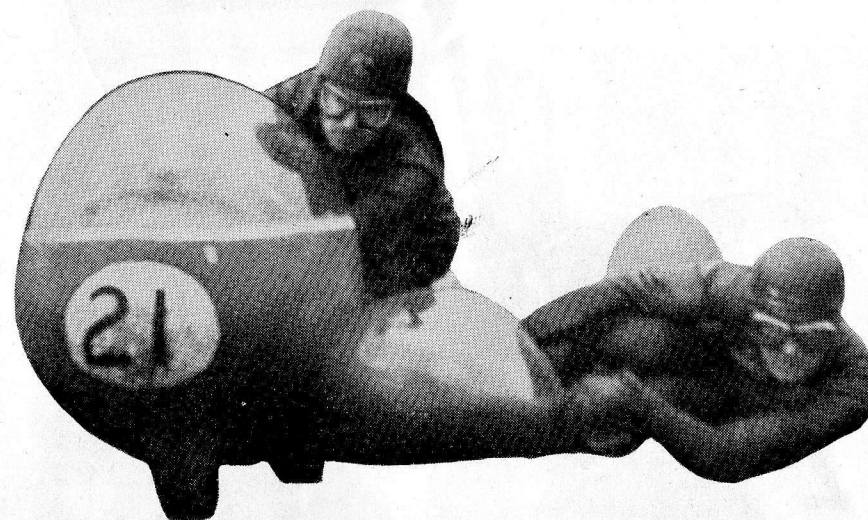

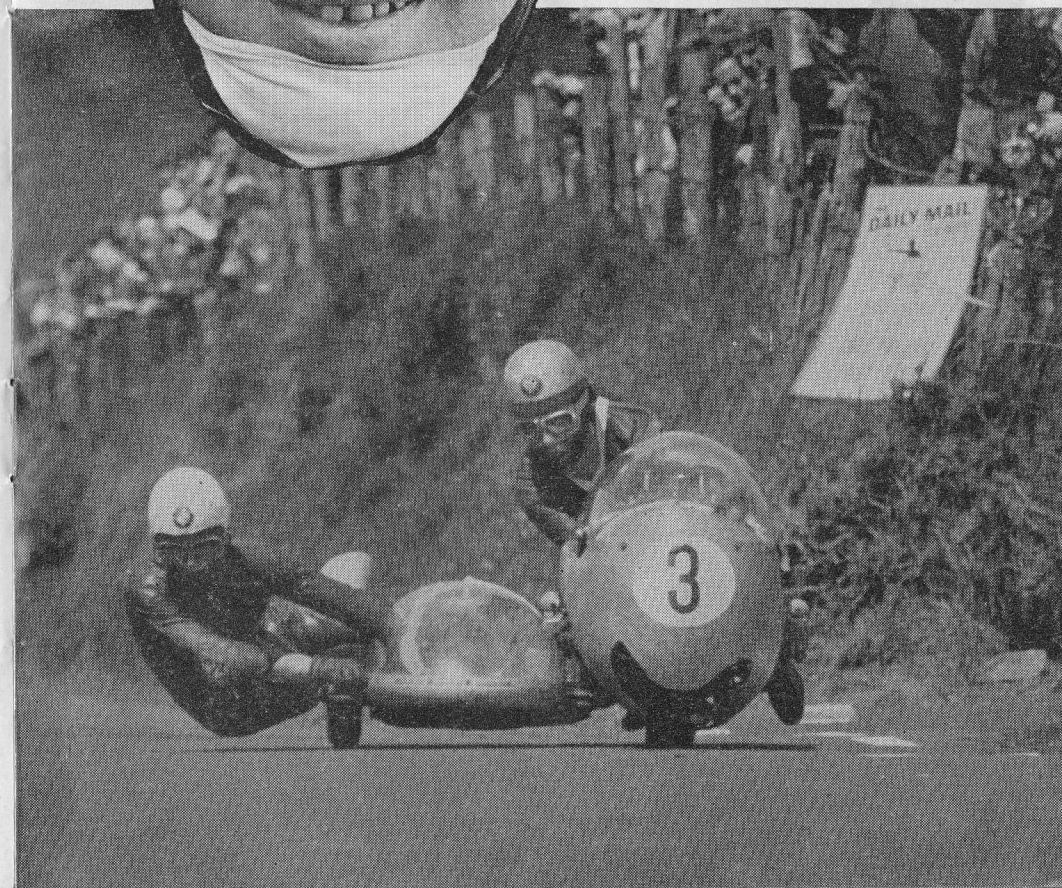

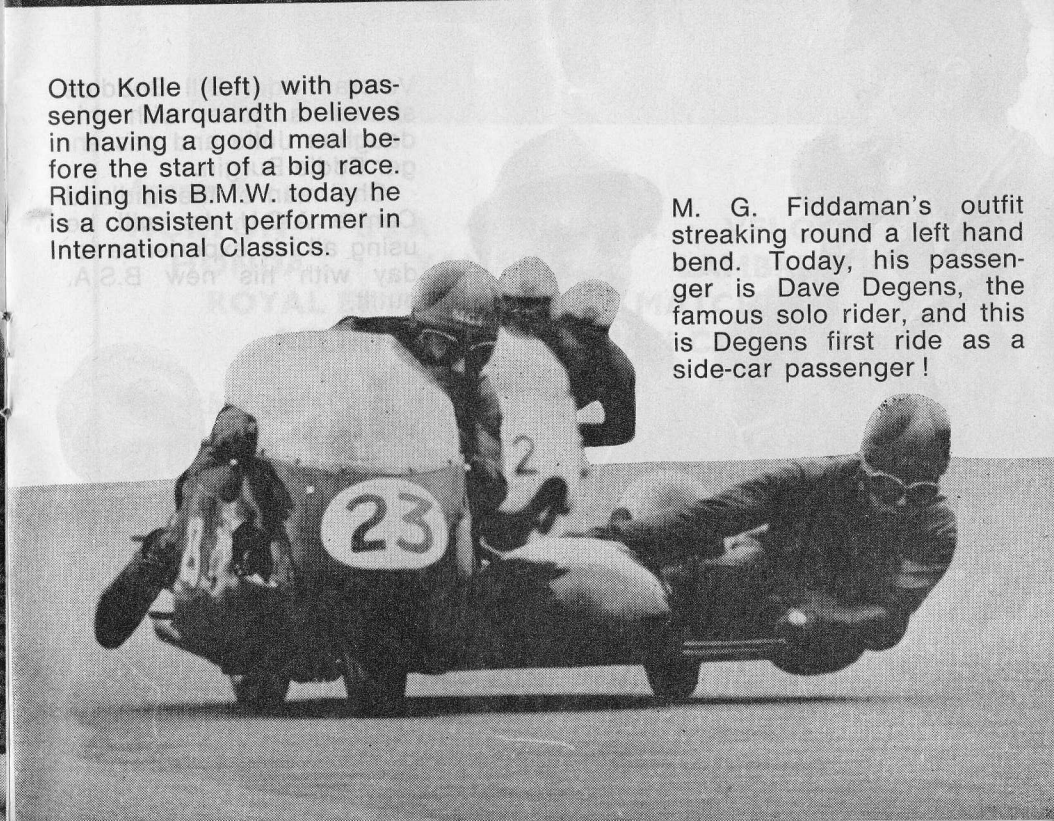
Pip Harris (left) winner of the Sidecar Race of the year in 1964, discusses a technical point with passenger R. Campbell.

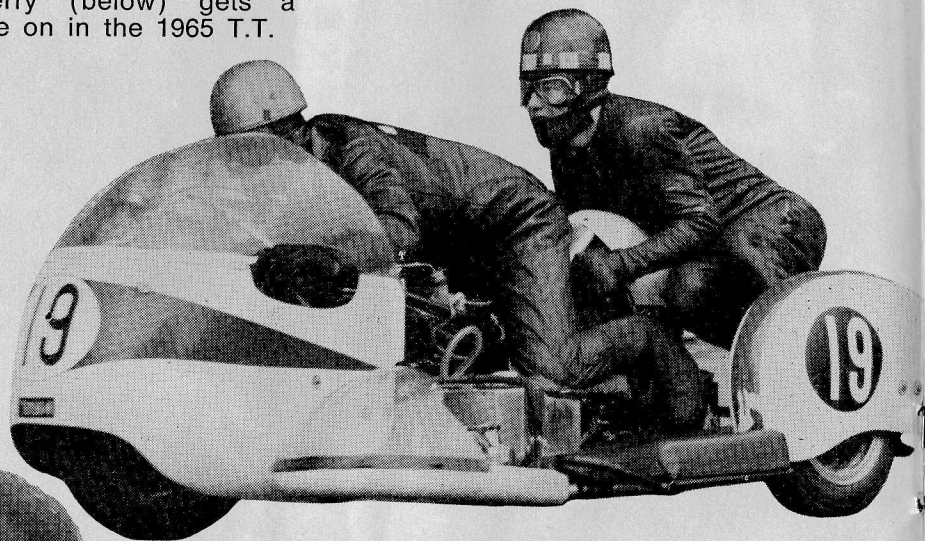

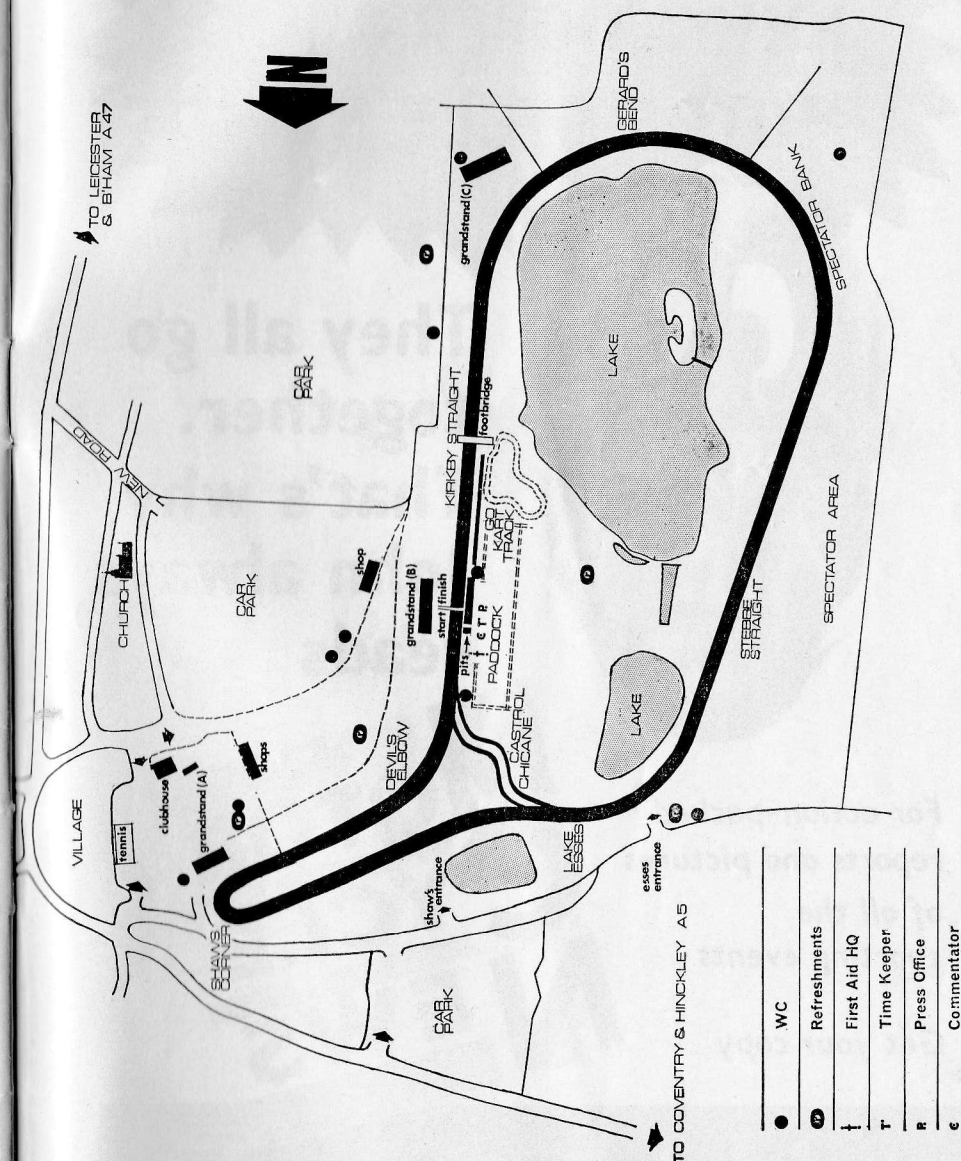
